Approval was sought and obtained from A.D.M.S., 5th Aust. Division, to find further accommodation for the personnel and to transfer the patients in the D.R.S. to permanent buildings, owing to the state of the weather and the time of year. 2 (two) Barns were obtained in an adjoining farm sufficient to accommodate 100 (one hundred) of the personnel who were accordingly moved there, the patients being then transferred from the tents to the permanent buildings.


