

FIFTH AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ARTILLERY INSTRUCTION No. 18.

Headquarters, 10th. October, 1917.

1. The following is an outline of the probable course of events subsequent to the 10th. inst. (a) The 4th. Australian Division will relieve the 2nd. Australian Division in the Left Sector on night 10th. /11th. October, 1917. (b) The 23rd. Division will relieve the 7th. Division on the night 10th./11th. October, 1917.

2. (a) On or about "A" Day, the 1st. ANZAC Corps in co-operation with

other Corps will continue its operations.

(b) The task of the 1st. ANZAC Corps will be to provide protection to the right flank of the 2nd. ANZAC Corps by securing a position astride the DROODENBROODHOEK SPUR.

(c) This operation is to be effected by the 4th. Australian Division. (d) The role of the 5th. Australian Division will be defensive for the present.

- 3. If it becomes necessary a schame for operations "contingent" on those to be effected by the 4th. Australian Division will be issued separately.
- 4. Having got possession of the BROODSEINDE RIDGE from which the enemy's lines can be over-looked, whilst observation is denied to him- it is of the utmost importance that we should make use of this advantage. Every effort must be made to establish communicati ion with forward O. P's and no chance neglected of shooting at targets presented by the enemy with direct observation. Information of enemy movement must at once be transmitted to 5th. Aust.D. A. H. Q. in order that the information may be transmitted to the Heavy Artillery to deal with.

- 1. The 8th. Australian Infantry Brigade relieved the 3rd. Australian Infantry Brigade on the night 9th/10th. October, 1917.
- 2. Dispositions of the 8th. Australian Infantry Brigade are as follows:-

2 Battalions in the FRONT LINE.

4. Liaison duties from 6 p.m. 10th. October, 1917 will be found as follows:-

With Infantry Brigade Headquarters, one Officer not below the rank of Captain, to be found alternately by "A" and "B" Groups, commencing with "A" Group. This Liaison Officer will be relieved every 48 hours.

"A" and "B" Groups will also send a Liaison Officer to the Battalion Headquarters which they cover. Reliefs to be arranged

by Group Commanders.

The names of all Liaison Officers are to be sent to this office. The Liaison Officer with Infantry Brigade Headquarters is to be in direct telephonic communication with both "A" and "B" Groups.

FIFTH AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ARTIGLERY INTELLIGENCE BUMLARY.

Headquarters, 10th October, 1917.

VISIBILITY. Fair.

DUR ARTHLERY CELTIC WOOD was kept under intermittent bursts of heavy fire and the trench systems of its eastern end

bombarded. At the request of the Infantry, a T.M. firing from ANVIL WOOD was engaged, and the whole area searched. An enemy concentration in E, 25, b, 6m3m was engaged at 9.22 a.m. and dispersed. At 11.12 a.m. a battery was turned on to the hillslope at. D. 29. b. 85.15, to check hostile machine gun fire. Four companies of enemy were reported moving in E. 19.d. at 12.33 p.m. and the area swept. An S. O. S. was answered at 5.37 p.m. and firing continued until 6.20 p.m. Standing barrages, with silent were put down between 9.15 p.m. and 9.47 p.m. according to programme. The eastern of BROODSEINDE RIDGE were searched continuously during the night and all communications& points of enemy activity kept under fire.

HOSTILE ARTILLERY. This was below normal during both day and night.

About 20 rounds 5.9's were fired at roads in J.7. at 9 a.m. At 4.15 p.m. a concentration of 77 mm and 4.2" H.E. was placed across J.8.a and c, about 200 rounds being counted. These came chiefly from direction of TERHAND. Some 8" from same direction were falling in D.29.d. during the morning.



- 1. The 4th. Phase of the operations having been completed, the Becend Army will, after due preparation, continue its operations, the Fifth Army comperating simultaneously on the left flank.
- PASCHENDABLE and this is to be effected by the 2nd. ANZAO Corps, which is on our left, the 3rd. Australian Divisionbeing on the right of the 2nd. ANZAC Corps.
 - The task of the 1st. ANZAC Corps will be to provide protection to the right flank of the 2nd. ANZAC Corps by gaining ground in this direction and securing the position astride the DROOGENBROCDHOEK SPUR.
 - 4. The operation will be effected by the 4th. Australian Division and will have as its objective the lineRFINE-ASSYRIA-E. 7.a. 15.20. (The Blue Libs.) The 5th. Australian Division on the right will be on the defensive.
 - 5. The advance will be made in two stages The First Stage the RED LINE running from RHINE to ASSYRIA; the BLUE LINE, as above, being the second stage.
 - 6. Maps are being issued shewing the exact positions of these lines and the Interedivision Boundary.
 - 7. It is anticipated the attack will take place on or about "A" Day.
 - 8. The attack is being made by one Division in the line, the Field Artillary allotted to it being the 1st, 2nd, and 4th. Australian Divisional Attilleries under the command of Brig-General W.L.H.

FIFTH AUSTRALIAN DIVISIONAL ARTILLERY INTELLIGENCE SUMMARY.

From 6 a.m., 10/10/17 to 6 a.m., 11/10/17.

Headquarters, 11th. October 1917.

VISIBILITY.

Poor during the morning, good later.

OUR ARTITURY.

Bombardment Barrages were carried out according to programme at 5.0 p.m. and 5.0 a.m. and were reported satisfactory.

CELTIC and AUVIL WOODS were whept under fire and trenches and communications continuously searched.

Some registration of forward batteries was carried

out during the afternoon.

During the night intermittent bursts of fire were put on roads in D.30.b, and known centres of activity were bombarded at irregular intervals.

MOSTILE ARTILLERY. Enemy artillery was generally subnormal. At 11.30 a.m. J.C.a. and b. were kept under fire from two batteries of 4.2 How. from approximately K.20. Our supports in D.29.c. were shelled at 11.45 a.m. from the direction of MOORSLEDE, probably 4.2- calibre not accurately known., J.7.Central by 4.2 from TERHAND at 10 p.m. Our batteries in J.3.c. were searched with 4.2 and 77 mm. from an easterly direction between 12 noon and 1.30 p.m.

At 2.0 p.m. a weak barrage of H.E. and Shrapnel, all calibres, was placed along the western slope of BROODSEINDE RIDGE, lasting about 10 minutes. This firs appeared to be chiefly from OOSTHOEK and due east.

WESTHORK RIDGE shalled intermittently with 5.9, and tracks searched about 2.30 p.m., but enemy's shooting . was inaccurate.

During the night hostile fire still below normal till 9 p.m., then about normal till 2.0 a.m., comprising 5.9, on J.8.c. and d., and a 4.2 gun fire on J.8.a. from direction WATERDAMHOLK. Quiet later.

GENERAL.

Enemy had balloons up high during the morning, but visibility was bad.

Aeroplanes generally inactive until the afternoon Some bombing on forward area at night.



VISIBILITY. Good.

OUR ARTILLERY. Fired in support of Infantry attack on left flank at 5.20 a.m., engaged targets by dimect observation, and continued harassing fire on communications and points of known enemy activity. At 10.30 a.m., a battery of 422" or 5.9" Howitzer firing north from between K.1.a.1.1. and K.1.c.2.8. was observed and silenoed by our fire. . At 10.55 a.m., parties of infantry were reported between D. 30.c. 50.30 and D. 30.d. 10.60 and dispersed, and again at 11.5 a.m., small parties in the road between D.29.b.70.00 to D.30.a.00.10 were fired on by direct observation and scattered. This road appears to be much used. Infantry round the mound at D. 29. b. 10. 30 were engaged at the same time. At 1.50 p.m. F.O.O. reported guns firing from wood at K.1.d.90.85 - These were engaged and an ammunition dump set on fire, which burned for an hour. The 8th. Infantry Brigade reported Infantry parties in D. 30. c. between 6 and 7 p.m. and these were engaged, also reported massing of enemy in D. 29.d.6.6. These points were swept with bursts of fire day and night. TABLE WOOD, ANVIL WOOD, CELTIC WOOD, and roads and communioations were searched at irregular periods all hight.

EOSTILE ARTHLERY. This was very active during both day and night, mainly oblique and enfilade from direction of ZANVOORDE and OOSTHOEK, two batteries of 4.2" Howitzers from the latter direction firing on to our battery positions in J.8 b.and c. J.3.c. was under fire from a 4.2" How. from 960 GRID Bearing from J.5.c.5.5., but Counter Battery located and stopped it at 8.50 a.m.

ZANVOORDE Group enfiladed reverse slope of BROODSEINDE RIDGE all day.

A 5.9" How. from direction of OOSTHOEK fired into the valley at J.8.a. during the afternoon.

WESTHOEK RIDGE intermittentdy shelled with 5.9" and 4.2"

Hows.- direction850 T.B. from J.7.8.75.30.

J.5.a. and c by 4.2" How from direction of KEIBURGHOTEN intermittently.

GENERAL.

Good use was made of the view of both hostile guns and enemy movement as seen from the O.P. at D.29.0.6.5.

Various targets were found for heavy guns. At 11.30 a.m. they were turned on to the enemy marching in column of fours. in E.21.d.90.10. A large fire observed in WATER-DAMFORK about noon.

QUR ARTITLERY. All roads, tracks and centres of activity were continuously searched with bursts of fire, special attention being paid by Right Artillery Group to CELTIC and JUSTICE WOODS, road from D.30.d.15.55 to junction at D.25.c.95.80, road junction at D.50.d.15.55, and the area from D.30ec.2.5 to D.30.c.25.25 to H.30.c.8.8.

The Left Artillery Group, were mainly engaged with ANVIL and DAME WOODS, and the suspected emplacements and shelters there, REFECT COPSE, EDGE HOUSE and the tracks in D.30.a.

Three hostile batteries in action, reported by F.0.0. from BROODSEINDERINGE were engaged at 1 p.m. in K.a., and at 6 p.m. in D.24 c.20.05 and D.30.a.50.70.

OUR ARTILITIEY.

Continuous harassing programmes were carried out by both Groups during the last 24 hours, searching fire being directed on roads, tracks, and centess of activity. Tracks D.29.b.68.05 to D.50.d.00.15, D.29.b.70.30 to D.50.a.00.30, road J.6.b.3,9 to D.30.d.2.3., and road junction at E.25.d.0.8. received particular attention. Areas CELTIC, DAME, AMVIL, EFFECT and JUSTICE WOODS were swept with fire at irregular periods. Bombardments were carried out on shelters at D.30.a.68.80, D.30.b.45.72, D.24.d.05.00, J.6.b.6.9., D.30.d.4.0. and E.25.a.40.25.

Suspected Dump at D.30.a.5.9. was under bursts of fire during the night and bombarded during the day. Dug-outs in D.24.c.88.03, DAME HOUSE, and EIGHT HOUSE were also engaged.

HOSTILE ARTILLENY. Was very active during the day and night in Battery areas, normal elsewhere during the dayl active on front and support systems during the night. J. 8.c and d and J. 3.c. were systematically engaged by 5.9 " How, Batteries firing from T.B. 950 from J.8.b.6.6, and 950 from J.8.0.7.9. A 4.2" Gun was active at 920 T. B. from J. 8.a. 4.5. The HERIH ROAD in the vicinity of HOOGH was shelled between 10a.m. and 12 noon with 5.9 and 8" Howitzers, and intermittent fire wwas maintained on that road as far as HELLFIRE CORNER during the afternoon. WESTHOEK RIDGE was fairly shelled with 5.9's from an easterly direction during the morning. Tracks were not much worried. A heavy hostile gas shell bombardment over the valley between WESTHOEK and AHZAC RIDGES was carried between 12.30 and 1.30 a.m. which continued less heavily till 4.45 a.m. A mixture of H.E. and Mustard Gas Shell was used, and Lethal Gas was also reported. At 9 p.m. roads from J.7.d.90.10 to CHATEAU WOOD were under fire from 4.2's and 5.9" Howitzers from direction of K. 15.

GENERAL.

Hostile aircraft very active during day and night, flying low over front and support lines, and over. Bettery positions, photographing and registering enemy shoots. Bombing over forward and back areas during the night. Enemy aeroplane turned Machine Gun on to several parties in J.3. and J.8. during the afternoon.

OUR ARTILLERY. Worked according to Bombardment and harassing programmes during the morning; but lifted back east of GRID Line D J: E K at 1 p.m. on account of our Infantry patrols.

Roads and tracks were searched intermittently throughout the period, to a distance of 2000 yards behind the S.O.S. Line.

An S.O.S. was answered from 6.4. to 6.24 p.m.

Dug-outs on the road by DAME HOUSE were kept under irregular bursts of fire.

HOSTILE ARTILLERY. Between 6 and 11.30 a.m. battery positions in J.3.c were intermittently bombarded by 5.9's and 4.2" Hows. from direction of MOORSLEDE. An 8" How. firing from 850 T.B. from J.8.c.4.8. during the morning put one of our guns out of action. At 10.30 a.m. 5.9 Hows. concentrated on J.8.c. and d and the valley, firing from K. 15, three 'planes overhead evidently directing the shoot. WESTHOEK and BELLEVAARDE RIDGE were shelled intermittently by 5.9" from direction of K.4. YPRES was under fire during the day by 4.2" H. V. Gun firing from south-east periods during the night; from 8 p.m. -9.40 p.m. J.J.c., J.Z.d., and J.S.b., c and d, were shedled with mustard gas by 77 mm guns on a bearing of 600 Grid from J.5.6.3.5, and 900 Grid from J.8.d.18.40. A 5.9 How was also firing from the latter bearing. Between 5.50 and 4.30 p.m. the enemy were again very active with gas shell, mainly from direction TERHAND and ZANVOORDE. Some casualties occurred.

GENERAL.

Hostile aeroplanes were still very active bombing batteries in J.8. during the morning, and again between 7 and 10 p.m.

At 10.50 a.m. enemy balloons were up at Grid Bearings of 720, 820, 890, 1100, 1120, 1130, 1380, and 1680 from J.3.0.5.5.

VISIBILITY.

Good.

OUR ARTILLERY.

Advantage was taken of the good visibility to check all registrations. No definite bombardments were carried out, but during the day centres of activity were kept under irregular bursts, and during the night a complete _rogramme of searching fire was executed on all tracks and communications between 1000 and 3000 yards to east of S.O.S.Line, During the afternoon from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m. and from 5 p.m. to 6 p.m., a concentration was put down on area E. 25.a.90.67. - E. 20.c. 05.05.-E. 25.c. 90.32. At 4 p.m. our Liaison reported a 4.2" How firing on Right Battalion supports, and F.O.O picked up the flushes in E. 9.c. This was reported to the Corps Heavies, who engaged the target, an ammunition dump in the vicinity of the guns being blown up. This was observed.

HOSTILE ARTIBLERY.

This was below normal during the day and night. During the morning, J.J.c. was intermittently shelled by 4.2" gun from direction of E. 2. Central, and J. 8.b., o, and d, and J.2.c.by 5.9" Hows. from T.B. 910 from J.8.b. 60.80. At 4 p.m. a 4.2" How. bombarded the right of our support line - bearing 670 30' T.B. from J. 4. b. 75.50. The night was quiet except on front line and supports which were shelled from the east by 77 mm guns, 4.2" &5.9" Hows. during the early orning. An occasional salvo from 5.9 battery -direction WATERDALHOEK - fell in J.8. during the night and between 3 - 10 p.m. WESTHOEK RIDGE was lightly shelled by 5.9" How from direction TERHAND. A 4.2" Gun was firing into YPRES from the south-east between 12 noon and 3 p.m. Hostile fire is tending to become more frontal than previously.

GENERAL.

Hostile Aircraft were active, flying over our front system, battery positions, and at a greater height over back areas during the morning and afternoon, dropping bombs on I.17.c. at 11.30 a.m. and in the afternoon turning their Machine Guns on to working parties in the forward area.

Bad, dull and foggy. VICIBILITY.

OUR ARTILLERY. Customary searching of areas occupied by the эпету were carried outand tracks and communications wept by bursts of fire during the night! The PACCOHENDALE TERHAND Line in E. 20.c, E, 26.a and c was subjected to a heavy bombardment, both : for Trench destruction and wire cutting; new work at D.30.b.50.40 and . from D.30.c.90.85. to D.30.d.45.90 was swept with fire intermittently during the night, and occupied shell-hole system from E.25.a.6.4. to E.25.b.3.9. also received attention at irregular periods. The road running north and south in D.30.b, new work between J,6.a.35.70. and J,6.a.05.70 and woods and copses were also kept under spasmodic ". rtes bursts of fire.

HOSTILE ARTILLERY. This was exceptionally active during the entire day, and the early part of the night until 9.30 p.m. At 10.30 a.m. an Area shoot commenced on J.2 and J.3, chiefly 5.9's and 4.2" Hows. from the direction of WATERDAMHOEK; at 10.40 a.m. a 4.2" How from OOC THOEK opened fire on the same area and at 11.25 batteries of 5.9's and 4.2" Hows. on T.B. 880 from J.8.8.47.48. oponed fire on J.8.a. At 11.15 a.m. this area shoot switched to J.8, swinging back to J.3 at 12.59 p.m., lifted to J.8. at 1.15 p.m, and at 1.30 p.m. came down over the whole forward area. At 2.50 p.m a heavy concentration was put down over J.2, J,7 and 8 and less heavily as far back asHOOGE. At 3.40 p.m it spread forward as well including the front line and supports and back as far as I.18.a and b, all calibres, and all directions between 600 and 1100 T.B. At 4.40 an 8" How. 700 T.B. from J, 8.c.4.4. joined in but was silenced by C.B. at 5.10 p.m. This slackened off at 6.25 p.m. but intermittent bursts of fire were maintained on J,8 and d. . until 9.30 p.m. Quiet on our front during the remainder of the night.

GENERAL.

Hostile aircraft still active particularly during the afternoon. Between 2.30 and 5 p.m. they were flying low over 'orward area, machine-gunning many Inafantry parties Come bombs were dropped about J.3. Central and J.8.c, apparently seeking batteries and roads.
