A nominal roll of Nurses who arrived in Egypt is shown in Appendix 2. A nominal roll of the Nurses who proceeded to England in place of the above Nurses who arrived by the "Kaiser-i-hind" is shown in Appendix 3. Arrangements were made for the Nurses proceeding to England to embark on January 16th at Alexandria on a Hospital Ship, owing to an Order which forbade medical personnel to travel in Mediterranean except on a Hospital Ship. 	APRIL		Sisters, E.H. Chapman and M. Wood were promoted to rank of Head Sister with No. 14 Aus. Gen. Hosp. The appointment dated from 1st March 1917. (AIF. Orders 155 of 20/3/17) A nominal roll of the 30 Sisters ex "Kanowna" who disembarked at Suez on 1/5/17 is shown in Appendix 4. There were no Attestation Papers for the following seven :- S/Nurses:- M. Capon, R.C. Lane, H.W. Clapp, B. Grigg, H.M. Collins, M.M. Teasdale, E.C. Wildash. A cable was received from "Troopers" London stating that it was the intention of the Australian Authorities that 30 Nurses should be released from No. 14 Aus. Gen. Hospital, giving Christian names, age, date of attestation, date of embarkation, previous service, next of kin, etc. stating that the information was required for records, also requiring particulars of all Nurses who have returned to Australia.</p> <p>A letter from Commandant, A.I.F. Headquarters, showed that many Attestation Papers were missing. Of 60 Nurses that arrived by the "Kaiser-i-hind" on 10/1/17, only 39 Attestation Papers were received. 20 Nurses who embarked at Western Australia had no Attestation Papers. There were also seven attestation Papers short for the 30 Nurses who came by "Kanowna" 1/5/17.</p> <p>A receipt was held from London at A.I.F. The A.D.M.S. in replying pointed out that there were 90 Nurses in the A.A.N.S. in Egypt. 18 of these were in Imperial Hospitals and 72 at the 14th Aus. Gen. Hospital. It was pointed out that the Imperial Hospitals were being worked with a much smaller staff of Nurses and that 72 was the establishment of a 1040 bed Hospital. (It was suggested that the Matron could use some of the Nurses who were at the Hospital awaiting transport to Salonica, if she desired.</p>

A.I.F. in Egypt to Principal Matron, A.I.F. in Egypt, asking for a Seniority List of the Staff Nurses, so that promotions up to establishment for a 1040 bed Hospital could be made. The only guide to their seniority obtainable was then the attestation papers. The forms were completed from these and the information was sent to No. 14 Aus. Gen.
