

CONVALESCENT TRAINING DEPOT.

WAR DIARY MONTH ENDING 31st MAY 1918

The greatly improved weather conditions for this month, has afforded decidedly better opportunities for general improvements throughout this Camp. Whitewashing the foundations to Huts and Latrines, taring Stove-Pipes exposed to weather, etc., is now almost completed.

About 4 acres of cultivated Camp Plots have been planted with vegetables, and are making satisfactory progress.

6th. inst. Lieut. Turton, 44th. Battalion, who has been for some months previously, been acting as Draft Conducting Officer to the C.T.D. was transferred to Waterloo, where he took over duties as R.T.O. Lieut. Parfitt. (P.S.L) 18th. Battalion, was posted to the C.T.D. vice Lieut. Turton.

7th. inst. the G.O.C. held an inspection of the personnel of No.1. Camp, on No.4. Camp. Parade Ground at 10 am.

The sentence of Lieut. V. Bonny, 2nd. Div. Train, was promulgated at 11 am before a parade of all Officers in the Depot.

9th. inst. The Depot was visited by the Fire Inspector for Southern Command, and all Fire Appliances, and Standing Orders investigated.

16th. inst. Surgeon-General. N.R. House, V.C., K.C.B., Surgeon-General. R.H.J. Fetherston., and the A.D.M.S. visited the Camp and inspected the patients receiving their 606 treatment.

A Sports Committee was formed, and Depot Sports arranged for June. 1st.
