WAREHAIL	1.4.	L7.	sunday Church Parade of all available strength of Ambulance to local Church. Notification from Fldworth that a draft of 100 mon were to proceed to No. 2 Camp, Parkhouse, for duty.	
"	2.4.	1.77	A draft of 100 other ranks marched out to No. 2 Camp, Parkhouse. Captain H. Rayson, N.C. as Conducting Officer. (Authority A.D.M.S. Tidworth). Captain B.M. Sampson, A.A.M.C., reported from Parkhouse, and was taken on the strength of the Ambulance. Seven other ranks reported from No. 1 Australian Command Depot, Perham Down.	
11	3.4.	1.7.	Temporary arrangements were made to divide the Ambulance into three Sections, and the hutment accommodation in lines was divided up to "A", "B", and "C" Sections accordingly. Training in earnest from this date. Private H. DUHSTAN appointed to the rank of Lance-Corporal.	
***	4.4.	17.	Major J.A. Smeal and 31 other ranks, being the remainder of complete "B" Section, reported from No. 1 Australian Auxiliary Hospital, Harefield, Middlesex, and were taken on the strength of the Ambulance. (Authority A.D.M.S. Fidworth). No. 14807, Private Etherington, A. promoted to the rank of Acting-Corporal.	
#	6.4.	17.	Being Good Friday Divine Service of all afailable strength was held in the local Church, and remainder of day was observed as Sunday. Arrangements were made through Brigade Headquarters for 25% of the Unit to have 24 hours! leave over Baster. As Baster extended over 4 days this enabled each member of the Unit to have 24 hours! leave.	
п	8.4.	17.	Sunday Church Parade of all available strongth to local Church.	
11	9.4.	17.	Easter Monday Observed a heliday throughout the Brigade.	
11	10.4.	17.	"B" Section of the Ambulance, being complete, went for a route march under Captains Rayson and Morgan, and on returning from same Captain Rayson reported upon the satisfactory condition of the Section.	
11	11.4.	17.	Hajor D.M. Embelton reported from Administrative Headquarters, A.I.F., London; was posted to "C" Section of the Ambulance. Two other ranks reported from Headquarters, Tidworth, and were taken on the strength. (Authority A.D.M.S., Tidworth).

п	16.4	.17.	No. 13866, Private Cannon, W.J., to be acting Sergoant. No. 27, L/c. Ferguson, J.T., marched out to No. 2 Camp, Parkhouse, for duty. (Authority A.D.M.S. Tidworth).

Lewis, 16th Field Ambulance, which occurred at the Wareham Military Hospital. 8 other ranks marched in from No. 2 A.A.H., Southall.	
**	28.4	1.17.	general Routine and training. The syllabus, as laid down for the week, was adhered to as far as was practicable. The new syllabus for the ensuing week was prepared from this date.	
11	29.4	4.17.	Sunday Church Parade of all available strength of the Ambulance to local Church. "B" Section took over duty of Camp, for week ending 6.5.17.	
11	30.4	1.17.	Major B. Mettei and eight other ranks, comprising the 7th Sanitary Section (attached to the 16th Australian Field Ambulance) marched out to No. 1 Australian Command Depot, Perham Down, for duty. (Authority A.D.H.S. Tidworth). No. 236, S/Sgt. G.J. Williams, to act as Warrant Officer as from this date.
