

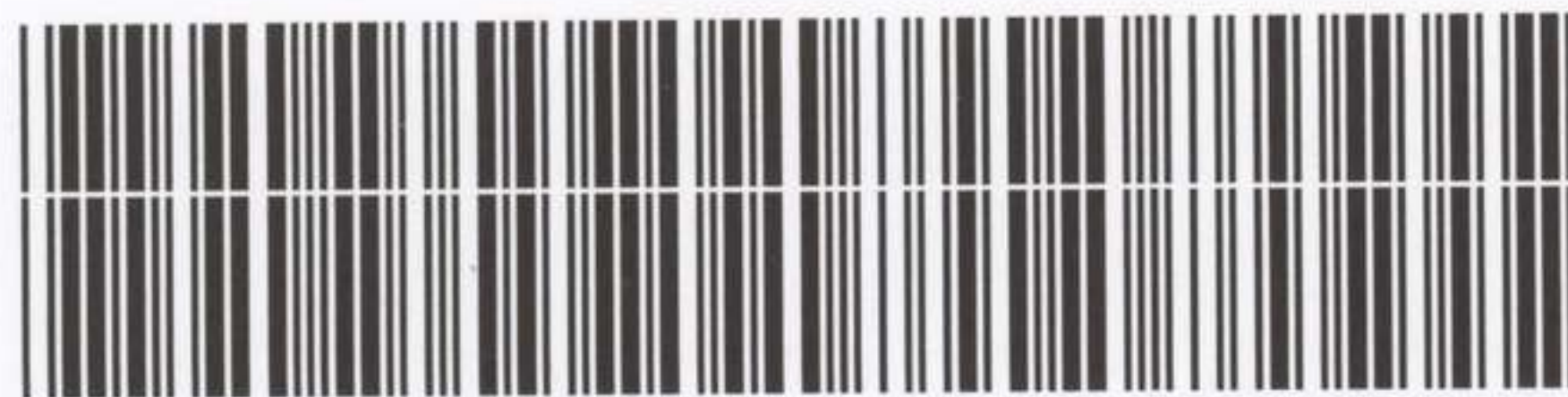

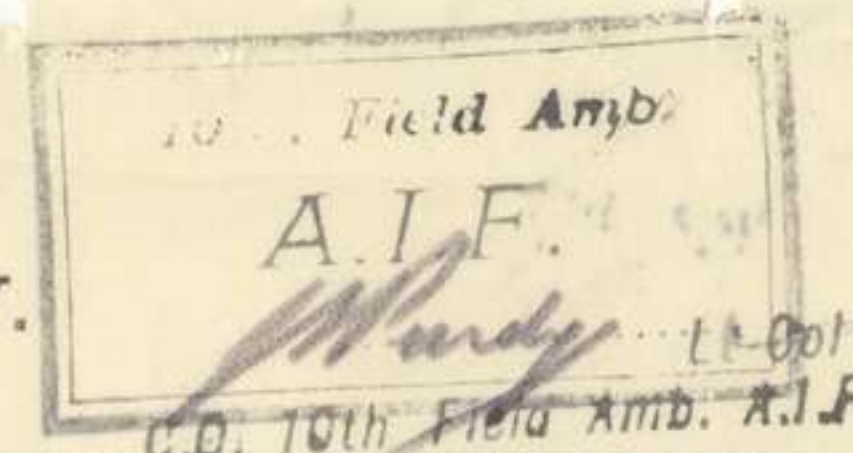

## 3. ADVANCED DRESSING STATION.

Arrangements will be made here for the separation of stretcher and walking cases and special arrangements will be made for the care of the latter.

## 4. MEDICAL PERSONNEL.

10th. Australian Field Ambulance will man the Advanced Dressing Station KANDAHAR FARM and Posts in advance.

The following will report to Officer Commanding 10th. Australian Field Ambulance :-

4. MEDICAL PERSONNEL. (cont)

9th. Australian Field Ambulance less personnel already detailed will man the Divisional Rest Stations at RAVELSBERG and BAILLEUL.

5. RESERVES.

The following will be held in reserve for movement at short notice :-

9th. Aust. Field Ambulance - One tent sub-division complete.  
11th. Aust. Field Ambulance - One Bearer sub-division complete.

6. RECORDS AND ANTI-TETANIC SERUM.

Records will be kept and Anti-Tetanic Serum administered at WESTHOF Main Dressing Station.

7. MEDICAL STORES, MEDICAL COMFORTS, DRUGS, DRESSINGS ETC.

These will be drawn in the usual way.

8. SPARE BLANKETS & STRETCHERS.

These will be drawn from reserve at WESTHOF.

9. EXCHANGE OF STRETCHERS, BLANKETS, HOT WATER BOTTLES & THOMAS' SPLINTS.

Car orderlies will be instructed to secure stretchers, blankets, hot water bottles and Thomas' splints in exchange for those handed over with patients.

10. PATROLS.

Patrols for walking cases will be arranged and provided with necessary equipment.

11. CASUALTY CLEARING STATION CASES.

Cases which do not require dressing before reaching the Casualty Clearing Station will be marked with:-  
"O.K." on the bandage in one inch letters.

12. REPORTS ETC.

Regimental Medical Officers will make themselves familiar with the arrangements in their immediate rear and should be in constant touch with the Officer in Charge of the Advanced Dressing Station.

All messages sent should be in writing or if sent verbally should be confirmed in writing at the earliest opportunity.

In cases of written messages care should be taken to see that the exact time and date of despatch is indicated.

Any change in the position of the Regimental Medical Officer or Regimental Aid Post should be at once indicated.

Casualties amongst Medical Officers or demands for reinforcements will be forwarded to this Office.
