MONTHLY REPORT - S.O., A.D.S. FRANCE - AUGUST 1918.

1. INSPECTIONS.

During the month I have visited and enquired into the work of the undermentioned Dental Units :-

On account of the Ambulance Car usually allotted to me to visit Units being required from August 8th. to the present date for the evacuation of wounded occasioned by Corps operations I have had no means of reaching Units. The car for this Office approved by War Office No. 121/Stores/8911 (S.D.2) of 22-7-18 has not yet arrived. Communication has been made to the D.M.T.S. A.I.F. and efforts are being made to have the car expedited. During the course of the month I have, however, in one way or another, seen practically all of the Dental Officers in the Corps Area and have been constantly advised of Units' change in location so that contact and liaison have been maintained in this manner.

The work at the 1st. Aust. General Hospital was hindered by the evacuation of Capt. IRWIN, but is now going smoothly again with Capt. JENKINS in charge of Unit No. 33.

I found at Rouen that the following A.I.F. Units were not sending men to 1st. A.G.H. for dental treatment and communicated with the Os. C. advising them that dental treatment was available to all ranks of their formation :- 1st., 4th., and 5th. Aust. Field Bakeries, 19th. and 20th. Aust. Depot Units of Supply.

I found the work at the Aust. Base Depots Havre proceeding very satisfactorily. Major TERRY, S.D.O., has the situation well in hand and has undoubtedly effected great improvement both in system and actual dealing with dental parades. I could find no fault whatever with conditions at the Aust. Base

Depots. I would like to state here that I took some of the parades and was agreeably surprised at the excellent condition of the mens' mouths. The work of the Australian Dental Services both in England and France during the past two years is apparent and it was a great satisfaction to see the good that has been done in restoring to efficiency the hundreds of what were formerly useless and septic teeth, and if the parades I saw are a sample - and they were not specially chosen for me to see - the work accomplished reflects the greatest credit on all ranks of the Aust. Dental Services.

2. WORK ACCOMPLISHED DURING MONTH.

Work in the field - comprising that of 23 Units - has been greatly hampered by the operations in which the Corps has been engaged. With the advance forward the Units have been obliged to pack and unpack frequently during the month. Accomodation has not always been easy to obtain and has frequently had to be built and as the troops are engaged in offensive operations the dental parades have been very small.

3. STORES.

Stores have come forward in good order from Havre with the exception of Plaster of Paris which is of an inferior quality still. Having no means of conveyance has hindered the delivery of stores but the Units have not suffered greatly on this account as work has not been very pressing during the month.

Appendix 1, herewith, shews the establishment of a means of doing casting. The need of this is not great but is at times very necessary and the scheme is being given a trial.

4. DENTAL CLINIC AT CORPS H.Q.

I have obtained a complete and up to date dental equipment - surgical only - and have rendered services when time was available to the Staff of Corps Headquarters during the month as shewn in Appendix 2 attached.

5. LEAVE.

During the month I allowed the undermentioned to proceed on leave :-

This means that 23% of the strength of Aust. Dental Services serving with Aust. Corps have had leave during the month. All ranks who have been in France over five months will have received leave in one form or another between July 1st. and Sept. 15th. unless -

1. Leave pro-offered has been declined.
2. There has been a bona-fide reason for not allotting leave such as

- a. inattention to this Office instructions regarding stores, returns etc.,
- b. Crime,
- c. Venereal disease.

Leave has been liberally given during the month so that all concerned may take a rest whilst there is little work presenting and so that there should be little or no leave given when the Corps or Divisions go into rest.

6. MONTHLY REPORT OF S.D.O. HAVRE. (Appendix 3).

The influx of men into the Aust. Convalescent Depot makes it imperative that at least two extra Units and three if possible be sent with equipment from England as soon as possible to cope with the extra rush of work which is now commencing and which will continue for some time at the Aust. Base Depots and if extra help be not obtained in this emergency the dental situation in France will become out of control. The numbers of convalescent men marching into the Convalescent Depot have exceeded past records and in view of the Corps operations the numbers are likely to be even larger than is at present the case.

7. WAR DIARY.

A more elaborate scheme for this Office War Diary has been worked out - Appendix 4 - and by this means a very complete synopsis of all events of public and professional interest can be rendered in narrative form each month to the Aust. War Records Section from this Office. The idea is to choose or eliminate the events from each diary rendered and form the same into one narrative diary on A.F.C.2118 together with usual appendices regularly rendered.

-----CASTING APPARATUS.

1. A Solbrig's casting outfit with bellows, petrol blowpipe and accessories has been established at the Office of the Q.M. Aust. Dental Supplies, Aust. Corps Headquarters.
2. This apparatus is at all times at the disposal of all Dental Officers in Aust. Corps and allows of casting inlays, bridges, plates, etc.
3. Dental Officers intending to use same should requisition for Taggart's inlay wax as laid down in this Office Q.9. of 13-6-18. A small supply of inlay wax may be obtained immediately if marked "urgent" on A.F.I. 1209.
4. Dental Officers must personally do their own casting and come supplied with necessary gold or other metal and petrol. Gold may be obtained from Div. Paymasters or at Canteens.
5. All work in which gold is used should be kept at a minimum and must be shewn on weekly dental reports.
6. For the information of all concerned the apparatus has been established to meet those cases where restoration of a durable character is essential and is not otherwise possible with materials at present in vogue. All expense of gold must be met from the patient's pocket and can under no circumstances become chargeable to the public.

Herewith report on working of Australian Dental Clinic, 1st. Australian Convalescent Depot, Havre, for month ending 27th. August 1918.

GENERAL. There has been a large volume of work presenting, particularly towards the latter end of the month as larger drafts than usual have marched into Convalescent Depot, the total strength on 27-8-18 being 2576, the highest since the inception of the Depot. The general standard of dental fitness of these troops on marching in, still remains satisfactory, as is shewn by the following figures -

PROPOSED ADDITIONS TO CLINIC. During the month I have submitted to the proper authorities plans shewing additions which it is proposed to make to the present building. These additions consist mainly of a waiting and inspection room, which has become necessary in view of the fact that all patients marching into Convalescent Depot, totalling sometimes about 700 weekly, are dentally examined and also because the dental personnel employed here has been greatly increased since the clinic was established. It is to be hoped that these alterations will be completed before the winter sets in. Otherwise a great deal of congestion will occur here and the number of patients treated will be considerably diminished.

STRENGTH OF STAFF.

If the number of patients marching into Convalescent Depot weekly continues to exceed 650, as has happened recently, it is evident that the present staff will not be adequate to cope with all the work which will occur, as patients march through fairly rapidly and are not held in the Depot for purely dental reasons as has been the routine in Command Depots in England. I am bringing this point to notice as it is quite possible that the number of patients in Convalescent Depot will remain consistently high during the winter and it will follow that only a proportion of the dental patients presenting can be treated under the present conditions on account of the inadequacy of both personnel and accomodation.

 WAR DIARY - A.A.M.C. DENTAL SERVICES.

It is thought that the above could be greatly improved upon if each individual Dental Officer kept a small diary of events during each month. To this end each Dental Officer will, (from 1-9-18), keep a narrative record of events in his Unit which will be forwarded monthly, in quadruplicate, to reach this Office not later than the fifth day of the succeeding month. Diary should embrace period of first to last day of each month. Endeavours to make the diary narrative will be made and the diary will be submitted on A.F.C.2118 obtainable by indent from this Office. In elaboration the diary should tell of all moves, map locations of Unit (places may be mentioned), state of men's mouths and teeth on dental parades, difficulties encountered in regard to actual dental treatment, matters regarding stores and transport, a description of the accommodation in which Unit works during the month, sickness, casualties, leave, particulars of any schemes worked out for obtaining parades and feasibility of such schemes, totals of work done during month, influence of weather and fighting conditions on dental parades, memoranda of instructions received from higher authority in relation to formations to be treated, suggestions for the improvement of the Aust. Dental Services, particulars of dental condition of troops not A.I.F. who may parade for treatment, any information of a strictly professional nature in relation to cases treated with particulars of modus operandi pursued, (jaw fractures and jaw wounds in particular), drugs which have been found successful or otherwise, particulars of cases radiographed or sent for bacteriological examination, items of general interest both to the public and to the dental profession etc. etc.

Diaries must be clearly written and on one side of paper only. When possible typewritten diaries should be submitted.

ALL A.I.F. DENTAL OFFICERS IN FRANCE.

It has come to notice that certain of the A.A.M.C. Dental Services have accepted money from civilians as remuneration for dental services rendered. This must cease immediately.

For the information of all concerned it is pointed out that as the civilian dentists, who ordinarily in peace times practise in what is now the zone of the British Armies, have been called to the colours of our Ally, principally as combatants, the civilian population, particularly in Army Areas, is dependant upon the various Dental Services of the British Armies for the alleviation of pain of dental origin and it is incumbent upon A.I.F. Dental Officers to relieve such pain when civilians present themselves for treatment.

The civilian population has always been appreciative of any dental services rendered and will invariably offer to pay in cash for dental attention. Under no circumstances will money be accepted for services rendered to civilians. To do so will bring the greatest discredit upon the Australian Dental Services.

All ranks are warned that all breaches of this instruction will be dealt with with the utmost severity and the severest possible punishment will be meted out to all who may be concerned therein.

One copy of this instruction will be signed as read by ALL of your Unit and returned to this Office. The other copy will be retained in the Unit files for the information of all ranks who may join your Unit in the future.
