

<p>The return of Units to MOASCAR prior to demobilisation has commenced and within a few days all Units except the 14th. and 15th.L.H.Regiments will have returned.</p> <p>A Medical Officer is being left at ZAGAZIG to attend to Australian patients evacuated to 123rd.Indian Combined Field Ambulance.</p> <p>The sick rate is keeping very low and malarial relapses are becoming less numerous despite the exceedingly hot weather.</p> <p>Not a single case of infectious disease has occurred in the MOASCAR camp during the month. Disinfection is being carried out thoroughly and troops are embarking with every prospect of remaining "clear" throughout the voyage to AUSTRALIA.</p>



Reference Disinfecting Station.

The Disinfecting Station recently formed in MOASCAR Camp for this Division will not be required after the middle of July (approximately). It includes two Thresh Disinfectors, two hot water tanks, an R.P.I.P. tent for hot baths for other ranks fitted with tarpaulin floor and grease pits, dressing tents, and bathing and dressing tents for officers.

This Station is conveniently situated and it would be a pity to dismantle it on our departure, as there appear to be no other disinfecting facilities for British personnel.

It is therefore requested that you take the Station over from us when our disinfection prior to embarkation is completed.
