

	30th	1915.	From a communication point of view, nothing important has taken place. Visual signalling is used only Regiments - such as to Supply Depots etc. The mark III phones are working splendidly.	
			The system of bridging lines should only be employed when absolutely necessary. Faults are hard to locate when bridges are employed and "testing" is rendered very difficult.	
			During the month I was issued with 3 office phones. One was used to speak to Div. Hdqrs and the other two were used between the Hdqrs No 4 Section and the Hdqrs outposts (Otago regt) with a simple circuit.	
			The sketch of communications as submitted last month is practically the same except to the outposts. A sketch of the lines there is attached. During the shelling from 5 am to 8 am on the 27th inst. our trench lines were often cut. The method of laying the cable through the trenches require thought. I think this is a case where a few bridges should be used and am going to continue using them there.	ne
