





Unit Sports were held in Chateaub grounds this afternoon and were keenly contested. The sectionxforxed competition for most points was very close from beginning to end, "A" Section finally winning from "B" Section with 47 points against 45½ points. "C" Section came next with 24 points, and Transport with 18.

9.35 p.m. A Special Order was received from Division that at 10 a.m; tomorrow morning, a full Muster Parade would be held and that only men on special duty(and provided with special passes) should be allowed out of camp. The object of the parade is to enable the rounding up of deserters in the Divisional Area.

A Muster Parade was held at 10 a.m. this morning in accordance with instructions received from Division. All men accounted for.
Captains Stump and Faithfull proceeded to England on Leave.
The Divisional Football Tournament commenced this afternoon.
The Ambulance met the 44th Eattalion at HEUCOURT and was beaten by 17 points.
Under the auspices of the Literary Society essays were called for from each section, the bubject being "Will the world be the better for the Wary? Remarkably good essays productive of deep thought and much labor were submitted.
