

NOTES OF INTEREST FOR MONTH OF SAPUARY 1919.

BIENCOURT

- 1st. The weather has been very bad and raining. Hockey was played this afternoon.
- Another hockeym match was played this afternoon, between "A" and "B" Sections. The former won.

 Weather finer.
- 3rd. Captainx Love was detailed as Acting R.M.O. to the 41st Battn. Advice was received from Comforts Fund that there were 10 cases of Comforts to be collected on behalf of this Unit.
- 4th. Weather still fine.
- 5th. Advice received from A.D.M.S. that the visit of the Prince of Wales had been postpohed until probably the 21st inst.
- 6th. Captain Kenihan R.L. (M.C.). reported for duty from No 2
 A.G.H.
 The weather still remains good.
- 7th. Captain Luke returned from Acting R.M.O. 44th Battalion.
 Instructions received from Division that particular attention was to be paid to the appearance of men leaving Units on leave.
 Weather very good.
- Lt. Col Lewers.proceeded to relieve A.D.M.S. while on leave.

 14 men of the Unit today proceeded to 3rd Divisional Wing
 en route to Australia. This quota embraced men who embarked
 from Australia between June 1915 and May 1916.
 The Hockey Team journeyed to Abbeville and played the
 3rd Aust. General Hospital during the afternoon.
- One more Other rank proceeded to 3rd Divisional Wing en route to Australia.

 A Sapper from the 3rd Divisional Engineers has been detailed to assist in the drainage of the town.

 We are now experiencing beautiful weather.
- Lieutenant HEPWORTH (Q.M.) proceeded on Leave to England today.

 A supply of tobacco and cigarettes were received from the Australian Comforts Fund and were greatly appreciated as the supply of these from Retail Canteens has been very limited for some considerable time.

 Weather is still fine.
 - Weather is still good. Football practice was indulged in during the day by several of the men.

 Duckboards have been obtained and laid down around the Chateau grounds. This has effected a great improvement and makes the variousk routes much more dry to walk on.

 The mud had become amuisance and was inches down.
 - 12th. The mud had become anuisance and was inches deep.
 Leave allotment has been oncreased to England; we are now sending 9 men a week. Personnel are now going within twelve months of their last leave. The port of embarkation has been changed from Boulogne to Calais.
- A Medical Board consisting of Major Meyers (President) and Captain Luke (Member) sat at OISAMONT today and reviewed 15 cases of men considered unfit for further service in the Field. 10 cases were reviewed passed as infit.

 Leave to Amiens at the rate of 2 men per week is now

A leather wallet(for letters) was issued to the personnel today- a gift from the Y.M.C.A.

The weather is good- fine mild days being experienced!

14th. Under instructions from Corps all equipment, etc., of Resuscitation Team was returned to various depots. Allx supplies (with exception of a few minor articles) were obtained from Australian sources. Owing to Machine Gun Battalion moving to GAMACHES, we have now to collect their sick, and (pending the arrival of a Dental Unit) we are also to do their dental work. Advice received of a further reduction in the establishment of Field Ambulances. The alteration leaves"A" AND "B" Sections the sames as before reorganisation, with the complete deletion of "C" Section. Reported completion of the new establishment today. With regard to equipment, A.D.M.S. were notified that the equipment of A & "B" Sections was supplied in Australia and "C" Section from Imperial Ordnance. Advice received that permission had been given for use of oil drum braziers. This issue is to be made soon. The weather remains fair.

Opinion asked for by the A.D.M.S. as to the advisability of issuing an extra set of underclothing from the Divisional Baths to all ranks. Reply sent that it was considered advisable. Captain LUKE was detailed as Acting R.M.O. to the 3rd Machine Gun Battalion in lieu of Captain MACCALLUM, proceeding on leave.

Muster aprade held at 2 p.m. when the C.O. and Major MEYERS addressed the Parade on Demobilisation and Repatriation. Weather is fine and sunny.

16th. No leave was permitted for Abbeville today by order of Division The weather kept fine during the day but changed during the night, when there was heavy rain and hailstorms.

A Special Medical Board was held today.

An indoor Tournament consisting of Bridge, Chess and Draughts took place this afternoon between representatives of the Ambulance and the 43rd Battalion. The Battalion wom the chess and draughts and the Ambulance were successful in the bridge.

Weather again fine.

18th Major R.B. NORTH left the Unit today and proceeded to England to take up duties under D.M.S., A.I.F. Weather good.

Dental Unit No 64 arrived from England to take up duty with the 3rd Machine Gun Battalion. Thet were billetted here during the night prior to proceeding to GAMACHES where the Battn. is located.

The weather is fine but very cold.

20th. Captain J.A. LOVE has been transferreduto the 9th Field Ambulance.

A heavy frost fell during the night and today is exceedingly cold although fine.

21st. Weather good although cold.

22nd. Weather good.

23rd Weather good, but cold.

24th Memo received from Administrative Headquarters re loss by robbery of equipment and other material by civilians or soldiers. So far nothing has thus been lost in the Unit.

Snow fell today for a couple of hours.

3.

25th.

Frost followed upon the snow of yesterday and the surrounding country is carpeted white with the frozen snow.

1 Other rank was despatched to the 3rd Divisional Wing for early repatriation.

- Advice received from Supply Officer, 11th Brigade, that the Iron Rations of the Unit were to be consumed, and that a corresponding amount would be subtracted from the daily issue over a period of seven days.

 Today has been cold.
- 27th

 12 cases of comforts were received from Australian Comforts
 Fund.

 Special Medical Board appointed to examine men with disabilitiesin accordance with Demobilisation Instructions.

 Leave to Medical Officers suspended in order to proceed with
 the examination on men as per Instructions No 11.
- 29th Captain Maclure has been appointed to command the cadre of this Unit.

 Neather cold. Snow fell during the night.

 In accordance with Demobilisation and Repatriation Instructions

 No 11, the medical examination of all ranks was commenced.

No ll, the medical examination of all ranks was commenced today under the supervision of Captain Maclure. The Precedence Rool (order of demobilisation) was completed today. This roll had been entrusted to a Committee to make up. Delay has occcurred owing to the ambiguity of Instructions issued on the subject by the Demobilisation authorities.

- 30th. 6 Hockey players went to Abbeville to complete a team with the 3rd Aust. General Hospital against the South African Hospital. Are a commandant was asked if accommodation for 3 Officers and 130 Other Ranks could be found at TRANSLAY or neighbouring villages. Letter sent to A.D.M.S. that it would be impossible to billet 120 Other Ranks (10th Field Ambulance) with this Unit as the accommodation of the village would not allow of it. Advice received re 3rd Quota of Division for Demobilisation 52 of the Ambulance are included.
- 31st. The day has been exceptionally fine- probably the coldest day experienced this winter.

 Demobilisation Circular received with information that our second quota to be demobilised will embrace 82 of all ranks.

 Notification received from A.D.M.SL that all leave to ENGLAND had been cancelled.

QUARTERMASTER'S REPORT FOR MONTH OF JANUARY 1919

Satisfactory progress to report for month.

FOODSTUFFS. A.S.C.

According to rations authorised percentages have been well up to the average of previous reports. Potatoes were purchased locally with money obtained from Regimental Funds.

A fair issue of wood and coal has been received from the supply dump. A quantity of timber was obtained from Saw Mills in locality and proved a great assistance to the heating and cooking arrangements of the Unit

D.A.D.O.S.

Difficulty has been experienced during the month in obtaining several items. Indents submitted for clothing have been supplied in small installments, and a large number of indentsx still await completion. The non arrival of sole leather has been a difficult problem to contend with.
