

There is very little necessary in the way of remarks as regards the work done during the month of June, apart from the fact that the Treatment Staff is continuing its best effort to get cases out with minimum of delay.

The Officer in charge of Treatment is now able to spend the whole of his time reviewing the work of those under him, and this should greatly assist in doing away with the possibility of cases being held through lack of experience on the part of their Medical Officers, longer than they should be.

It will be noticed that only 4 cases of Gonorrhoea Relapses were admitted during the month, and only 17 failed to pass their try-out at C.T.D. This may be attributed to one or two causes, and partly to both.

The first is, - the higher standard of cure prior to Discharge, and second the Boarding of non-infectious gleets, which are frequently extremely obstinate, and in the past have had to come back more than once after discharge.

5. WARTERMASTER'S DEPARTMENT. Continuous checks and inspections have been carried by the Quartermaster and his Staff, but he has been somewhat handicapped through the loss of his Assistant Quartermaster, Lt. Black G. who went on N.M.E. on 19.6.19, and so far has not been replaced.

It is particularly necessary that until the numbers get down to at least 600, a Second quartermaster should be attached in order to keep a close and thorough supervision on all issues, supplies

and stores.

A Board of Enquiry was held on 16.6.19. on unservicable Clothing. A great delayis taking place owing to the inability of the A.I.F. Salvage Depot. at Chelsen failing to accept the articles boarded. and valuely open lost.

Shortage of Green Vegetables - have been very marked, and arrangements have been made that the F.O. 1/c Bulford, to issue Munically diesected vegetables to make up the quantities.

6. PHARMACEUTICAL DEPARTMENT. During this month Stock and Equipment checks have been made, and found to be satisfactory and A.F. I. 1214 has been forwarded to A.D.M.S.

A great amount of trouble is caused, leading to unneessary correspondence, and somewhat delaying Treatment, through the failure of the A.B.M.S. London to promptly supply all requisitions. It is obvious, that at this stage of Demobilisation every effort should be made to give prompt delivery to all approved Requisitions.

- 7. BATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT. This Department is still carrying out good work, but is inconvenienced through lack of apparatus owing to delays in Headquarters supplying same. The work of this pepartment will gradually decrease as the total number of patients treated, drop. A detailed Report is attached to this appendix.
- 8. GENERAL. As the Commanding Officer was absent on Leave most of the time, this Monthly Report is somewhat meagre. The work appears to have proceeded satisfactorily under the Acting C.O. (Lt.Col C.J. Wiley). The Treatment Staff is well up to schedule, and three experienced Officers are to be attached in the near future. Changes of course will take place during the coming month, owing to Educational Leave being granted, and Early Repatriation.

It is anticipated that Extension will be closed on or before 20.7.19., and that no case will be discharged to C.T.D. after that date, thus enabling that Depot to be closed by 31.7.19.

As the number of Patients decrease, and admissions lessen,

the personnel of the Staff is being reduced.
