

Reference your AUS./B.137219 dated 28-4-18.

Para 1. You state no Part II Orders were issued on 16/4/18 for 2nd and 4th M.T. Companies, but you issued Part II Orders for 4th Aust. Div. Supply Column, which states......"ceases to be attached from Corps Reinforcement Depot on marching out to 4th Aust. Div. M.T.Coy"...... As you state "...ceases to be attached from Corps Reinforcement Depot..." I took it you meant them to be put on the strength of 4th M.T.Company, but in the light of your present letter, presumably you meant "....ceases to be attached to 4th A.D.S.C. and attached to 4th Aust.M.T.Company". The numbers referred to are 147 to 160 inclusive and again on 5th A.D.S.C Part II Orders 103 to 109 inclusive.

This, probably, is a misunderstanding, owing to the wording.
Your Para 2. I stated in my last letter, I did not mind which
Unit they were sent to, either the Corps Troops M.T. Company or
Corps Reinforcement Depot, but if they are sent to Corps Troops M.T.

Company there is a considerable saving of transport.

Your Para.3, I do not understand. The reinforcements certainly were not sent from Base to Corps Troops M.T.Company, but from Reinforcement Depot to Corps Troops M.T.Coy - a totally different thing. You had already sent men to the Reinforcement Depot, or you could not

have ordered them from there to Corps Troops M.T. Company.

Will you please state what instructions I have refused to comply with. If you refer to the sending of men from the Reinforcement Depot to various Units, this, in the first place, was not an instruction to me but to the O.C., Reinforcement Depot. He could not comply, because there were no men there at the time and the vacancies had already been filled, besides which, you instructed 3 Sergeants to be sent to Corps Troops M.T.Company from Reinforcement Depot, but no Sergeants had been sent up.

Your Para.5. I have done everything I could to work in with your Office and to save trouble. I wrote each time, asking that certain men might be posted to certain Units, and had that been complied with and men only posted to Units on receipt of my request,

there would have been no confusion.

Your Para.6. Re-classifications must go on all the time, as men do learn to drive, etc., or improve themselves, while here, and if they qualify, they have a right to be re-classified. (if)

With regard to first posting. As I stated before,/I understand what system is to pertain, I am satisfied, because if the posting

does not suit, the man will be transferred.

Your Para.7. I quite realize that the M.T. is not the only Service that requires special consideration. I also know that in England, the Australian M.T. reinforcements have no chance of training in their special work at all, and I also know that the classification of men at the Base in France is not to be relied upon. I therefore have to test and re-classify here.

Your Para. 8. I enclose a Weekly Summary of Personnel which will

show how the Units stand to-day.

There are a total of 72 men surplus, but, of these, 29 are detached with Caterpillar Park in training and will be transferred to 1st and 2nd S.B.A.C's as soon as instructions are received from G.H.Q. for the Australian personnel to take over from British. This would have been done before now, but for the strenuous operations where these Units are. This makes a Hale of 45 Curplus men, not muluding 8 Catalogy.

Your Para.9. There was never any difficulty until the 50 men were sent to Reinforcement Depot on 11/2/18, followed by the 37 on 23/2/18 and following lots. Up to that time, there had been no friction at all as far as I know and I certainly have always given your Office every assistance in my power.

Your Para.10. As I have already stated and as you no doubt know, there is no Australian organization, either in England or France

for training and testing M.T. personnel.

Your Para. 11 is noted. I am sending copies to D.A.G., A.I.F.

D.M.T.S. A.I.F. Australian Corps.

I am directed to reply to your B/32 of 24/4/18

as follows:-

- 1. No Part II Orders were issued on 16/4/18 for the 2nd and 4th M.T. Companies; if any of the reinforcements specified in your B/32 of 29/3/18 for 1st and 2nd Australian Siege Battery Ammunition Columns were put on the strength of the above Companies, it was done as being shewn by Units on B.213 probably under your approval, and not under the direction of this Office. Could you please give the names of the "several men" mentioned and quote the authority for their transfer?
- 2. As already stated, there is no objection to reinforcements being sent to the Aust. Corps Troops M.T. Company for you to distribute to Units within the Corps according to their then needs. What do you desire in addition to this?
- 3. The system of allotting reinforcements to the Aust. Corps Troops M.T. Company for distribution to other Units by S.M.T.O. was practically continued by this Office (with interruptions owing to reorganisations of M.T. Units) until receipt of your telegram A.72 of 7/4/18 demanding an explanation for its continuance. You had either overlooked this arrangement or were working on some other system for which approval had not been conveyed to this Office. In addition, you would not reply to instructions sent from this Office and forwarded to you through the O.C., Corps Reinforcement Depot.
- 4. Is it necessary to explain that it was very well known to this Office that the M.T. Reinforcements were not actually in the Reinforcements Camp but were attached to Units?
- 5. Our instructions to the Reinforcement Camp were that all M.T. reinforcements should be placed at your disposal but that permanent postings should be done under authority from this Office. This was in accordance with the Adjutant General's instructions and practically gave you full control over allotments, had you desired to work in with this Office in the matter.
- 6. As reinforcements were posted by this Office by numbers and not by individual names, it is thought that you would have little difficulty in making any adjustments required for your purposes. In any case whatever system you may evolve will hardly give this Office or Units any more work than you are giving at present by your system of reclassifications, etc., and consequent inter-unit transfers, and to suggest that this Office is responsible for the transfers effected by you, is not quite fair.
- 7. The approved system of reinforcing particularly and specially provides for the tradesmen, etc., of M.T. Units. You will readily agree that the M.T. Service is not the only Arm which requires special consideration, and that whilst the specialists of these Arms must be assisted in every way, regard must be had to every point of view of the system.
- The matter of Australian M.T. Units carrying a large number of surplus personnel is one which must be considered by the Authorities concerned, and approval or otherwise for this system definitely given. Would you, therefore, kindly forward a statement shewing figures of personnel by trades held surplus to establishment for comparison with the figures available in this Office.

- 9. It is thought you will admit that this Office has at all times rendered the utmost assistance, and used all available machinery at its disposal, in the allotment of M.T. reinforcements to Units as desired by you. Have you any definite instances where the allowment of individuals as arranged by you has been interfered with by this Office?
- 10. Your statements that organisations existing in England and in France are not capable of doing the work of testing &c., and that such work can be done buxxxxx efficiently by you only, is noted, but it is remarked that it does not appear to be the best and most economical system for Units in the Field to be burdened with the whole of the above duties so long as the organisations for carrying them out are in existence, and it would appear that Units in the Field are thereby being burdened wath more clerical and other work than they should be called upon to perform.
- I am to add that this matter has again been submitted to the Adjutant General by the D.A.G.





Re M.T. Drivers.

1. With reference to our previous correspondence on the abovementioned subject, it has been decided as desired by you, to investigate
in this office the claims of all men to the appointment of M.T. Driver.

2. Procedure. Careful investigation has been made of the cases on hand and the following arrangement is considered the most satisfactory way of dealing with the question.

particulars available to be inserted on a case sheet, including reports fr from Attestation Paper, Army Form B. 103, Pay Ledger Card, Old Paybook and correspondence files. If sufficient information is then available decision will be made as to rank to which entitled and date.

forward copy of the Case Sheet together with ruling, to your Office for endor sement on A.F. B.103 and publication in Part II Orders, B.E.F.

appear that in several cases the date taken on strength of A.A.S.C. M.T. has already been fixed by your Office and also in some cases the date of appointment to M.T. Driver has already been published by you.

The case Sheets being forwarded to you will enable you to make any necessary adjustments to prior Orders issued. It is asked that after publication in Part II Orders particulars of the entry as published and D.O. number be forwarded to this Office.

On receipt of such D.O. Number the Chief Paymaster will be advised by this Office of particulars of the ruling and will then amend his Pay Ledger cards and forward notification to Unit in the Field to have necessary amendment made in Soldier's pay book. For Soldiers at present in U.K., ruling will of course be entered on A.F. B. 103 and published in Daily Orders in this Office and Chief Paymaster immediately advised of particulars.

When publishing in Part II Orders particulars of the ruling, it is suggested that a paragraph be inserted stating that entries referring to Soldier subsequent to date of appointment to M.T. Driver are amended accordingly. This course would obviate a considerable number of corrigenda entries.

3. Policy.

A. A.M.T.S. This Unit was established in Egypt on 1st. October 1915, with the object of bringing under one central control all motor ambulances and other services connected therewith.

The personnel of this Unit was made up of -

(a) Drivers of Reinforcements of 300th and 301st Motor Transport (8th and 9th A.A.S.C.)

(b) Cleaners of above.

(c) Drivers of Motor Ambulances attached to the various Australian Hospitals and Light Horse Field Ambulances and

(d) Privates from Infantry and other Regiments.

Upon joining the new Unit the paybooks of the men concerned shewed varied rates of pay. Those when in

(a) shewed 8/- per day (b) and (d) 6/- per day. (c) 6/- and 8/- per day.

In most cases certificates are available from the O.C., A.M.T.S., shewing the dates these men were appointed as Motor Drivers.

B. A.M.C. MOTOR DRIVERS.

(1) Motor Ambulance Drivers who left with Australian General Hospitals, or with reinforcements for those Units

Motor Drivers of Ambulances left Australia as Motor Drivers at the r rate of 8/- per day in the case of those embarked by all States except Victoria and New South Wales where pay was only allowed at the rate of & 6/- per day and the men embarkedas Privates although in charge of Motor Ambulances. These men in the great majority of cases were attached to the Australian General Hospitals in Egypt driving Motor Ambulances, and on the formation of the A.M.T.S. on 1/10/15 were transferred to that Unit. On satisfactory evidence being produced these men have been rated as Drivers(M.T.) at 8/- per day as from embarkation.

(2) REINFERENCE TEXX Motor Drivers of Field Aumblances AXXXXX

In certain cases Motor Drivers were sent forward with Field Ambulances UNITS with rate of pay as laid down for A.M.C. Motor Drivers in paraB. (1). These men also have been rated as M.T.Drivers as from embarkation on satisfactory evidence being available. Cases have occoured of Horse Drivers Or Privates transferring to motor ambulance work after disembarkation and in such cases the men have graded as M.T. Drivers as from date of such appointmen

(3)A.S.C. Reinforcements.

Many Drivers have embarked from Australia as M.T. Drivers with rate of 8/- per day as reinforcements for the A.A.S.C. (M.T.), in those days the 8th and 9th A.A.S.C. Others however, although motor driving in camp in Australia embarked as Privates and Cleaners wi with pay of 6/- per day, and would appear to have been imformed that they would be entitled to the 8/- per day as soon as they joined their Units. In a number of these cases dealt with so far the men concerned on arrival in Egypt were attached to the Base M.T. Depot, Mustapha, where they performed general duties, but did not perform the duties of M.T. Drivers . they were later drafted to France and after a short period at the B.M.T.D Rouen, were drafted to the 1st and 4th A.A.S.P. and were then graded as M.T. Drivers. In any cases submitted in of this nature it has been ruled that the men are only entitled to the appointment and pay of M.T. Driver as from date appointed M.T. Driver in the 1st and 4th A.A.S.P.

Other reinforcements to the 8th and 9th A.A.S.C. om arrival in Egypt joined the A.M.T.S. and were appointed Motor Drivers in that Unit. In such cases the men have been graded as M.T.Drivers as from the date of appointment to Drivers in that Unit.

In cases considered necessary soldiers have been asked to produce certificates of duties performed in order to assist inm a decision being arrived at.

Many cases have now been dealt with on the lines set out above (vide specimen copies attached) and as soon as your concurrence is received to the method of procedure proposed in para 2. the Case Sheets of the men B.E.F. will be forwarded you for necessary action.


