The Hospital passed under the control of the A.D.M.S., Palestine L. of C., and G.O.C. Canal Zone on 1-7-18.

The general position of the Hospital remains unchanged except that its work is becoming more exclusively Venereal than ever. The figures for this section are as under:-

The total number of beds occupied by Venereal Patients on 31-7-17 was 296

On 8-7-18 the pressure for room was such that arrangements had to be made with the 26th Stationary Hospital, Ismailia to receive all local Australian and New Zealand sick with the exception of cases for isolation. This arrangement has continued for practically the whole of the month.

On 2-7-18 an additional Mess Hut, H.P.Marquee and E.P.Tent had to be erected in "V" Block, another E.P.Tent and H.P.Marquee were transferred to that Block on 12-7-18 and two more Marquees had to be transferred there on the 27-7-18.

Captain C.S.Molesworth joined the Unit on 11-7-18 and has been given duty in the Venereal Block. The work in this Block is of an arduous nature, and the three officers employed there have their time very fully occupied.

As the result of a visit from General Lloyd, G.O.C. Canal Zone a small recreation hut is in course of erection in "V" Block. This will relieve the men to some extent of confinement under tents during the present hot weather, but more extensive recreation accommodation is desirable. A small mess hut has been erected by the Australian Red Cross Society capable of accommodating a Billiard Table which will also be of some value.

Arrangements have been made by the Australian Red Cross for outings of small parties of 6 patients from the General Hospital two or three times a week. Tea is provided for them free of cost by the New Zealand Soldiers' Club, Ismailia.

On 2-7-18 General Lloyd, G.O.C. Canal Zone visited the Hospital, and on 4-7-18 he made a formal inspection. On 4-7-18 the Hospital was visited by Col. Downes, D.D.M.S., A.I.F. in Egypt. On 11-7-18 The Sanitary Officer, Canal Zone visited the Hospital, and on 15-7-18 Col. Boyd, R.A.M.C., Consulting Physician, P. L. of C. visited the Hospital.

On 5-7-18 6 patients, and on 19-7-18 4 patients were transferred from Montazah to await embarkation for Australia.

Owing to the Bairam Festival the Laundry was not in use from 10-7-18 to 13-7-18 and <sup>less</sup> clean linen and clothing was available than should have been.

On the night of 22/23rd July, the Orderly Room safe was stolen although a member of the staff was asleep within a few feet of it. It was discovered about 1000 yards from the Hospital through the able tracking of Major A.E. Clarke, Q.M. The A.P.M. was present at its discovery; the thieves have not been found.

On 21-7-18 notification was received from the Staff Paymaster that as from 1-1-18 Hospital Forfeitures for Venereal Disease were to be one third of a man's actual pay.

From 8-7-18 to 20-7-18 14 men from an N.C.O's School at Anzac Training Centre were attached for instruction. They were given practical instruction in the Wards, the Operating Room, and the Irrigation Tent. ~~xx~~ A syllabus of Lectures was given as under:-

On 27-7-18 6 men were attached for instruction in Venereal Prophylaxis.

In accordance with instructions from D.D.M.S., A.I.F. in Egypt statistics are being collected which should show the value of the prophylactic measures being taken against Venereal Disease in the Field.

The strength of the Unit is at present 108 "A" class A.A.M.C. men, 3 "B" men, and 10 "B" class men attached from other services. There has been a considerable amount of sickness in the Unit during the past month from Malaria. This is mainly recrudescence of Fever in men who were infected in October last year when the 10th Division recently arrived from Salonica was camped alongside. This is probably associated with the debilitating effect of the continued high temperatures we have been subject to during the month, 100.3 being the average temperature at 2 p.m. in the tents.

I was absent from the 15th to the 30th of the month on leave and Major W.G. Forde was in Command of the Hospital.

Major E.C. Temple Smith, Ophthalmic Surgeon was transferred to 14th Aust. General Hospital on 24-7-18. The loss to the efficiency of the Hospital is considerable; but recently work in the Eye Department has become much less. Captain A.M. Aspinall has resumed duty as Eye, Ear, Throat and Nose Surgeon.

Major Griffiths has again had to devote a considerable portion of his time to clinical work in the ~~wards~~ wards.

Owing to our constantly high numbers and many of the patients being compelled to sleep on the ground application was made on 26-7-18 for the issue of 100 additional beds, as it is plain that the Hospital cannot deal satisfactorily with the local Australian and New Zealand sick, and the Venereal Disease of the Australian and New Zealand Forces without such extension.

The Australian Red Cross Kitchen under Miss F. Park Taylor continues to do good work.

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MEDICAL WARDS.

The work in the Wards this month has been of a satisfactory nature. The orderlies worked with enthusiasm. The majority of the Malaria cases admitted were Relapses. A case of Malignant Malaria transferred from "V" Block died on 2nd day of admission to the Ward. Col. Boyd, R.A.M.C., Consulting Physician, Palestine L.of C. saw the patient on the morning of the 2nd day, and did not advise Intravenous injection then. An interesting case of spleno medullary decihæmia was admitted during the month. A case of Pyelitis following on V.D.G. and in a very low condition for over four months had so far recovered as to be able to proceed home on the "Karoo" without anxiety. The nursing still in this case was worthy of commendation.

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PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

The Commanding Officer and I visited Major A.R. Ferguson, Consulting Bacteriologist for the Force in Egypt, and O.C., Central Bacteriological Laboratory at his Headquarters at Kantara. He very kindly advised in reference to the special investigation of the apparently non-gonorrhoeal cases of venereal urethritis. These cases are being classified and recorded separately. Several have been found to have harboured gonococci at an earlier stage; one appears to be a venereal infection by bacillus coli communis. This will be a matter for prolonged work before anything can be reported.

A post mortem examination was made of a patient dead of subtertian malaria despite intramuscular injections of quinine. The morbid findings were slight. Some 20 or 25 c.c. of clear cerebrospinal fluid was withdrawn on lumbar puncture; there was slight congestion of the brain and great swelling of the spleen; plasmodia falcifera were found in the splenic, cerebral and hepatic pulp and blood; a fuller report has been forwarded to the A.D.M.S., Palestine L.of C.

No tubercle bacilli were found in sputa and urines specially examined, about 30 specimens in all.

In the urine of a patient recently recovered from syphilis (diagnosis confirmed by finding treponemata pallida in the serum from his chancre) both terminal and lateral spined bilharzial ova were present in the same microscopic field.

Another case of special interest from the point of view of the ~~clinical~~ clinical pathologist is that of a recent reinforcement 4008, Tpr. Harrison, Gen. Ser. Reinf., suffering from lienomyelogenous leucocythaemia. In the fresh moist blood the leucocytes appeared almost as plentiful as the erythrocytes (the respective counts were 630,000 and 2,500,000 per c.mm.). Although his spleen was enormously tumid, filling  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the left side of his abdomen and extending across the middle line, and despite some poikilocytosis, numerous megaloblasts, a 50% oligocythaemia rubra and a very rich myelocythaemia his haemoglobin was about 80%, and his general health fair; he is said to have served for a fortnight as a troopship stoker early in July, 1918.

The number of finding of malarial parasites increased to 16 (8 in month of June).

There ~~xxx~~ still not enough mechanical work to employ two S/Sgts, and S/Sgt Clarke is quite capable of coping with it at present. However, with the large amount of clerical work now required to be attended to another orderly could be usefully employed. It is rather much to ask one orderly to act as clerk, surgical and mechanical orderly.

Special Cases.            No. 16677, Pte Vaughan, No. 2 A.S.H. Case presented an acute septic periostitis due to an infected tooth socket. The following treatment was carried out twice daily. Syringed with H<sub>2</sub>O<sub>2</sub>, small plug of cotton wool previously soaked in camphor 60 parts, phenol 30 parts and alcohol 10 parts inserted. A gauze drain was then packed in sinus. Case cleared up fairly rapidly, and a further fragment of root removed under general anaesthetic, 22-7-18. Patient discharged to D.M.C. Rest Camp 27-7-18.

No 7/1393, Tpr Morgan, N.Z.M.R. Disease, ~~xxx~~Chronic alveolar abscess, case unyielding medication. Resection of root was resorted to. Healed rapidly and porcelain now reinstated.

No. 3761, Tpr Davis. Stomatitis. Due to absolute neglect of oral hygiene. Patient very much debilitated, treatment carried out was as following;-- Patient instructed in the use of the tooth brush and supplied with two to be used alternately and kept in weak solution of Pot. permanganate. Calomel grs. 3 followed by Mag. Sulph oz. 1 next morning. Pot. Chlorate grs. 5 t.d.s. for three days. Mist Ferri or arsenicalis p.c. ½ oz. ~~xx~~ t.d.s. Patient discharged to D.M.C. Rest Camp 29-7-18.
