

MONTHLY REPORT FOR AUGUST 1918.

I have the honour to submit for your consideration the following report:-

- Discipline continues to be very good. There is a tendency on the part of the men to overstay their leave passes and to attempt to go out during the day without pass. This is being combated by arranging for the fences surrounding the Hospital to be surmounted by barbed wire, by increased vigilance at the gate, by attention on the part of the Policemen (A.M.C.) and by disciplinary measures taken by the Ward Medical Officers and if necessary the Orderly Room.
- The work of this Department is being done by Q.M.S. Watts. Although the absence of a Quarter Mester is felt in many ways the work that has been carried out by Mr. Watts is admirable and I wish to express appreciation of his work. The supply of rations has been good; potatoes, jam and flour are now all satisfactory. Difficulty was experienced with fish. The Grimsby control has always been unsatisfactory. Some months ago, when the local control was cancelled, vigorous protest was made from the local control was cancelled, vigorous protest was made from this Mospital but without results. Consignments were received in succession unfit for human consumption, and I have asked the Officer in charge of A.S.C. Supplies to take action against the Company concerned.
- The work of the V.A.Ds. continues to be satisfactory.

 Miss Jones has taken up her duties as Commandant. "The Romans" is now fully occupied as regards the main building, and I hope to have the Billiard Room ready for occupation within a few days. Owing to difficulty in getting R.E. work done the Lavatory is not yet commenced at the Hospital but the Dining Room and Superintendent's Office, for the construction of which we depend on our own labour, is now ready for use.
- 4. CONSTRUCTIONAL WORK AND REPAIRS.

 As stated before alterations to the Billiard Room are in progress which should result in a much more satisfactory stage and stage arrangements. The Billiard Table has been transferred to the Schools. The Dining Room and Superintendent's

Office are completed at the Hospital. The concreteing of the covered way to the schools is in progress. Various minor alterations to paths, gas, lighting, etc., are in progress.

- A separate memo. is being forwarded covering the work of these shops, and suggesting that the Red Cross Commissioner be approached with a view to the provision of more accommodation.
- The potato crop promises to be very satisfactory.
 Cabbages, marrows, tomatoes and mixed vegetables have been or are being used from our own garden in considerable quantity.
 - 7. GENERAL HEALTH.
 The general health of the patients is good.
- 8. MEDICAL OFFICERS.

 Major Lethbridge has been detailed for temporary duty
 with Golonel Homman inspecting various Orthopaedic Establishments
 in Italy and France.

Major A.V. Meehan has been detailed an instructional course to Alder Hey Hospital at Liverpool. Captain Forsyth has been attached to replace him during his absence.

- Visits have been paid during the month by the Right
 Hon. W.M. Hughes, by Sir Joseph Cook, and by the Australian
 Press Commission. Special attention was paid in each case
 in talking to the boys with a view to ascertaining their
 feelings with regard to the provision of good limbs and good
 food in England. Satisfaction was expressed in every case
 with the result of their visit.
- Returns are attached giving symopsis of their work by the Surgeon Specialist, the Officers in charge of Special Departments, the Q.M. and the Matron.

REPORT ON Q.M'S DEPARTMENT FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST - 1918.

Capt. Aspinall is still on duty at A.I.F. depots in the United Kingdom.

Great difficulty was experienced in obtaining sufficient leather for the repairing of boots, and supplies are not yet to hand, which necessitated obtaining supplies temporarily from the Red Cross Workshops on loan.

The fresh fish supplied by the Pennant Fish Supply Co., Grimsby, was very unsatisfactory, four consignments totalling 910 lbs. were condemned by Board of Officers.

Application was made to Officer i/c Supplies for authority to purchase locally but has not been granted to date, which necessitates the issue of tinned fish. Vegetables have been principally supplied from the Regimental Garden for use of Patients and Staff.
