

Appendix to War Diary for January 1918 No 1 Subject; General

The work of the Hospital for this month was much less than any of the preceeding four months, the daily average number of patients being about 920.

2271 were admitted, 2779 were discharged, and 11 died.

In addition
In addition 54 detained cases were admitted and transferred.

Surgeon General Sawyer paid a farewell visit to the hospital on retiring from the post of D. D. M. S. Boulogne, and made complementary references to the progress of the hospital, which he now considered one of the best in France.

Col. Thurston the new D. D. M. S. called shortly afterwards
Sir Anthony Bowlby inspected the fracture wards, and

General Sir W. R. Birdwood visited the hospital on the 20 and 21 Jan, saw many of the patients, and members of the staff, and presented a military medal to 2329 Pte Banney J.L.

In the earlier part of the month the tent wards had to ge closed because of the impossibility of getting proper heat -ing appliances for them. This meant that the crists expan -sion of the wards proper had to be continued and the number of available beds reduced by about 200. The engineers started fitting the tents with doorways and stove frames, but in the meantime had issued to the W. A. A. C. units the stoves intended for this hospital. We therefore have to await a fresh supply from England.
