The notable features of the month have been the bad weather and an epidemic of influenza. Winds have been frequent and strong, bringing with them much dust and sand. This has seriously interfered with the work and materially affected the welfare of a number of Pneumonia cases which arose in the Hospital itself. Pneumonia has occurred in a complication of influenza, and probably the ~~incidence~~ incidence of Pneumonia was increased by the weather. The Influenza was first introduced from the New Zealand Camp, and its incidence was mainly confined to the Venereal Section, where about 50 cases occurred, of those 12 developed Pneumonia and 7 died. The epidemic was at its worst about the 14th of the month and very suddenly subsided. Patients were isolated in a separate nursing ward as ~~these~~ cases occurred. No attempt was made to segregate contacts.

PERSONNEL. OFFICERS. Captain J.F. Chambers, who reported for duty on 2-2-19, has had his time fully occupied in compiling figures bearing on the History of the Unit, and on Repatriation and Demobilisation Papers.

OTHER RANKS. These now consist of 86 "A" Class A.A.M.C. men, 4 "B" class A.A.M.C., 32 A.A.M.C. attached, and 23 attached from other Units. Work was heavy in the Medical wards owing to the incidence of Pneumonia.

GENERAL. On the 18th inst. ~~intimation~~ intimation was received that no further patients would be admitted, arrangements having been made for the New Zealand, and Australian local sick to go to the 26th Stationary Hospital, Ismailia, and for other Australian patients, including Venereal patients, to go to the 14th A.G.H., Cairo. A few odd cases have, however, continued to be admitted during the month. I informed the Administrative Commandant of the pending closure of the Hospital and had the proposed erection of the ward and Operating Room cancelled. This improvement had been pending since 11-12-18 and was urgently required in view of the anticipated duststorms. The proposed open-air stage, which I had been endeavouring to procure since early in October had not got beyond the offer made and accepted at the end of December.

On the 26th February, owing to the continued inclemency of the weather, I arranged with Dr. Cambouliu, of the Suez Canal Company's Hospital, Ismailia, to receive chest cases. This he agreed to do without charge. Two only were sent. One of these, a member of the staff, No. 18934, Pte H.W. Willis, who had been awaiting embarkation for some time, died three days later. The 26th Stationary Hospital, having removed from its building to a desert site, was no ~~longer~~ more suitable for the care of Pneumonia cases than this Hospital.

Seven patients (Hammock Cases) were embarked for Australia on 19-2-19 and there are still about 100 awaiting embarkation.

During the month enquiries have been instituted as to the ultimate result of the treatment of the Venereal Cases amongst the Australian and New Zealand troops in Egypt. Very many have returned to Australia, and there are other numerous difficulties in the way of tracing these men, but it is hoped that some estimate may be arrived at of late results in Venereal disease in Egypt.

## MEDICAL SECTION.

INFLUENZA. The number of admissions under this head increased. Some of the patients developed very severe bronchopneumonia and there were several deaths. The mortality was high, an important contributing cause of this was the exceptional bad wind and dust which is now so frequent.

MALARIA. There was a diminution in the number of cases admitted, and those under my care were mild, as a rule. It was not found necessary to give either intravenous or intramuscular quinine. All these patients had had previous attacks.

MEASLES. Cases continued to be admitted. All very mild, and the great majority, if not all, were Rubella.

SCARLATINA. One doubtful case - an officer is undergoing treatment.

The orderlies carried out their duties well. I wish to particularly mention Pte. Oxley.

#### EDUCATIONAL SCHOOLS.

##### "V" BLOCK. NO. 2 Aust. Stat. Hospital.

an I formed a class on 22-1-19 and on going to the mess hut found that extra electric light globe had been installed and a small black board placed there for my use. About 100 men were in attendance and though at first reluctant in answering questions regarding the subject being dealt with they soon proved that they were keenly alive to the advantages to be gained. The attendance was purely voluntary no check of any description being used. But the men always listen most attentively and the idea of discipline never enters my mind. Though the lessons are necessarily of lecture of lecture form the exercise in mathematics are demonstrated on the board and that means of communication and illustrations is extensively used throughout. The subjects embrace, Arithmetic, Algebra, Mensuration, History, (Australian and English), Geography, English Grammer and Agriculture. The range already covered is as follows:- Arithmetic from the beginning showing powers and relationships of numbers, our Notation compared with Arabic, and the rules as far as compound interest; Algebra: the four simple rules; Mensuration: the measurements of surfaces, finding width of unfordable streams and ~~high~~ heights of masts by means of the shadow; History: (Aust.) Early discoverers and explorers, the first fleet, the Tom Thumb, Discovery of Coal, Munity of Bounty and of Convicts at Castle Hill and the deposition of Gov. Bligh; (English). The Celts and the Roman period and the Norman Conquest; Geography: Africa, Australia, and Physical covering the high land masses and movements of the sea; Grammer: The peculiarities of our vowels and the parts of speech and of a sentence. The Agriculture by Sgt. Gardiner (Diploma, Waggo Agric. College) has just begun, one lecture only having been given. In this work I am assisted by my staff each member of which has taken my place at least once when other work has prevented my going to the Hospital. The lessons are given during four evenings in the week from 6 to 7, and the men would stay as long as I would sometimes care to work on, only the arrival of the coffee at the latter hour pins me down to punctuality irrespective of ends of paragraphs. I wish to add that the men in "V" Block are not only interested by uniformly respectful and even grateful and their quite and orderly manner and mode of address are gratifying to me.

PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

Report on work for the month of February, 1919.

An intravenous injection of 0.875 gm. of Novarsenobillon, dissolved in 10cc. of Saline, was given with excellent immediate result to a patient with Relapsing Fever.

The peculiar bodies found in blood as described in the monthly report for September, 1918 are now believed to be <sup>free</sup> single nuclei of polymorphonuclear neutrophile leucocytes with unusually distinct nucleoli.

Two post mortem examinations were made, one of 3675, Tpr. Hay, 1st A.L.H. Broncho-pneumonia of unusually granular or small nodular type somewhat resembling Tuberculosis and the second of 2419, Tpr. Robinson E.H.W., A.A.S.C., Broncho-pneumonia.

2. **DEMobilIZATION.**

The demobilization of A.I.F. in Egypt will be carried out by the unit system and only a very few extremely urgent priority claims will be considered. A.I.F. Department of Repatriation & Demobilization Orders No 2 para 12 is published for information:-

"The attention of all members of the A.I.F. is to be drawn to the fact that amendment of the Commonwealth Defence Act was assented to on June 9th 1918 providing that in lieu of the arrangement that the period of service lasts for 'the duration of the war & 4 months after' the Governor-General may declare by proclamation that the force may be maintained after the time of war so long as that proclamation remains 'in force'. The effect of the amendment is that any person now serving in the A.I.F. has no claim or right to discharge under the terms of his original enlistment. The intention of the amendment is entirely favourable to the members of the A.I.F. since it empowers the Commonwealth Government to pay, feed & clothe them as soldiers until such time as repatriation is completed".

**DEFERRED LEAVE** prior to return to Australia or **LEAVE TO RETURN AT OWN EXPENSE** to Australia for discharge there may be granted for very special and substantial reasons, this leave will not exceed SIX MONTHS in the first instance and will in practically every case be without pay. Particulars may be obtained at the orderly room. (General Instructions No 4 Annexure A).

General Instructions No 6 Annexure "C" is published in full for the information of all ranks:-

**PAY, ALLOWANCES, LEAVE DURING AND AFTER RETURN etc., TO AUSTRALIA.**  
"1. An overdraft upon the Active Pay Account of every soldier of the A.I.F. at the net drawing rate of pay up to a maximum of £30, will be made prior to embarkation from Egypt. This advance is payable when the name of the soldier appears upon the "BOAT ROLL".

"2. The undermentioned amounts may be drawn by soldiers of the A.I.F. during the voyage to Australia in travelling by military transport & provided the necessary credit exists in the paybook:-

- "(a) officers & nurses £10. (b) sergeants & higher rank £5.  
"(c) other ranks £3.

"3. Immediately prior to disembarkation the following payments will be made:- £10 to soldiers who embarked from Australia prior to 1917 & who have not been back since, provided the necessary credit exists in paybook. £5 in all other cases irrespective of paybook balance.

"4. To assist the district paymaster in Australia to effect a prompt settlement of the pay account each soldier during voyage to Australia will be required to:- (a) sign an authority directing the district paymaster to place the balance due to the soldier's account with any bank or savings bank agency in Australia (free of cost). (b) state in writing his Australian postal address.

"5. Upon disembarkation "LEAVE OF ABSENCE OR FURTHER PAY & SUBSIDENCE" has been approved by the Commonwealth Government according to the year of embarkation or re-embarkation from Australia as under:-

"LEAVE. 7 1/2 days for every six months' service abroad from date of embarkation to date of disembarkation.

"(a) for this purpose, fractional periods of service over 4 months will be regarded as six months.

"(b) where total period calculated on above scale includes half a day and a final reduction below whole days the latter will count as a whole day for purposes of leave and also subsistence.

"(c) where members returned to Australia and re-embarked for further service, only the total service outside Australia will count.

"5. LEAVE.

"(d) where period of service abroad is less than six months, not less than 14 days leave will be granted, without subsistence allowance.

"(e) those who have taken long service furlough abroad will be granted 14 days leave WITHOUT SUBSISTENCE ALLOWANCE.

"SUBSISTENCE. Three shillings each day for leave granted as above for all ranks with one year's service abroad, except for those who have taken long service furlough, vide sub-pasa (c). In the case of officers field allowance will cease as from date of disembarkation.

"6. soldiers will be discharged from A.I.F. upon expiration of their leave.

"7. The district paymaster in Australia will make available within 4 days of disembarkation all balance to the credit of the soldier's pay account to date of discharge together with 75% of accrued deferred pay, also subsistence allowance if payable. Balance of deferred pay will be payable as soon as the soldier's pay account has been finalised.

"8. final settlement of the soldier's account will be made by the district paymaster in Australia.

"9. If a soldier has enlisted in one military district, but has his home or relatives in another, he will be permitted to disembark and be discharged in that other district, on the understanding that the Commonwealth will not subsequently be liable to transfer him to the district of his original enlistment. Any soldier desiring such change of district of disembarkation can arrange same by application to the officer commanding the transport. In all cases where the home or family of the soldier is situated at a distance from the port of disembarkation a free warrant to the railway station nearest such home will be issued from port of disembarkation.

"10. All the above provisions apply to the Australian nursing service.

"11. Cases have occurred of men absconding themselves during the journey from France to England, and during the journey from ports in United Kingdom to the ship's side, and of men overstaying leave and being therefore absent from embarkation. Such practices not only very seriously dislocate embarkation procedure, but also involve that the men guilty thereof remain a charge upon the state for longer than necessary. It is to be clearly understood that any man so offending will become liable to the forfeiture, in whole or in part, of any or all of the privileges or payments prescribed above, both before embarkation, during voyage and after disembarkation. This instruction is to be made known widely among all ranks".

The question was raised whether discharge could be granted in the UNITED KINGDOM, & a reply has been received to the effect that all discharges must be finalised in EGYPT, and the only allowance to be granted is the CASH VALUE OF SHIPPING FARE from EGYPT TO ENGLAND at the rate now ruling. No Military Passages can be arranged. This means that every man who applies for discharge from the A.I.F. IN THE UNITED KINGDOM is to take same here and make arrangements for PASSAGE, a sum of MONEY being given him to purchase such PASSAGE. Until definite instructions are received, personnel being discharged will not receive any leave before such discharge, or any PAY in lieu thereof.
