	Sep 11	1800	Lt Col. Gubler evacuated to base suffering from Cardiac dilatation & Dysentery Evacuations for 24 hours 176	
	Sep 12	1800	Evacuations 151. Col Corkery 16 th CCS acting as Medical Control Officer	
	Sep 13	1800	Evacuations 194. E.W. Kirk transferred from 6 th Ball. on our strength from Sep 11 th Lt Sept James evacuated to Mudros suffering from Gastric Intestis. 20 Bell tents arrived from Mudros & stored here. 20 Marque tents sent to 13 th Clearing Co. to store for us.	
	Sep 14	1800	Evacuations 193. Pte Gould evacuated to Mudros with Gastric Intestis. Navy refused evacuation in afternoon due to heavy weather.	
	Sep 15	1800	Evacuations 232. Gen Benell Dms came on shore sent word that he was calling on us but did not come. A few shells on beach from Page 1 no damage done. Col Corkery called. Note re re Emeline & Antitetanic serum received & noted.	
	Sep 16	1800	Evacuations 130. Pte Merchant evacuated to Mudros suffering from Dysentery	
	Sep 17	1800	Evacuations 159	
	Sep 18	1800	Evacuations 99. Capt H.I. Carlike evacuated to Base suffering from Pyrexia. Pte E.J. White to Base with Dysentery. Letter from Dms re 7 ordnance all wounded severely sick to be marked Hospital Ship. Left sick cases wanted Fleet Sweeper to Hospital at 10 hrs. Fleet Sweeper arrived 2100 + leaves at 0700 for Mudros. Pte Walker rejoined unit. Letter from Capt Banta same to Mudros. Lt Col. M. 1911. 1912. 1913. 1914. 1915 for us

	Sept 9	1800	Evacuated 99. Pte [unclear] returned to duty. Capt Barton + 29 Ambs. [unclear] are temporarily attached to duty. Telegram from Dms m 27 directing cases to be labelled Hospital ship for all wounded + severely sick + mild sick cases to be labelled Fleet Sweeper.	
	Sept 10	1800	Evacuations 113. Ptes: Pearsall + Cosgrove reinforcements arrived. Inspected sites with Col House D.D.M.s. for hospital on North beach.	
	Sept 11	1800	Evacuations 117 Pte Walker evacuated to Hospital ship suffering from Venereal disease (Chancres). Col House. Gen Canuthus + Gen Williams decided site for hospital + commenced work with 10 men clearing ground.	
	Sept 12	1800	Ptes in previous 24 hours only 1 patient evacuated which was a serious abdominal case. H.M.T Gascon sent word that she was full + could take no more patients. At present over 100 patients are waiting evacuation. Hospital ship stated by Naval Officer to be leaving Mudon P.M. + could give no idea of time of arrival.	
	Sept 13	1800	Evacuations 228. Mullaw at 0900.	
	Sept 14	1500	Evacuations 133 Corp. Hutter evacuated to Hospital ship suffering from Dysentery.

	Sep 20 1800	Evacuations 265 Corp CB Clelock evacuated to Hospital ship suffering from Pyrexia	
	Sep 20 1800	Evacuations 18. H.M.T. Guildford Castle reported full at 2200	
	Sep 22 1800	Sept 20. No further evacuations up to 1800 Sept 21. 16 Casualties reached none of hospitals patients treated. Evacuations 220	
	Sep 23 1800	Evacuations 98 Pte Tyler evacuated with Pyrexia to Hospital ship	
	Sep 24 1800	Evacuations 92 Pte Rigby evacuated to Hospital ship with Pyrexia	
	Sep 25 1800	Evacuations 16. Not low since 2000 Sept 24. Hospital ship reported full & left at 0900 this morning. No hospital ship yet in sight but expected about 2400. Weather fine No shelling or beach.

	Sep 27	1800	Evacuations 66 Pte O. Scott evacuated to Hospital Ship with Dysentery	
	Sep 28	1800	Evacuations 129 Evacuates Pte Watson to H Ship with Dysentery. Pte Smith to H Ship with Diarrhea. Pte Dutterby with Dysentery to H Ship. Pte Freeman went to mudders on duty. Sgt Doddams on duty to Mudders. Ptes Christie, Gordon, Cooper & Wilson returned to duty.	
	Sep 29	1800	Evacuations 95 Pte Christie to H Ship with Left Testiclitis	
	Sep 30	1800	Evacuations 131 Pte Jacobson to H Ship with Pyrexia. Commenced to remove cloves to new hospital site on north beach as present area required by Engineers for condensing plant.
