

#### 5. REMARKS -

- (a). Report of Pathological Department attached.
- (b). Lewes Detention Barracks On 6th November, Captain F.Macky and 7 other ranks marched out to form the Medical personnel of the Lewes Detention Barracks. In future, all prisoners undergoing sentences of detention, and who are suffering from venereal disease, will be sent to these Detention Barracks, and not to this Hospital. This should reduce the number of patients in Hospital by about 40.

(c). Consequent on the Order re Patients uniforms, etc., mentioned in the report of October, vigorous search has been made for hidden uniforms with the following result - 59 Jackets, 82

breeches, 39 pairs puttees.

- (d). THE water supply of the Hospital is arranged in such a manner as to lead inevitably to much trouble during the winter. The whole system is an overhead one with subsidiary cisterns in each Ward placed under the rooves, and practically renders anti freezing measures impossible.
- (e). With the decrease in the number of patients in Hospital, it has been found possible to allott three Wards as Recreation Rooms for patients. This serves the double purpose of keeping patients out of the Wards for best part of the day, and also saves coal, as fires are not necessary until after 4.0 p.m., except in Medical Wards. One of these Recreation Rooms is being catered for by the Y.M.C.A., and the Red Cross has promised to see to the other two.
- (f). An additional number of beds have been made available for cases needing nursing attention, in order to provide for the possible prevalence of chest troubles during the Winter. There are now 66 beds available for serious cases and two Convalescent Wards of 40 beds each.
