



DAMASCUS.

Oct.  
1918.  
1st.

**SITUATION** - 3rd Brigade astride DAMASCUS - HOMS - ALEPPO Road.  
5th Brigade astride DAMASCUS - BEIRUT Road. Bouchier's Force  
(4th and 12th L.H.Regts.) rounding up P/W DAMASCUS.  
Medical Units as under:-

Medical personnel of D.H.Q. and all motor ambulances formed  
Advanced Dressing Station on roadside <sup>near</sup> EL MEZZE.

3rd and 5th L.H.Field Ambulances (wheels and camels) arrived  
D.H.Q. en route from KAUKAB at about 1300, where 3rd Ambulance  
Tent Section took over Dressing Station run by D.H.Q. (30 odd of  
our own sick) and further admitted great numbers of wounded  
and exhausted P/W.

All wheels halted at EL MEZZE in compliance with strict orders  
that no troops should enter DAMASCUS

Camels of 5th L.H.Field Ambulance ordered to DURMA in response  
to a wire from 5th Brigade reporting numerous Turkish casualties.

No report of medical situation received from 3rd Brigade.

At 1700 received permission from Divisional Commander for self  
and D.A.D.M.S. to reconnoitre hospitals in Damascus, but  
darkness soon prevented us carrying it out.

D.H.Q. moved to billet in SALIHIYEH at about 1730.

2nd. 3rd L.H.Field Ambulance same location. Choked with sick and  
founder P/W. Four cars allotted to 3rd L.H.F.Amb. to assist  
in collection of ~~founder~~ <sup>founder</sup> P/W along KUNEITRA road.

5th L.H.Field Ambulance ordered at 1000 to join Brigade at DURMAR.

Remainder of convoy conducted by A.D.M.S. up BEIRUT Road and  
there collected from out of the shambles about 30 Turkish  
wounded, returning them to Turkish Hospital, DAMASCUS.  
Meanwhile the D.A.D.M.S. sent four cars to evacuate sick and  
wounded of 3rd Brigade to English Hospital, DAMASCUS.

Eight cars reinforced by 6 heavy cars of 35th M.A.C. and at  
1300 whole convoy proceeded again up BEIRUT road to DURMA  
evacuating about 60 wounded Turks collected by 5th Ambulance.

Ausdiv Collecting Station arrived in the evening and ordered  
to take over Dressing Station from 3rd Ambulance at EL MEZZE.

3rd Ambulance (Tent Section and wheels) ordered to rejoin  
Brigade at JOBAR as soon as possible after relieved by D.C.S.

3rd.

In response to orders from Desert Mounted Corps, A.D.M.S.  
met Lt.Col. Lawrence of Hedjaz Army and A.P.M., Desert Mounted  
Corps at Hamidish Barracks Hospital. Condition of 6 - 700  
patients in this hospital was found on inspection to be  
indiscribably hideous and inhuman. Deserted by all save a  
handful of Turkish Medical personnel, starved for three days,  
and suffocated by the stench of their own offal and the  
unburied dead, the plight of these wretches was more than  
miserable. A.D.M.S., Ausdiv, signified his inability to take  
over any hospitals in DAMASCUS, and Lt.Colonel Lawrence there-  
upon undertook, as a representative of the Sherifian administration,  
the control in reconstruction of these institutions.

In addition, the ~~Mercas~~ <sup>Turkish</sup> Hospital contained about 600 sick and

wounded Turks, but the condition of these patients was comparatively good as the Medical Staff still remained.

The British and French Hospitals at N.E. end of town also contained some 300 Turkish sick and wounded i/c of a Turkish Staff.

All these hospitals <sup>were</sup> ~~are~~ practically without food, and endeavours were made to supply them by the aid of Major Young of the Local Resources Committee.

The German Hospital contained about 300 sick and wounded Germans i/c of a German Doctor assisted by several nurses and about 40 orderlies, and ~~are~~ comparatively well off as regards medical supplies and food.

Major Watson and three <sup>R.A.M.C.</sup> ~~officers~~ other ranks reported at about 1000 for duty with operating Unit. posted to French Hospital and placed on ration strength of 3rd Ambulance.

N.B. English and French Hospitals, hitherto i/c Turkish Red Crescent Society, were at this stage being emptied of their Turkish patients in order to make room for E.E.F. cases.

4th.

D.D.M.S., Descorps, took over responsibility of Damascus Hospitals. Major Evans (M.C.) seconded from D.A.D.M.S. Ausdiv to act as P.M.O., DAMASCUS, under D.D.M.S., Descorps.

3rd L.H. Field Ambulance (less small detachment ordered to assist at English Hospital) accompanied its Brigade on Moving to JUDEIDE.

5th L.H. Field Ambulance remained at DURMA.

Evacuations:- Serious cases to French and English Hospitals; light cases to D.C.S., ELMEZZE.

N.B. At this stage the Ausdiv Collecting Station, already overcrowded, was ordered to take over 200 British and Indian patients and 100 P/W left at KADEM by 4th Cavalry Division on marching to MOALIKA. Evacuating by motor lorries the D.C.S. was, in a measure, capable of dealing with the situation, but the block was only reflected to 4th L.H.F. Ambulance, KUNEITRA, and heavy cars had to be despatched for evacuation rearward of KUNEITRA.

Daily round of Damascus Hospitals made by D.A.D.M.S. Indents for rations collected en route and handed over to Major Young, of Local Resources Board, in bulk, Supplies now coming forward and condition of hospitals is improving. Some 200 P/W being engaged in cleaning up chaotic condition of Hamidieh Barracks and endeavours being made to engage staff from the local residents. Situation not quite certain as responsibility of hospitals between Sherifian Government and ourselves not quite settled. Major Clarke of 3rd Ambulance, (now in charge of English Hospital) and Major Watson of Operating Unit in charge of French Hospital. Turkish patients being gradually removed from both these hospitals to adjacent houses, and our own patients being admitted. Officers and men of these hospitals working under tremendous difficulty on account of shortage of personnel, drugs, and supplies, but everything possible is being done to make them comfortable under existing circumstances.

Late in afternoon about 800 more Turkish sick were brought and admitted to Hamidieh Barracks from the vicinity of KADEM. This unexpected flood rather overwhelmed the slender organization which had attempted to deal with the large number of previously existing patients.

The British and French Hospitals at N.E. end of town also contained some 300 Turkish sick and wounded i/c of a Turkish Staff.

4th (contd.) During the Day the D.A.D.M.S. accompanied the Corps Commander on an inspection of hospitals.

5th. 5th Cavalry D.R.S. arrived DAMASCUS and ordered to relieve Ausdiv Collecting Station. Ausdiv Collecting Station to pass to control of Desert Mounted Corps and move to French Hospital on completion of relief.

A.D.M.S. off duty with influenza.

Capt. Graham, R.A.M.C. attached Sherifian Army, has now definitely taken over responsibility for control of sick and wounded P/W in DAMASCUS.

D.A.D.M.S. visited 11th Cavalry Brigade Field Ambulance in vicinity of KADEM which had been left behind by its Division with a large number of patients. Arranged for evacuation to Ausdiv Collecting Station by Des corps Ammunition Lorries.

Food supplies for Hospitals ~~and~~ are now coming forward fairly satisfactorily, but tremendous number of sick are now being admitted throwing a terrific strain on the few medical personnel forming the staff of the English and French Hospitals and the Ausdiv Collecting Stations.

6th. Major Evans relieved from duties of P.M.O., DAMASCUS, and returned as D.A.D.M.S., Ausdiv.

Ausdiv Collecting Station moved to French Hospital.

7th. A.D.M.S. returned to duty, and in company with D.A.D.M.S. visited P/W Compound, KAUKAB, at present under Ausdiv administration. Out of 9,000 P/W, 3000 are considered sick and are dying at the rate of 100 per day. Medical arrangements placed in charge of Capt. Baker, M.O., 10th L.H.Regt., (doing guard duty) who has available sufficient Syrian and Turkish medical personnel.

Shortage of food, shelter, and medical stores, being requisitioned from Damascus by Lt.Colonel Todd, D.S.O.

Fatal case of Cholera reported from 3rd Ambulance.

Two FORD Ambulances allotted to each of 3rd and 5th Ambulances.

Nominal Roll of captured E.E.F. Personnel in hospitals forwarded to Ausdiv H.Q.

Personal cheque of £5 issued by A.D.M.S. to Major Farry, (O.C., Ausdiv D.C.S.) for provision of medical comforts for patients.

8th. A.D.M.S. visited 5th Cavalry D.R.S. and found such hopeless congestion of patients and inadequate staff that it was decided that all sick of Ausdiv should be held by Ambulances pending improvement. Orders to this effect despatched to 3rd and 5th Ambulances and efforts made to augment small amount of tentage available for 3rd L.H.Fld.Ambulance. 5th L.H.F.Ambulance have occupied very suitable billets in which to treat sick.

Resume of anti-cholera measures prepared for A.A. & Q.M.G. and promulgated by him in circular memo to Brigades.

Detachment of 3rd Ambulance at English Hospital rejoined main body.

Returns for W.E. 5/10/18 forwarded D.D.M.S. (App. 1).

A.D.M.S. called on D.D.M.S., Desert Mounted Corps, (sick in bed) and reported the situation at 5th Cav. D.R.S.

Personal cheque of £5 issued by A.D.M.S. to each of 3rd and 5th Ambulances for provision of medical comforts for patients.

10th.

Personal cheque of £5 issued to Lieut. Clarke (O.C., Des corps Rest Camp, DAMASCUS) for provision of medical comforts for patients.

11th.

Des corps Rest Camp started under Ausdiv administration and billeted in neighbourhood of EL MEZZE. Captains TYRRE and GEMMELL detailed to do the sick parades in connection with this establishment.

12th.

Received covering authority by wire from the Commissioner, Australian Red Cross Society, for £15 expended for medical comforts and up to £25 more if necessary.

13th.

Ausdiv D.R.S. arrived and ordered by D.D.M.S. to relieve 5th Cavalry D.R.S.

Staff Sgt. Dispenser of 5th L.H. Field Ambulance sent to report P.M.O., DAMASCUS, for duty in captured enemy Medical Store Depot, DAMASCUS. These captured stores have been the whole source of supply for this Division and others since arrival in DAMASCUS, no medical stores having yet arrived from the Base.

Casualties amongst personnel during operations have been very heavy. Up to this stage, the following Medical Officers have been admitted to Hospital:-

At present both Ambulances are very full. All Hospitals in DAMASCUS also full. Many men dying from a duplicate infection of Malaria M.T. and Influenza, these being the two prevailing diseases.

Ausdiv supplied seven light motor ambulances for Desert Mounted Corps evacuation from DAMASCUS to BEIRUT.

Light cars returned from BEIRUT, less one abandoned en route. All cars more or less the worse for wear.

One H.T. Ambulance Wagon from 3rd Ambulance ordered to 4th L.H. Regiment, and one from 5th Ambulance ordered to 12th L.H. Regiment.

Ten caacolet camels from <sup>each of</sup> 3rd and 5th Ambulances ordered to D.R.S.

Two motor lorries sent to Rest Camp for evacuation of convalescents to BEIRUT.

Shortage of Medical Officers (seven) wired to Desert Mounted Corps.

18th.

Descorps questioned salubrity of Ausdiv camping sites of DAMASCUS.

After inspection the following camp sites were recommended to be moved:-

Inspected P/W Compound, KAUKAB, where conditions of sick have been segregated and conditions of shelter and other comforts much improved, with consequent considerable reduction in death rate.

Inspected 3rd and 5th Field Ambulances and found conditions satisfactory. Each Ambulance now carrying 50 - 60 patients.

24th. Raining. No bivouac sheets or tentage in possession of troops who have summer clothing and only one blanket. Efforts being made to requisition blankets and shelters in DAMASCUS by "Q" Branch, and a small issue of Turkish blankets and canvas sheets was made.

Capt. C. H. Anderson reported for duty.

Warning received re probable move of Division, *see 10<sup>th</sup> Regt.*

3rd Ambulance evacuated to Ausdiv D.R.S.

5th Ambulance " by rail to 4th Cavalry D.R.S., MOALLAKA.

4th Ambulance, KUNETRA, evacuated by heavy car convey to Ausdiv D.R.S., DAMASCUS.

D.C.S., French Hospital, released from duties and placed under A.D.M.S., Ausdiv, who ordered them to stand fast at present.

25th. 4th Ambulance on move with Brigade from KUNETRA to DAMASCUS.

26th. Rain continued to fall.

Major Simpson and Captains Joske and Molesworth arrived D.R.S.

4th Ambulance arrived and camped with Brigade at EL MEZZE.

66th C.C.S. arrived proceeded to take over from Ausdiv D.R.S.

Ausdiv D.R.S. on completion of relief to come under orders of A.D.M.S., Ausdiv.

Medical Instruction No. 6 issued (Appendix 4).

27th. 3rd and 5th Ambulances accompanied their Brigades N. of DAMASCUS.

*Adjustment made of interchanged personnel, animal, vehicles and equipment between 3<sup>rd</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Amb. previously detailed*

All cars withdrawn from Ambulances to rejoin convey under Divisional control.

*One H.T. Amb. Wagon detached from 3<sup>rd</sup> Amb. for duty with 10<sup>th</sup> Regt. remaining Damascus*

It. Col. Single admitted to Hospital with Malignant Malaria.



Report on Prisoners of War Compound, KAUKAB.

1. Medical Charge. Ausdiv M.O. in attendance since night 3rd/4th October. Capt. Baker, 10th A.L.H. Regt. is present doing this duty, and has organised captured Red Crescent personnel to give what attention they can.
2. Number and Distribution of Sick. There are now three sub-divisions of the Prisoners of War Compound each containing 1,000 sick (lying cases). There is no hospital accommodation in DAMASCUS for this number. There is no transport to move them there even if considered advisable. At present bivouac there are no blankets or bivouac sheets - 5,000 are immediately required.
3. Danger to others. The 3rd A.L.H. Brigade is drawing water from lower down in the same stream. Immediate steps are necessary to correct this as one case of Cholera is reported from 3rd Brigade this afternoon. Further, the sick prisoners of war should be segregated from the healthy and camped lower down the water supply.

- (1). ROUTE. In the event of a move Northwards the Division will use the DAMASCUS - KUPSIYE - NEEK - HOMS Road.
- (2). AUSDIV MEDICAL UNITS.
- (a). Mobile Sections will accompany Brigades.  
in rear of Division
- (b). D.C.S. will march with ~~Divisional Transport~~ (probably concentrating at DUMA) under orders to be issued later.
- (c). Light Ambulance Convoy. Cars will be withdrawn from Units and concentrated as a convoy marching under D.A.D.M.S.
- (3). OTHER MEDICAL UNITS. The following situations of Medical Units are notified for the purpose of evacuations, etc:-
- BEIRUT. No. 32 Combined Clearing Hospital.  
No. 8 Advanced Depot Medical Stores.
- TRIPOLI. 74th. Casualty Clearing Station.  
No. 4 Malaria Diagnosis Station.
- MOALLAKA. 4th. Divisional Receiving Station.  
Malaria Diagnosis Unit.
- HOMS. 5th. Divisional Receiving Station.
- DAMASCUS. Ausdiv Receiving Station.  
66th. Casualty Clearing Station.
- Motor Ambulance Convoy. Four heavy cars are working with 5th. Cav. Division between MAARIT-EN-NAAMAN and HOMS only if roads are dry. Nine heavy cars between HOMS and TRIPOLI. The remainder of the convoy is at DAMASCUS and MOALLAKA. More motor ambulances will be sent on to the TRIPOLI-HOMS circuit as the roads allow.
- (4). EVACUATIONS EN ROUTE. For stages as far as NEEK, H.T. Wagons when full will fall back to D.C.S. Echelon, being emptied daily by Light Motor Ambulance to DAMASCUS. For stages North of NEEK cases will be carried forward to 5th Cav. Receiving Station. North of HOMS further instructions will be issued.
