Then returned to Capt Helles and Anzac. Then transhipped to Seeang Bee and afterwards on to Osmanieh. The Osmanieh conveyed 114 wounded to Alexandria. Returned in Derrflinger to Lemnos and thence to Anzac.</p>
