

Sheet o2C G.8.d.2.5.	1/9/1918		<p>Few cases at intervals during night. At 9 a.m. the day's rush commenced. Owing to long distance to C.C.S. (i.e. VECQUEMONT) and congested traffic at portions of route, some difficulty in clearing of cases was experienced. The detailing of 5 M.A.C. cars to clear cases from 10th Field Ambulance A.D.S. CURLU left us shorter than ever, and at one stage for about an hour during the afternoon and despite 10 extra M.A.C. cars having reported for duty at our request, a large number of cases were waiting evacuation. About 5 p.m. all cases were clear with the exception of a number of German wounded prisoners. These were all clear by 7 p.m. In all 545 cases were admitted during the day, including 103 wounded Germans. The greater number of cases were from the 2nd & 5th Australian Divisions and had, through some misunderstanding been evacuated to us in error.</p> <p>Major SMYTH left on ENGLISH leave.</p> <p>16 bearers reported back from 10th Aust.
