

REPORT ON SUPPLY SERVICES FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY, 1919.

1 27 39 5 men, 5815 heavy draughts, 38931 light draughts RATION STRENGTH. 530 Pack Mules were rationed during the month of January.

Supplies received from Base have been up to the usual QUALITY. good standard.

During the month the divison has not moved, and SUPPLY railhead still remains at COUILLET-MONTIGNIES, which is a very satisfactory railhead.

> All for age for month has been drawn from Pack Train and has been of excellent quality. Bran has been difficult to obtain this month owing to shortage at B-Weights of fresh meat still leaves room for impro veent although the weights during the month are better than during month of November of last year. Methylated Spirits has been obtained in good quantity during month but Wood Preserving Oil has continued to be unobtainable. Fresh Vegetables have been arriving very short and for the last week none at all have arrived on Pack Train owing to shortage of stocks - the shortage would be gravely felt but luckily it has been possible to purchase green

Coal has been arriving very erractically of late none for 5 days and them a barge consignment. this complicates the situation slightly.

580 lbs pripping representing 203 Francs were returned by the Division to railhead for the month of January.

1736 Kilos Cabbages and 12350 kilos Carrots were purchased locally at BOULET, during the month, the condition of these fresh vegetables was excellent.

Summary. Nosboy A. A. S.C. The month has been practically uneventful . I wo more the month for return to Australia. The strength being much reduced thereby, from 20 to 30 min of different battalions of the 1st Infantry Brigade have been attached as drivers. Three officers have also been attached for duty. The usual transport duties have been carried in drawing Supplies from railhead to dump. The last few days of the month this work became rather Severe on the horses owing to the slippery condition of the frozen roads. However the delivery of rations has been by no means retarded. All horses of the boy have been classified and branded according to the different classes they well come under when demobilization of animals takes place. Deveral parties of men have visited the cohies of Buissels and Namuer during the month, the former city created a favourable impression on all those who visited there. The health of the men throughout the month has been very good. Very little Lickness of any kind having been reported I we men were wacuated, one with bronchiho, and the other, who was on detatehment with measles Mosdan Capt. 31-1-1919

MAR DIARY JON MONTH of JANUARY 1919. 1st Australian Div. Train. No. 3 Company. Motal Establishment WACONS, GS. 23. LIMBERS, G.S. 2. of bompany The bomparry is still located at COUILLET and as supplies are being drawn from railhead in close vicinity to the dump, thansport has consequently remained light. Ten wagons daily, averaging two miles per wagon have been retruited for the transport of supplies for 2 nd australian Infantry Porigade and occasional Arips to CHATELET, 12/2 miles distant, and CHARLEROI, 2 miles distant, has constituted the whole of the transport for the month. one wagon still remains detached with 2nd australian Machine burn bompany. On the 8 th, und one complete turnout 1 proceeded for duty with ist australian Divisional Leave Club, NAMUR, but returned on 30 Ab. inst. owing to the closing of the Club. The general condition of both houses twagons is good. Throughout the shouth the company has experienced considerable difficulty owning to Ahi shortage of drivers, occasioned by 1914/5 men returning to australia, but it is hoped before long to place these vacancies filled by hansfers show infantry 4the arrival of green forcements. Waring the whole period supplies were drawn from Coullet Montignies Railhead by this unt to refelling point - this requiring son an average eighteen wagons daely The approximate distance covered during the period was 6550 Wilvs. At first considerable apprentties were - encountered at the Railhead Insufficient space causing much delay. the men are billeted in particularly good and comportable bellets and are experiencing a fairly comfortable line The health of the men is very good and no sickness prevails. During the month we have had 20 Kanks evacuated sick one with influencya and one with veneral disease. We have had in men transferred and remustered as drivers from Infantry Battalions and 16 Men attached from the 3rd brigade for general duties - pending transfer One Officer has proceeded to australia . 20 Ranks proceeded to australia on special Repatriation also 19- other 1915 personnel 3 Officers from 3rd pregudo have been attached for instinctional purposes. a considerable amount of money has been apont during the month on regetables and comforts which were very much rappreciated by all ranks

The horses have been stabled under 11 heen required. No oukness prevails in horse lines and all animals are in good condition all horses have been clasified by a veternary board during the worth
