

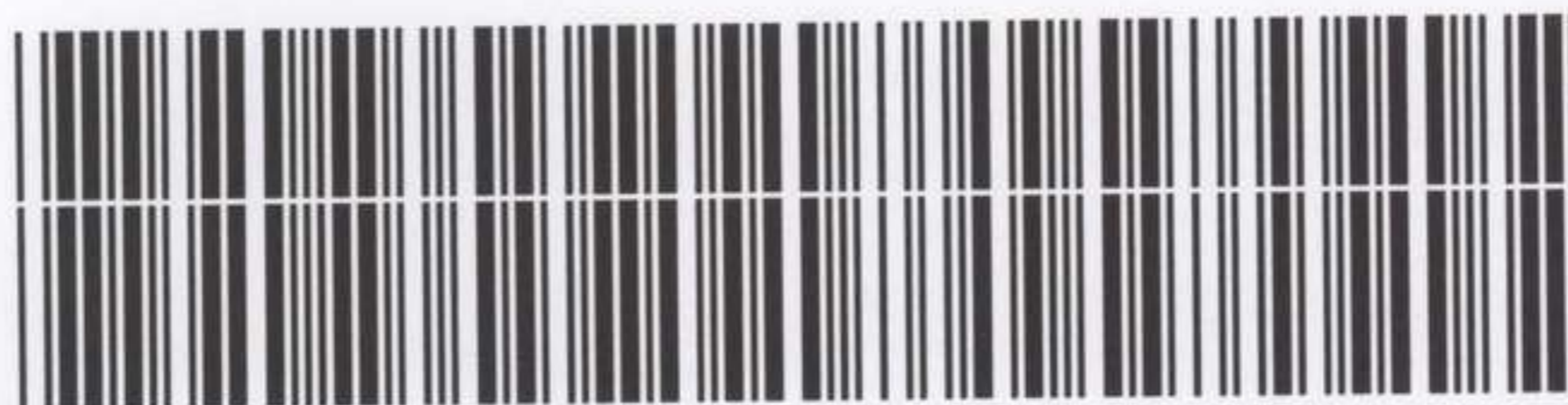

ETINHEM.	Oct.			
	1		Owing to operations the Ambulance Car temporarily loaned to S.O., A.D.S. by D.D.M.S. Corps has been ordered to rejoin Convoy therefore little can be done either in respect of delivering supplies or inspecting Units.	
	2)		So much movement taking place that many Dental Units have been unable to execute much work.	
	3)		Some Divisions of Australian Corps are now proceeding to Areas behind Amiens for a period of rest.	
	4		Took delivery of Ford Box Car No. 55831 and immediately arranged to deliver supplies to nearest Dental Units.	
	5		Proceeded to le Mesnil and looked for Dental Officer attached 14th. Field Ambulance but the main body of the Ambulance had not reached destination; thence to Corps Reinforcement Camp and inspected Unit 98 (Capt. Clark); found no great volume of work was being executed owing to movement of troops. Despatched stores for Units out in rest from Peronne Railhead. Collected stores from No. 18 Advanced Depot Medical Stores.	
	6		Proceeded to "A" Echelon and interviewed D.D.M.S. Aust. Corps. Thence through Tincourt and searched for Capt. Gawley's Unit but failed to locate same.	
	8		Inspected Dental Units attached to 4th. Australian Division. It was found that the Dental Officers were all fully employed but Battalions are very scattered and much time is necessarily wasted in marching men to and from the Dental Clinic.	
	9		Proceeded to Hargicourt and inspected Dental Units attached to 2nd., 3rd. and 4th. D.A.Cs. who were all in that Area. Very little work was being encompassed ^{accomplished} because the Batteries were moving forward rapidly and very few men were available for treatment as a result.	
	10		All Divisions of Aust. Corps are now back in rest and "B" Echelon to which the S.O., A.D.S. is attached is awaiting instructions to move back also. It has therefore been necessary to pack up and stand by for orders to move.

ETINHEM.	Oct. 13		<p>"B" Echelon moved out to EU and on arrival it was found that totally inadequate accomodation had been provided for S.O., A.D.S. Office, Stores, and Staff. This fact was reported to D.D.M.S. and Camp Commandant but no improvement was achieved. The attempt to improve these matters brought out the fact that the S.O., A.D.S. has no direct jurisdiction over Dental Units attached to Corps as he is himself deemed A.I.F. and attached to Corps only for rations, quarters, pay etc. In any reorganization this matter should receive consideration because the S.O., A.D.S. is the only administrative Officer who thoroughly understands the proper utilization of Dental Units and so long as he is only an advisory Office to Corps the major part of his usefulness is lost. The remedy would appear to be that a Staff Officer Dental Services or A.D.D.S. should be added to the establishment of the D.D.M.S. Corps and this Officer would be directly responsible to D.D.M.S. for the efficiency of all matters pertaining to Dental administration for which purpose he should be empowered to communicate direct with A.Ds. M.S. Divisions in the name of the D.D.M.S. The detached Units could then be administered from the Base under the direct jurisdiction of Administrative Headquarters.</p>	
EU.	15		<p>Suitable Office accomodation found and Office immediately opened up. It will be noted that no work of any value has been attended to for 6 days.</p>	
	17		<p>Dental Units attached to the Field Ambulances of the 3rd. Aust. Division were inspected and it was was found that generally speaking sufficient care had not been exercised in the allocation of billets therefore Officers Commanding Ambulances should be instructed that they are directly responsible that the Dental Unit is allotted proper accomodation in an area as central to the Units served by the Ambulance immediately on arrival at a new destination. The co-operation between Dental Officers and R.M.Os. or Adjutants does not appear good and though Dental Officers were found to be fully employed it was more due to the amount of urgent work required rather than due to the completeness of the arrangements made for Dental parades.</p>	
	18		<p>Dental Units attached to 5th. Aust. Division were inspected and similar adverse criticism might be directed against the location of the Units and the premises allotted though the individual Dental Officers appear to have made a much more definite attempt to ascertain how much work needed attention.</p>	
	19) 20)		<p>Occupied in attending to routine Office matters and examination of weekly returns from Dental Units.</p>

EU.	Oct. 21		<p>An inspection was carried out of the Dental Unit attached No. 3 Aust. General Hospital and it was found to be in a satisfactory state and doing good work though the difference in the standard of fitness required in English Units as against the high standard required in Australian Units has led to a difference of opinion between the British A.D.M.S. and the Australian Dental Officer as to what cases should be retained in the institution for further Dental attention.</p>	
			<p>The Dental Units attached to 2nd. Aust. Division were visited and it was found that an unequal division of Units had been made and the Units were rather badly located. Some confusion also seems to exist as to the duties of the Dental Orderly. In some cases the Orderly is also expected to do batman duty for the Dental Officer in addition to his duties as clerk and dresser. I suggest that it be more definitely laid down that the Dental Officer is to be supplied with a batman or his proper share of one by the Unit to which he is attached and thus free the Orderly for a more intense application to his technical military duties.</p>	
			<p>Was spent in dealing with Office matters and the editing of circular instructions marked appendix 1.</p>	
			<p>The Dental Unit attached to Aust. Corps Headquarters was visited and found to be doing useful work.</p>	
			<p>The Dental Units attached to 1st., 2nd., and 3rd. Aust. Field Ambulances were inspected and all found to be well placed and working well. The fact was emphasized that some confusion is caused through Dental Officers having to anticipate their requirements of supplies three weeks ahead and I am personally inclined to suggest that when any large force is in the field Dental Base Stores and Advanced Base Depots should be established (if necessary in conjunction with Base Medical Stores) and Dental Units should be enabled to indent direct on the Advanced Stores where a sufficient supply could be maintained to keep the Dental Units supplied. The personnel of Dental Supply Warehouses with a little training in Army Ordnance Accountancy would be very suitable for Staffing such stores, chiefly because of their familiarity with suitable substitutes for material indented for by Units but not in stock, and also because by experience they could judge the approximate rate of expenditure of the various materials.</p>

EU.	Oct. 30		<p>The Dental Units attached to 12th., 13th., and 4th. Aust. Field Ambulances were inspected and all found to be in working order and to be located in satisfactory billets.</p> <p>I am convinced that the addition of one extra Dental Unit per Division would be very sound as it has been found in nearly every instance that attention required for Divisional Troops is as great or greater than that required for an Infantry Brigade. For a period of two months one Dental Section found that 47% of cases treated were Divisional Troops and only 53% of cases were men of the Brigade for which the Dental Unit was mainly responsible. An extra Dental Unit could be attached to the Divisional Train and could attend to the following troops :- Pioneers, Machine Gun Coys., A.S.C., Cyclists, Div. H.Q., and Engineers. It might even be desirable to make the Dental Officer of this extra Unit a Senior Dental Officer for the Division to work under the A.D.M.S. Were this policy adopted I feel sure that the amount of work executed per Unit for a period of six months would shew a marked improvement and the extra Unit could also be utilised as a stop-gap for casualties, personnel on leave etc.</p> <p>Occupied in attending to routine Office matters and the editing of Appendix 2 .</p>

ALL DENTAL OFFICERS,

It is expected that every effort will be made by Dental Officers attached to Field Units to execute as many fillings as possible for A.I.F. Troops during the present period of rest.

All cases of men not parading for treatment when asked for by Dental Officers should be reported in writing to the A.D.M.S. of the Division concerned through C.O. of Ambulance with a request that an endeavour be made to prevent a recurrence.

Dental Officers should impress upon all concerned that a Dental Officer's usefulness is governed by the number of hours daily during which he has patients in the chair and any failure to parade men when required causes a loss of time which it is impossible to again make good.

A display of initiative is required of every Dental Officer in the Field if his Unit is to be worked at full pressure, and returns will be carefully checked in order to ascertain to what extent these instructions are being complied with.

Dental work for other than A.I.F. Troops will be carried out in accordance with the principles laid down in Medical Instructions Aust. Corps No. 7, a copy of which is herewith attached.

APPENDIX 1.COPY.AUSTRALIAN CORPS.Medical Instructions - Routine No. 7.

In accordance with D.M.S. Fourth Army, Medical Arrangements - Operations No. 27, d/14-5-18, the following arrangements will be made for the dental treatment and disposal of Officers, N.C.Os. and men in the Australian Corps area (except those of the Australian Force).

1. Australian Dental Officers will relieve pain, perform necessary extractions and treat stomatitis. All other Dental cases will be sent by M.A.C. Car to the Dental Officers at No. 5 and 47 Casualty Clearing Stations, CROUY.
2. Cases sent to C.C.S. for treatment at request of Australian Dental Officers will not be shown as evacuations unless it becomes necessary to admit them to C.C.S.
3. Nominal roll will accompany dental patients sent to C.C.S.

APPENDIX 2

D.D.M.S.,
Aust. Corps.

Pursuant to your instructions I beg to submit for your consideration the following suggestions which I think would tend to accentuate the value and efficiency of Dental Units attached Australian Corps if such as are at present deemed feasible were adopted :-

1. It is suggested that the C.Os. of Field Ambulances should be impressed with the fact that a Dental section of unit will always be included on the establishment of their Ambulances and thus they are equally responsible for the work executed by their Dental Unit as for that encompassed by their tent and bearer Sections. Attention might be more universally given to the following points -
 - a. Suitable allotment or operative space for Dental Unit in central position. This matter might be made a definite order to billeting Officers.
 - b. Dental Officer should be instructed to report to O.C. Ambulance that his unit has opened up and is ready to receive patients within two hours of arrival at destination.
 - c. O.C. of Ambulance should instruct Dental Officer to render him a return fo work executed each week.
2. It is suggested that the custom of making the Dental Orderly do duty as batman to the Dental Officer is unsound and should be discontinued, as the Orderly of a Dental Unit is on the establishment for duty as clerk and dresser, therefore if he carry out his technical duties thoroughly (these include care of instruments, cleanliness of clinic, mixing of plastics, record of operations, preparation of parade states and appointments) he will not have the time to look after the Officer personally. Further the soldier may be good in one direction and bad in another and further the practice should cease for disciplinary reasons.
3. It is suggested that the addition of one extra Dental Unit to each Division in the Field would be of great value for attention to Divisional troops. One Dental Unit attached to a Field Ambulance has proved that 47% of total cases treated in a period of two months were Divisional troops, therefore the Infantry Brigade for which the Dental Unit was responsible suffered lack of attention to that extent. Were the extra Unit added it might be attached to the Divisional Train because of transport facilities there obtainable.
4. The advisability of one of the Dental Officers in each Division being appointed a Senior Dental Officer is worthy of discussion. An Officer so appointed would work with his Unit as an ordinary executive Officer but could be utilized by the A.D.M.S. for the following additional duties :-
 - a. To supervise the distribution of work among the Dental Units. N.B. At present there are instances of overcrowding at one Unit whereas a neighbouring Unit could do more.
 - b. To arrange an equal distribution of supplies. N.B. There are instances this month of a Unit being at a standstill for want of material which could have been obtained in the vicinity by a S.D.O.

- c. To occasionally examine the quantity and quality of the work turned out by each Unit and by being on the spot and cognizant of local conditions he could prevent many days being wasted which at present cannot be prevented.
- d. It would only be necessary to find one Officer per Division who possesses great initiative instead of four as at present.

In the first case, admitted Oct. 14th., the fracture was between the lower right central and the lateral incisors, and was caused by a kick from a horse. There was considerable lateral displacement but none vertically. A vulcanite inter-dental splint was constructed, covering the whole of the lower teeth, and with accommodation on its upper surface for the bite of the upper teeth. The splint was cemented in position with oxy-phosphate of copper cement, and when the patient was evacuated to England about a week later he was eating well and appeared to be suffering very little discomfort. The second case came for treatment on October 15th. The fracture was caused by a bullet, the wound of entry being at the Synchysis menti and that of the exit lower down on the left side of the neck. The fracture was double, between the right central and lateral incisors, and between the lower right first and second bicuspids. There was only a small amount of vertical displacement and none laterally. The radiograph disclosed no fragments, and the case was treated in exactly the same way as that previously described. The patient appeared to be quite comfortable when evacuated to England a few days later.</p> <p>On October 26th. a case came for treatment in which the presence of a foreign body was suspected in the upper right maxillary region. The wound of entry was in the neighbourhood of the upper right second bicuspid tooth, and the upper right first molar was shattered completely. The case was radiographed and a foreign body demonstrated above the roots of the upper second molar, of which one of the roots was missing. This molar was removed under local anaesthetic, and the foreign body, a piece of shrapnel, extracted from the floor of the maxillary sinus, which was found to be penetrated. Several pieces of detached bone were removed and the case is progressing well.</p>

Arsenicalis mouth wash, after the Dental Officer has carried out the necessary prophylactic treatment. This will mean that men can be retained in their Battalions, and will not waste time in their daily visits to the Dental Officer.</p> <p><u>Recurrent Pyorrhoea.</u> A patient with this condition was noted. First attack in Egypt. Treated. Second attack in France about January 1917, when a vaccine was prepared and administered. Mouth was normal until this month, when the alveolar process in the region of the lower four incisors, showed evidence of a recurrence. The curious aspect of the case is that this soldier said he had no pain, has no recollection of any causation of the trouble, nor could he on my questioning him very closely, account for it in any way.</p> <p>I had a radiograph taken, which showed incomplete median fracture of the mandible, slight necrosis was present. The injury was probable of three or four weeks standing. I lanced the swollen mucous membrane, syringed for a few days and inserted a cast metal splint, continued the irrigation and slightly scraped the affected bone. This soldier improved very markedly. I feared however there was ME more necrotic tissue than I could cope with at this clinic and as this soldier was M.B. with an injured knee for U.K., and marched out on 30/10/18 I recommended that on his arrival in U.K., he report to Sidcup Hospital.
