

Appendix I" APPENDIX REPORT ON THE WORKING OF THE QUARTERMASTER'S BRANCH for Month of SEPTEMBER 1918. From Q.M., 10th AUS T. FIELD AMB. To C.O., 10th AUST. FINLD AMB.

Herewith report on the working of the Quartermaster's Branch for the month of September 1918.

RATIONS. The supply of Rations during the month through the A.S.C. was regular and punctual at all times, and the quantity and quality was found to be of the usual excellent standard. A total of 7,116 rations was drawn, and the daily percentage was as follows:- Personnel 180.18, Patients 30.33, Attached 26.7. In addition components of the following rations were at different times not drawn - Biscuits, Oatmeal, Candles, Preserved meat, Rice, Chease.

MEDICAL COMFORTS. Supplies necessary for the extensive operations carried out during the month were drawn from Depots at Amiens and Corbie, and these were used to stock M.D.S. to supply A.D.S. and R.M.Os, as required. Comforts as indented for were invariably obtained, and played an important part in providing comfort for patients and personnel.

RED CROSS. One issue of goods from this source was received ix during the month, and the great variety and excellent quality of same was, as usual, of great assistance in the work necessitated by the advance of our troops.

COMFORTS FUND. The monthly issue From the Australian Comforts' Fund comprised the following: - Cocoa & Milk, Condensed Milk, Preserved Fruits, Biscuits, Jam, Sugar, Sweets. These were received whilst the Unit was out resting, consequently the best possible use was made of them, and all the men benefitted considerably thereby.

SALVAGE: When convenient, quantities of salvage were returned through the A.S.C., but owing to continual movement from place to place it was impossible to return same regularly. Whilst the Unit was at Mont St. Quentin a large quantity of salvage was collected in and around the billets taken over, and this was despatched to the Dump.

CLOTHING: A large issue of clothing was received from D.A.D.O.S. during the month, and whilst the Unit was in rest at Mont St. Quentin all members of the Unit who were in need of same were, as far as possible, fitted out. A further supply to complete has been indented for, and is expected early in the coming month.

Q.M. 10th AUST. FIELD AMBULANCE.

REPORT ON THE WORKING OF THE AMBULANCE MOTOR TRAWSPORT for the month of SEPTEMBER 1918.

During the time in which the Ambulance was stationed at CURLU, following up the procedure of last month, the Cars worked forward, Talbot Cars working as far as HEM Chalk Pits, and the Fords going further forward to Loading Post. During the storming of MONT St. QUENTIN the work of the cars was very arduous,

but was got through without any serious mishap either to cars or personnel.

On the 5th the Unit moved on to HERBECOURT, taking over an M.D.S., and all available cars were then attached to the 11th Australian Field Ambulance stationed HALLE, and working the A.D.S. and forward posts, on 24 hour stretches, and clearing to

On the 6th the 9th Australian Field Ambulance took over the Ambulance Site at HALLE as an M.D.S., and the 11th moved forward to BUIRE, the 10th being under orders to take up their location in BOIS de BUIRE.

On the 7th the orders for the 10th Field Ambulance

being cancelled, they rested in BOIS de BREQUET.

On the 19th the Division being relieved, the Ambulance moved to MONT ST.QUENTIN, and on the 11th all cars were returned

to their respective Units.

A Brigade Hospital for sick and wounded was formed here, the cars collecting sick during the morning from Brigade, and in the afternoon clearing to C.C.Ss. (Nos. 5 and 47 at PROYART XXXX Nos. 12, 53, and 55 one kilometre from PERONNE, and special cases being evacuated to No.47 Stationary Hospital at DURY.

On the 22nd orders were received to clear special cases

to No.37 C.C.S., MERICOURT,

On 28th on Ambulance moving the cars moved forward to ROWSS OY, via BUSSU and LOWGAVESNES, to join the 11th Australian Field Ambulance, who were running the forward area. Later, orders were received by which A.D.S. was formed at ST. EMILIE, and the carsjoined up there. From this Station they worked forward to ROWSSOY and BASSER BOULDGWE loading posts.


On the 30 th the cars moved further forward to BONY, an A.D.S. was formed at BASSE BOULOGNE clearing to M.D.S. at ST. EMILIE.


Cars ran well right through the month, water only minor troubles, no serious breakdowns taking place, the cars only requiring the usual fortnightly overhaul at Workshops.


The mileage vovered by the cars equalled 6,578 miles on a petrol consumption of 698 gallons.



Reference 3rd. Aust. Divn. Warning Order, C.H. J. 26. of 4-9-1918. -

- 1. The 11th. Aust. Field Ambulance will operate with the 11th. Brigade Group, under the orders of G.O.C. 11th. Aust. Infantry Brigade.
- 2. The C.O., 11th. Aust. Field Ambulance will establish an A.D.S. at a site to be selected by him and will keep the A.D.M.S. informed of its location. He will be responsible for the clearance of all cases from the Brigade to A.D.S. Cases will be cleared from the A.D.S. by arrangements made by A.D.M. 3.
- 3. In the event of an advance by the Brigade the C.O. 11th. Aust. Field Ambulance will send one Tent Sub-divn. forward to open a new A.D.S. notifying its position to A.D.M.S. who will arrange to relieve the Tent Sub-divisions at the old A.D.S. which will become the M. D. S. The Tent Sub-divisions so relieved will rejoin their Unit at once.
- 4. The fullest information will be sent to A.D.M.S. by all possible means of numbers of casualties, numbers of lying and walking cases to be evacuated, and change of locations of Stations.
- 5. One Talbot Field Ambulance Car and all Ford cars from 9th. and 10th Field Ambulances, two Horse Ambulances and all wheeled stretchers from each Field Ambulance will be sent at once to C.O. 11th. Aust. Field Ambulance and will remain at his disposal.
- 6. C.O. 9th. Aust. Field Ambulance will send 150 stretchers and 250 blankets to C.O. 11th. Aust. Field Ambulance at once. The closest check must be kept on stretchers and blankets in Forward Area.
- 7. Resuscitation Team will report to C.O. loth. Aust. Field Ambulance with equipment, at 9 a.m. 5-9-1918.
- 8. C.O. loth. Aust. Field Ambulance will immediately prepare to open a M.D.S. and W.W.D.S. at short notice.
- 9. Field Ambulances acknowledge.

Reference "G" 3rd. Aust. Division BATTLE INSTRUCTION, Series "D", No. 2 of even date. -

INFORMATION .- The enemy is reported as retaring on the front of the First and Third Armies and portion of the French Front Bast of MOYON he also appears to be retiring on the front of the Third Corps.

INTENTION. - (a). In the event of the enemy retiring on the front of the Australian Corps, instructions have been received to press his retreat with string advance guards, (b). All troops will be in readiness to move at four (4)

hours' notice.

METHOD OF ADVANCE .- (a). The advance will be made by a series of bounds - during the advance, all artillery will be precented by a protective body of Infantry.

(b). The Australian Corps will advance on a front of three Divisions - 32nd. Division on the right, 5th. Australian Division in the centre and 3rd. Australian Division on the left.
