RATIONS.

The supply for the past month from the A.S.C., has been good, portion of the Iron Rations have been used to make up a shortage when such existed. This is being done so as to expend such Iron Rations as have carried in the Unit from time to time.

CLOTHING.

The clothing issue has been kept to scale as laid down per 100 men and has been sufficient to meet demands.

Reference salvaged clothing. As it is necessary to withdraw an article rendered unserviceable before replacing with new or part worn, the latest Circular referring to this matter has been duly considered, but there must be at all times a salvage return for clothing as is laid down. This matter can be said to have had a reasonable trial.

MEDICAL COMFORTS.

Supplies are coming in from ABBEVILLE as required for Hospital use and affiliated Units.

FOOT POWDER.

This matter has been attended to and is being issued to Units of the 9th Brigade.

RED CROSS STORES.

A small quantity of these Stores have been obtained from the representative at No 3 A.G.H. ABBEVILLE and used for Hospital use,

REGIMENTAL FUNDS.

The expenditure for the month is 234francs, this amount was spent in buying potatoes and carrots.

SALVAGE.

The amount of salvage returned for the month is:-
Paper 50lbs, Cardboard 61 lbs, Cartons 16lbs. Solder 8lbs.
a quantity of clothing and equipment was also returned as unserviceable.

EAT.

There was no return for the month, the amount rendered down being made an issue to the personnel.

BOOTMAKER.

No repairs for the month as the staff bootmaker has been struck off strength.

TAILOR.

This department has been closed owing to the only tailor being repatriated.

KITCHENS.

The weekly inspections of all kitchens has been carried out and everything has been found to be satisfactory. The cook's reports are favorable and no complaints of an official nature have been made,

MOB EQUIPMENT

The month has been given over to the checking of Stores prior to their return to D.A.D.O.S.

MONTHLY RETURN

Medical equipment on charge to Units of the 9th Brigade have been checked together with Unit equipment and necessary pro-forma forwarded to A.D.M.S., 3rd Aust Division.

Wagons- One G.S. Wagon was sent daily to Refilling Point for Rations. One G.S. Limber went daily at 9 a.m. for mail. Water Carts let at 9 a.m. daily for drawing of water from neighbouring village for cooking and Hospital purposes. One Horse Drawn Ambulance was despatched each morning to 33rd and 35th Battalions for evacuation of sick to Hospital.

Harness- Cleaned daily and kept well oiled and all in good serviceable condition. A good amount of it has been and being repaired. All surplus harness has been oiled and cleaned and ready packed to be forwarded to A.H.T.D. at any notice.


Horse Feed- Has been of good quality.

9th AUSTRALIAN FIELD AMBULANCEUNIT LIBRARYREPORT FOR MONTH ENDING 31-1-1919

The suggestion of the formation of a Unit Library was put forward early in the month at a meeting of the Educational Committee.

Literature of any sort has always been difficult to obtain, and one previous experiment in the direction of a Circulating Library had been fairly successful.

The first endeavour to obtain books was by application to the Y.M.C.A. Book Shop at ABBEVILLE. Their library was, however, fully exploited by the troops etc. in and around ABBEVILLE, and they were unable to lend us any from their store.

An attempt was then made at the collection of whatever books were then circulating amongst the members of the Unit and, at the same time, a member of the Educational Committee placed the matter before the Y.M.C.A. Library at HAVRE. Shortly afterwards we received from the Y.M.C.A. at HAVRE a donation of 29 books and pamphlets towards the formation of the library.

These, and the volumes collected within the Unit were sufficient to commence the library. It is open from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. daily and provides a welcome addition, both for recreation and reference, to the Unit's resources.

It is intended to further increase the size of the library by application to the 3rd Aust. Divisional Y.M.C.A. for the periodical loan of volumes of Fiction.

EDUCATIONAL REPORT FOR JANUARY, 1919

With the beginning of the year Education within the Unit under the A.I.F. Education Scheme was in full operation. Classes were in existence in English, French, Mathematics, Bookkeeping and Shorthand, with an average attendance of 25% of the members of the Unit at classes in general. Many of the requirements of students in technical subjects could not be supplied within the Unit, but have been supplied to some extent by Schools within Corps and Division. During the month 17 members of the Unit were in attendance at such schools.

Within the Unit, during the month additional classes were added in English Literature, Building Construction, and Advanced French, to meet the requirements of some students.

A Debating Club was put in operation and has been well attended at all meetings. The speakers have benefited a great deal in self confidence since the early meetings, and some very lively debates have taken place, there being no lack of supporters on the contesting sides.

The need of Text Books for classes, at first harassing to the scheme, has now been well supplied by the A.I.F. Central Library. In addition requisitions have been forwarded through the Education Officer for a supply of Books of Reference to form a Unit Educational Library.

Progress of students has been well maintained during the month, the Bookkeeping class being especially regularly attended and progressive. At the close of the month there were 21% of the members of Unit attending classes.
