1. Reliefs in accordance with the attached table will be carried out within the Divisional Sector between the 18th and 21st insts.
2. (a) On completion of the reliefs in the Right Brigade Sector on night 19/20th August command will pass to the C.O., 132nd Regt. U.S. Infantry.
(b) Subsequently, on night 20/21st August, the remaining battalion of the 132nd Regt. U.S. Infantry will take over the right battalion front of the 4th Aust. Inf. Bde. as far North as the East and West Grid line through S. 19. Central.

(c) This Grid line will then become the new inter-brigade boundary.

3. The American troops will be distributed and organised in depth in such a manner as to ensure that the men are no thicker on the ground than they are at present. This will entail the occupation by their battalion reserves of accommodation now used by the Brigade Reserves of the 4th and 12th Aust. Inf. Bdes.

The necessary re-adjustments will be made by mutual arrangement between the Brigade and Regimental Commanders concerned.

4. On completion of the relief on night 19/20th the 12th Aust. Inf. Bde. will pass into Divisional Reserve. One battalion will be earmarked to act in close support of the American Regiment in case of emergency.

I, as Divisional Commander, wish to express to all ranks of the Fourth Australian Division my appreciation of their work during the period of our late successful offensive, 8th August, following days, and since.

The work of all arms was excellent and again enhances the fine fighting traditions of the Division.

To the work of the Staffs, of the Division, the Divisional Artillery, Infantry and Artillery Brigades, and of all units is due in great measure the success of the operation so successfully concluded.

This, when backed by such gallant and good tactical handling on the part of Officers and N.C.Os. and by the fine and gallant dash of all ranks, together with the initiative and resource displayed by such a large number of individuals and supported by excellent administrative arrangements, made the operation one of the most brilliant and successful accomplished by the Division since its arrival in France.

I much regret that the exigencies of the situation made it necessary for the 13th Brigade to be temporarily detached from the Division, but this Brigade carried out its role with complete success, and also in a manner worthy of its fine traditions.

The Artillery was handled with boldness and skill and their dash and initiative earned unstinted praise.

The S.A.A. Section D.A.C. and the Div. Train by bold and gallant action kept pace with the advance and enabled the services of Ammunition and Supply to be fully maintained under trying circumstances.

The Engineers and Pioneers carried out their duties gallantly and resourcefully and their work was excellent.

The Signal Service more than fully maintained their excellent record.

I have to thank all ranks of the Division for their devoted, gallant and unselfish work both during the operation, and since, in the Line.

To the Tank Corps, so closely associated with us, and to the Artillery, Heavy and Field, attached to us, we owe a debt of gratitude for their able assistance which it is impossible to over-rate.

The G.O.C's mention of the work done by the Train on the 8th. ins. refers particularly to the work of twenty wagons divided into two convoys of ten wagons each. One party, under Lieut. VASSEY from 14th. Company, working on the left of our advance, carrying Engineer stores, arrived at the 'green line' and had to wait with a Machine Gun Company in action until our Boys hopped over and took the 'RED Line' some distance off. Shelling was lively at this spot. The wagons pushed on with our Infantry picking up and carried with them some machine guns from a derelict Tank, at the request of a M.G. Officer. This party succeeded in dumping at Square 9, near MORGOURT, and returned to the Pine Wood Camp without a scratch, but covered with honor and dust.

The flanking party on our right consisted of the 7th and 26th Companies also carrying Engineer stores, and they, in turn, had to halt until the advance was continued from the 'Green Line'. At that period they were in advance of our Field Artillery in action, who wanted to know what the hell the A.S.C. was doing there. However this party pushed on and was overtaken by our gunners ~~xxxxxx~~ going at a gallop to a new artillery position in support of our advancing Infantry. Guides met this party and conducted it to Square 8, just in rear of the 'Red Line', and both parties were able to see the hopping over process and the capture of many Huns.

The night before all the Engineers and other stores were blown up with the Tanks, which were detailed for this duty, while standing parked in VILLERS-BRETONNEUX. At a late hour the G.O. was asked to supply twenty wagons to help to replace this loss, as Engineer material was urgently wanted to accompany the advance on the morrow. The C.O. returned to the Pine Wood from D.H.Q. at midnight and saw the Company Commanders concerned. At 3.A.M. the parties were proceeding on this duty. It was a long journey and was one which called for courage and skill and might, very easily, have entailed serious casualties. This was well understood by your G.O., and its accomplishment without any evil results is especially gratifying, while it adds another page to the history of this Train, to which, I am sure, you are all proud to belong.

My thanks are given to all ranks concerned, and the good horses, without which, the deed would have been impossible.

I like to think that when Tanks fail the A.S.C. can fill the breach, and what is most pleasing to me is the cheerful way you put up with difficulties and hardship and carry on.

The wagons returned to camp at about 6.P.M., having covered over 30 miles.

The transportation of rations to Battalions, Batteries and other units in the forward area, is also included in the G.O.C's comments.

1. The 4th Australian Division will be relieved in the line between the 23rd and 25th August in accordance with the attached Relief Table.
2. The programme of the relief will be as follows :-

Infantry Reliefs.

(a) On the night 23rd/24th August the 32nd Division extends its right to the line N. 24. Central - S. 20. Central relieving the 13th and 16th Australian Infantry Battalions.

Command in this portion of the Divisional Sector will pass on completion of the relief, when the Inter-divisional boundary will follow the "inter-corps boundary" shown on the attached map.

The 4th A.I. Brigade will remain in the line with one battalion holding its remaining front and one battalion in support in the present support battalion area until 10. a.m. on the 24th August.

(b) From 10. a.m. on the 24th August the defence of the Divisional Sector will be reorganised as follows :-

(i) Right Brigade Area.

Front now held by 48th and 46th Battalions up to road (exclusive) running along N.W. edge of CAIN COPSE.

The 50th Battalion will come under the orders of the G.O.C. 12th A.I. Brigade in its present location.

(ii) Left Brigade Area.

Front now held by 46th and 15th Battalions from road (inclusive) running along N.W. edge of CAIN COPSE.

The 51st Battalion will come under the orders of the O.C. 4th A.I. Brigade in its present location.

(iii) The troops of the 12th A.I. Brigade, now holding the front line N. of the new point of junction (Road running along N.W. edge of CAIN COPSE), will remain in position and will come under the orders of the 4th A.I. Brigade Commander.

(iv) Details of the above readjustment will be made direct between Brigade Commanders concerned.

(c) The above Brigade areas will be handed over separately by the 4th and 12th A.I. Brigade Commanders to the respective French Infantry regiments, 83rd I.R. on the Right, 59th on the Left.

Command in each area will pass on completion of the relief, which will be notified to this H.Q. by the outgoing Brigade.

Artillery Reliefs.

(a) Arrangements for the relief, on the night 23rd/24th August, of the Artillery at present covering the front North of the new Inter-Corps boundary will be made direct by the C.R.A. 4th Aust. Division with the C.R.A. 32nd Division.

4. The Battalions of the 13th A.I. Brigade are placed under the orders of the 4th and 12th A.I. Brigades in order to facilitate the arrangements for the relief, and will not be used by these Brigades for tactical purposes without the authority of the Divisional Commander.

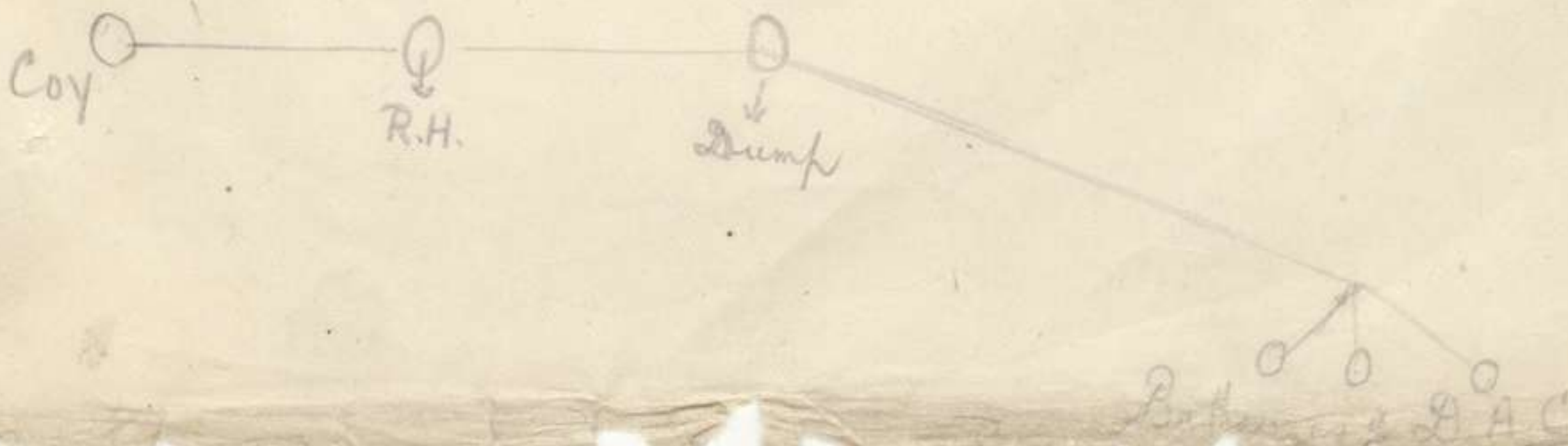

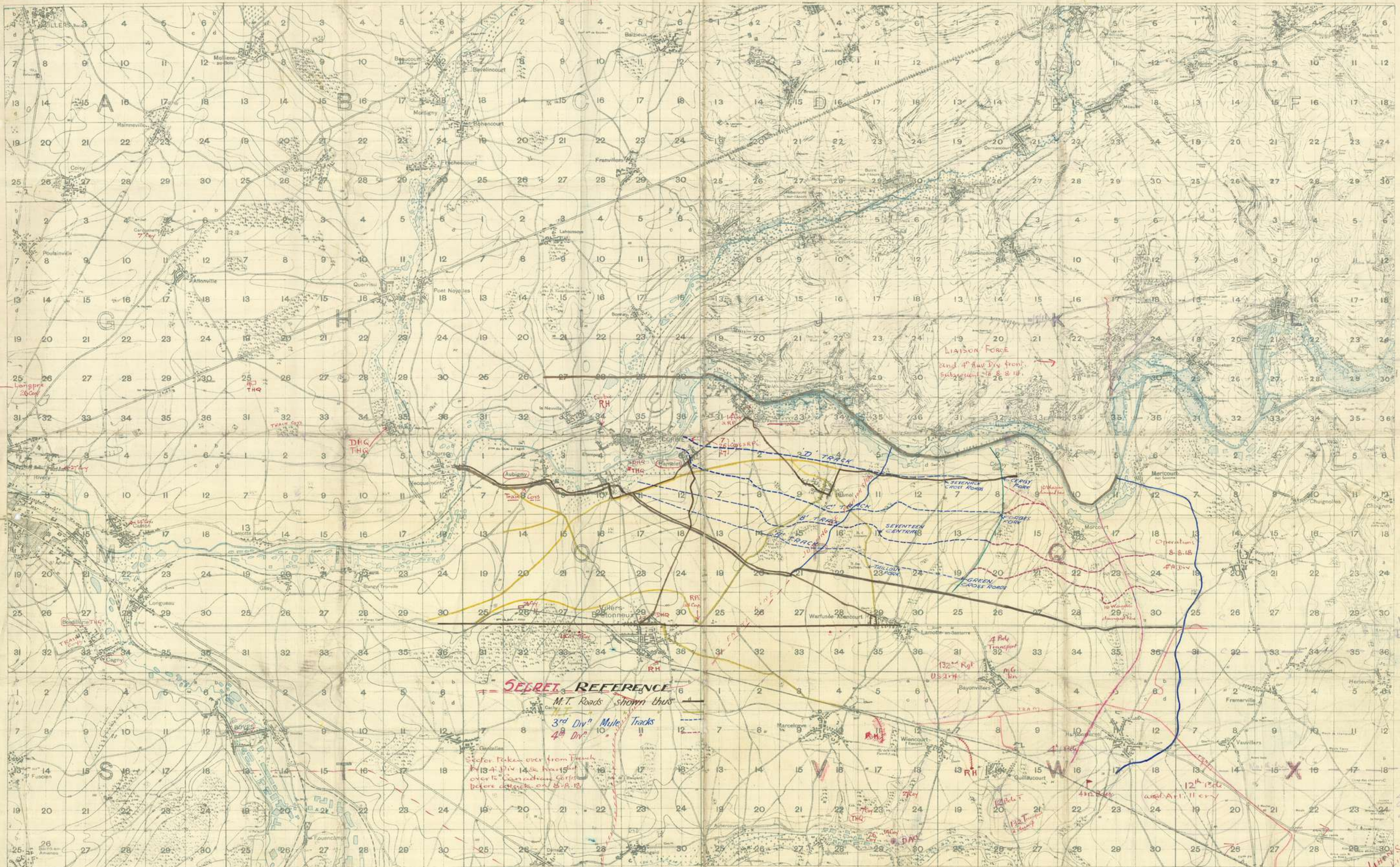
