  - (a) One Tank down MENIN ROAD to work North of INVERNESS COPSE and thence up Gorman trench from point 66.
  - (b) One Tank along South side of JAP AVENUE and then Southwards along German Tronch.
  - (c) One Tank along North side of JAP AVENUE and thon Northwards along German Tronch.
  - (d) One Tank South of Strong Point 32 along road to South-West Cornor of GLENCORSE WOOD and then Southwards along GERMAN TRENCH.
- 3. Half a company of Infantry will be allotted to each Tank. Each Half Company will attack on the initiative of its O.C. as soon as their particular Tank approaches its objective.
- 4. Arrangements have been made for a contact aeroplane to be up at 5.30am. Infantry will be propared to light flares or signal their position when called to do so by means of a flare or Klazon Horn from the aeroplano.
