



It is considered that, if this officer accompanied the Ambulance some notification to that effect was, in courtesy, due to this office As an effort towards improving the tone and morale of Moascar Dental Hospital, Capt. Pascoe. F. T. was appointed S.D.O. 16.9.18. -Capt. Bull.R.A. going to Rest Camp, Port Said.

Results, so far, have amply justified the change,

Indeed it is now realised that a big mistake was made in not

appointing this officer to the position at an earlier date.

In this connection it is only fair to state, with regard to this officers recent"mention" that it can now be realised of what value he must have been to 1st.A.I.H.F. Ambulance.

The arrangement adopted by him of settling all professional points in weekly conferences of officers appears a most admirable one

men with experience ranging up to 15 years.


The mechanic mentioned is the son of a dentist and is perhaps appointed on some theory of heredity - perhaps.

Monshly Report for September After three weeks at Ludd, word was received on 15 mst. That we were to pack up & be reacly toshell at 10.a.m on the 17 inst to No i Dquadrow, Sust Hlying Corpt for disky during operations. Again lack of our own transport caused us loss of sime as the waggon from the Flying Corps ded not call for us Ailb 18 at noon. In the mean sime I had been trying to get into telephonic communication with the Merodione bese if they had jorgo New about us as we were sulling on our baggage waiding. However was unable to get in touch and Hem All the Wednesday morning, Possessing our own transport would save the unit quite an amound of working seme in twelve months & as a number of motor lovies have been captured from the Germans they couldn't be put to better use than present one to each brigade unit. Had the unit ready to start work on the morning of the 20th this time had a farpaulin covering on the floor. It addes immerself to the cleanliness of the Rent & from a hygiend point of view the cream colorned floor gives one the keling that asepsis is carried out in this field surgery. It present there is just a comfortable amount of work to be clone & we are taking the opportunity of having any listle jobs done for is by the skelled work men of the acrodrome. Have had a very near board made for hanging the empression hays in the surgery & during the week . ends am 1818. Hope also to get a new wooden stand
