ARREELE	Sep 21 1918		<p>Nothing of special interest to report. The work during this period was not as heavy as usual. The number of lorries for C.E. and road's being somewhat less than the additional facilities afforded the Coys by light Railway. A large amount of business that has been carried forward by light railways, thus releasing a considerable number of lorries. In this period the 14 and 18 Army Field Art Park sections have been transferred to VI Coys the 189 Brigade Park Sect to VII Coys and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Aust Army Bds Sect to I Artyl Coy. A company of 3 Aust B.F.A. Coys was relieved by force on the 5<sup>th</sup> and a cent of machine guns subsequently evacuated the downed from plane.</p>

AHEELE	31-20		The work of M.F. during this period has been heavy the daily average no. of camps in the Road was 570. The large increase in number of camps was due largely to the new Camps being made along the Corps front. The road work has also been considerably extended requiring extra camps.
