




Recommendation for Promotion to King's Sergeant
of Corpl. Thomas Leslie Willman, A.A.M.C.,
10th Australian Field Ambulance.

I beg to recommend Corpl. Thomas Leslie Willman for promotion to rank of Sergeant under special Royal Warrant.

Cpl. Willman has had 18 months' service, of which, as Corporal, 11½ months have been in the field. He has done excellent service in the forward area, more especially on the occasion of the combined raid of the 37th and 38th Battalions at Houplines, on the 26th-27th Febry, when he went forward beyond the subsidiary line, ahead of the Regimental Aid Posts, and led a party of stretcher bearers collecting wounded. At Messines, 6th-13th June, he was again conspicuous for his capacity for leadership, and did very fine work in clearing wounded from the forward R.A.P. On the night of 31st July 1917, near Messines, he went, under heavy fire from the foremost Dressing Post, to Relay Post. After the attack of the 11th Aus. Infantry Brigade, Cpl. Willman was conspicuous for gallantry and coolness under fire, and set a splendid example to the 20 stretcher bearers under his charge. At 11 a.m. of 31st July 1917, he succeeded, under very heavy fire, in getting two casualties down on trucks to the car terminus. For this he was awarded the Military Medal on 17/8/1917. On 11th and 12th Octr. 1917, in front of Passchendael Ridge, E. of Ypres, Cpl. Willman, who was in charge of stretcher bearers at a Relay Post on the Zonnebeke Railway, dressed cases under fire in the open, organized squads of German prisoners to carry out wounded, and ~~maxxixk~~ himself led parties who carried wounded to ~~maxk~~ Relay Post. On 13th Octr., Cpl. Willman went forward to Berlin Wood and assisted in carrying wounded to the Aid Post at Otto House.

By his devotion to duty under most trying conditions, as to mud and rain, his gallantry and presence of mind under fire, and total disregard of personal safety, he has on this occasion and at other times set a splendid example of fortitude and endurance.

Cpl. Willman is a fine type of Australian manhood (six ft. in height), with a sterling character.

Capt. Harold Malville Maughan.

On the transfer of Captain Maughan from the 10th Australian Field Ambulance to Co. 1 A.G.H., I wish to put on record my appreciation of his services as Q.N.

Capt. Maughan has been with the 10th Field Ambulance since its inception, and was largely responsible for the preliminary organization and training. His previous military experience and extensive knowledge of routine, combined with his capacity, initiative, and resource, have been of great service to the Unit. During the operations at Armentieres, from Novr. 1916-April 1917, Capt. Maughan was responsible for the rationing of the A.M.C. on the Houplines sector. During this time, and on the night, 26th-27th Febr. 1917, of the raid of the combined 57th-58th Battn., when he was on duty at the Main Dressing Station, Capt. Maughan's services were valuable. During Messines Battle, and the operations following thereon, Capt. Maughan had entire charge of the rationing of the Regimental Aid Posts and Stretcher Bearers in the forward area. Previous to the opening of the battle, Capt. Maughan visited each of the Aid Posts in succession, having from time to time to traverse portions of Flogsteert under heavy fire. With admirable foresight, he provided an extra watercart for the Advanced Dressing Station, and supplied petrol tins for water to forward positions.

Capt. Maughan has always been solicitous for the welfare of the patients and personnel. He is a good disciplinarian, is possessed of good education, and has considerable capacity for work.

In continuation of A.D.M.S. Movement Order No. 4. (M.1/1/55)

1. The Third Australian Division (less Artillery and 2 Field Coys at CLAIRMARAIS) will relieve the 8th. Division (less Artillery) in the line between the Rivers DOUVE and LYS during the period 12th.-15th. November, 1917.
Command of the Divisional Sector will pass at 10.a.m. on the 14th. November, 1917.
2. Artillery reliefs and the move of the 9th. and 10th. Field Coys. will be notified later.
3. The Divisional Sector will be held with two Infantry Brigades in the line; one Infantry Brigade and one M.G. Coy. in Divisional Reserve.
4. Existing defence schemes etc. and distribution of troops will be taken over and adhered to until further notice.
5. The reliefs will be carried out in accordance with attached Table of Reliefs (issued to Ambulances only.)
6. During the march to the forward area, the following distances will be observed between units :-

Companies	-	100 yards.
Battalions	-	500 yards.
Unit & Transport	-	100 yards.

 If traffic is heavy in the opposite direction, Infantry will march in file.
East of the line NIEPPE-ROMARIN, local precautions will be ascertained by Commanders and put into practice as required.
7. A.D.M.S. Office will open at STERNWERCK at 10.a.m. 14.11.17.
8. The 9th. Australian Field Ambulance will relieve the 25th. Field Ambulance at PONT d'ACHELLES (B. 8. b. 2. 5.)
All "Gas" cases will be treated at this Station.
Relief to be completed before noon on 12.11.17.
9. The 10th. Australian Field Ambulance will relieve a Field Ambulance at WESTHOFF (T. 19. b. 4. 5.)
Relief to be completed before noon on 14.11.17.
10. The 11th. Australian Field Ambulance will relieve the 26th. Field Ambulance at B. 16. c. 8. 8. and Advanced Posts at :-

BREWERY	-	C. 1. d. 4. 5.
UNDERHILL FARM	-	T. 18. d. 5. 3.

 Relief to be completed before noon on 15.11.17.

11. All details regarding reliefs to be arranged between Officers Commanding concerned.
12. The 11th. Australian Field Ambulance will arrange for clearing the whole of the Divisional Front. The cases will be brought by Ambulance Cars of that Unit to the Main Dressing Station PONT d'ACHELLES (B.8.b.2.5.), where all records will be kept. The only records kept at the Advanced Dressing Stations will be as follows :-
 - (a) Cases dressed, given "A.T.S." and returned to duty. For these, full particulars, stating whether Battle Casualty, will be taken and despatched to O.C., M.D.S. They will be shown as "Wounded and at Duty".
 - (b) Full particulars will be forwarded to O.C. M.D.S. of all cases of all Deaths at the A.D.S., for inclusion in his Returns.
13. All cases for evacuation will be sent on alternate days to No.2.A. C. C. S. and No.53. C. C. S.(B.1.F.)
14. Duplicate receipts for stores and equipment taken over will be forwarded to this Office.
15. Completion of Moves will be notified to this Office.


