

CARE OF FRET. Every N.C.O. and man will thoroughly soap his feet and the inside of his socks before marching off. On completion of march Cooks will provide hot water and all N.C.O's and men will wash their feet and put on clean socks which will be issued on arrival at QUERRIEU.

ADVANCE BILLETING PARTY. An advance billeting party consisting of Captain Lawrence, 1 N.C.O. and two men, will proceed by car to QUERRIEU leaving Beaucourt at 9 a.m. 2.5.18. Captain McCutcheon will also accompany this party and will act as Medical Officer to receive and dispose of sick of 6th A.I. Brigade Group arriving by car at QUERRIEU.

CLEARANCE OF SICK. One Daimler Mator Ambulance will report at Church WARLOY At 11 a.m. 2.5.18 to pick up sick dumped there by Units of 6th A.I. Brigade Group. It will first convey any C.C.S. cases (if marked . as such by R.M.O's) to M.D.S. MONTIGNY Chateau. It will then return to Church WARLOY and convey any sick which are not C.C.S. cases to QUERRIEU, where they will be seen by Captain McCutcheon and either retained as D.C.S. cases or sent back to their Units according to circumstances. Two or more trips will be made if necessary. One Ford Car will report to Captain Lawrence at Mairie RHAUCOURT at 8.50 a.m. 2.5.18 conveying Sergeant Nursing Duties "B" Sect. and two nursing orderlies, sick parade Medical Equipment, Primus Stove and small quantity of Medical Comforts to QUERRIEU for care of sick of 6th A.I. Brigade Group arriving by car from WARLOY at a prox 12.30 p.m.

One Daimler Motor Ambulance will report to Sht. Burke at the Cook-COOKS. house BEAUCOURT at 12 noon and will convey sufficient Cooks and cook's gear to QUERRIEU to provide a hot meal on arrival of Unit there at 3 p.m. approx. This car will convey W, O. Clark D.C.M. who

will report to Capt. Lawrence on arrival.

OFFICERS' MESS. One Daimler will report at Officers' Mess at 1 p.m. for instructions.

OFFICERS' KITS. Officers' Kits will be ready for collection by wagon at the various billets at 10.30 a.m.

BLANKETS. One blanket will be carried by each man. All blankets in excess of one will be handed in to section Sergeants at the 8.45 a.m. parade. Section Sergeants will then hand these in to Q.M. Store before 10 a.m.

HORSED TRANSPORT. One wagon will call at Officers' billets at 10.30 a.m.
to collect Officers' Kits. The remaining wagons and limbers



- RELIEF. The 6th Aust. Field Ambulance will relieve 10th Aust. Field Amb. at I.4.b.8.0. and all forward posts -relief to be complete by 12 noon 11.5.18. On completion of relief C.O. 6th Aust. Fld. Amb. will be responsible for the evacuation to M.D.S. at H.10.a.9.4. of all casualties from the Divisional Sector.
- ADVANCE PARTIES. Major E.L. Hutchinson D.S.O. with "C" Section Bearer sub-division, two O.R's nursing duties, two Cooks, and four bearers of "A" Section, one Limber and necessary equipment will march out from QUERRIEU at 8 am this day via LAHOUSSOYE AND BONNAY and will take over from 10th Aust. Fld. Amb. dugouts in railway cutting at I.23.d.6.5. and will remain there during the night of 10/11.5. 18. This party will carry 48 hours rations and unexpended portion. of the day's ration. Captain Davis, 5th Aust.Fld.Amb. with one Bearer sub-division of_5th Aust.Fld.Amb. will report to C.O. 6th Aust.Field Amb. at QUERRIEU at 9 am 10.5.18 and will report forthwith to Major Hutchinson at I.23.d.6.5. marching via LAHOUSSOYE and BONNAY and remaining at I.23.d.6.5. for the night of 10/11.5.18. This party will carry 24 hours rations plus the unexpended portion of the day's ration. SUPPORT BEARERS FOR "Z" SECTOR. Reference to evacuation of wounded from SAILLY-le-sec-VAUX-sur-SOMME Sector during very active operations.

The general configuration of the ground is as follows:-

2 steep gullies each entering a river valley from the North side at a right angle. A single road running along the bed of the valley, confined on one side by a canal and on the other by a steep range of hills. At one end of this road the enemy line - at the other a hairpin bend under direct enemy observation at two points and already accurately registered by him. The problem then is:-

How to deal with casualties when :-

(1) The road at the hairpin bend is cut and made impassable for motor ambulances by shell fire.

(2) The road along the valley is flooded with gas.

(3) The only at all practicable route over the range of hills not under close and direct enemy observation lies through a wood which would certainly be swept by shell fire, and leads at the top on to a road which follows the sky line.

(4) The tow path along the canal is more severely gassed than

any other part of the valley.

Having looked at the matter from each of these points of view I am convinced that the only practicable solution is to store cases until the worst of the gas and shell fire is over and communications restored either along the valley road past I.30.c central and I.29.b. or else up through the wood at J.19.c. during darkness. To do this it would be necessary to construct deep dug-outs similar to that in progress of construction at the A.D.S. - I.4.b.8.0., gas proof, at the following locations and with the following capacities:


I have had made a working plan of dug-out and stretcher arrange ment as put in at I.4.b.8.0. This is at present in the hands of the 2nd Aust. Pioneers who are doing the work - it should be finished with in a day or so and will then be forwarded to you for use in conjunction with this report, with the exception that wherever possible the drives for these dug-outs should go straight in from the face and should not take a downward slope which invariably encourages a collection of gas in the dug-out. There should be a 9' gas-lock at each entrance and a slight downward slope outwards from the inner to the outer gas door thus: -The type of country on the Sector in question gives such excellent cover almost from the first yard of drive Gas into the face, that no downward slope lock of the drive is necessary to obtain_ cover.

I have conferred with C.O. 8th Aust. Field Ambulance on the whole matter in accordance with your 1/24 of 28.5.18, and also with Major Walsh D.S.O. 8th A.F. Amb. and Major Hutchinson D.S.O. of this Unit, who are in charge of their respective evacuations in the Sector under consideration and they all agree with me that the scheme set out above is the only one which can possibly meet the case.


The question of stored wounded being captured by the enemy in the event of a withdrawal has been considered and it seems that it would be better for them to run this risk than to become gas or H.E. casualties during an evacuation, which at the best could not guarantee that they would ultimately reach a zone of safety.



QUARTERMASTER'S REPORT FOR MONTH.

F.

RATIONS & SUPPLIES: - The proceedure adopted for the rationing of posts was the same as in previous months diary. The sector under this Ambulance's control proved the necessity of a q.M. representative at the forward posts, for the posts were numerous and far apart, 20 being rationed from Ambulance H'qrs varying from 4 to 40 at each. Bearers from 5th 7th & 8th Aust. Field Ambulances were attached and rationed by this Unit. An outstanding feature for the month was the quantity of green vegetables issued by A.A.S.C. consisting of letteces, cabbages, radishes and leeks. These were a very welcome change, especially in the hot weather experienced this month. Rations were bagged separately at H'qrs for each post, and cars bringing patients from forward motor posts took back rations on return journey. From motor posts bearers carried forward through bearer relays to R.A.P's. Rations were drawn and kept at A.D.S. and motor posts for patients who were able to have a hot meal. During hot weather jam drawn in cardboard cartons was at times very unsatisfactory. It was found necessary to send it separately from other rations to the posts, owing to the bottoms becoming detached, this was more noticeable in jam that had been packed any length of time, very often a fair amount of jam was lost in this way HORSE RATION. The ration of oats and hay was the same as in previous month and supplemented by a clover patch allotted to the Unit, allowing approximately half a ton per day. This green ration was a great benefit to the horses. WATER. Both A.D.S's (HAPPY VALLEY AND PEARL BAY) up till now have drawn their supply by water cart from Water Point at PONT-NOYELLES distant 5 kilos. A new Water Point has been opened at FRANVILLERS distant 400 yards. Water Point consists of two stand pipes with hoses each capable of filling a 118 gallon water cart in 8 minutes. The standards are teed off a 4" main which has been pushed up from. PONT-NOYELLES. Horse troughs are also provided at the Water Point. Motor Post at MIDDLE HARBOUR and majority of R.A.P's drew their supply from local wells, which have been tested and found fit for drinking_ purposes after chlorination 1 to 2 scoops B.P. At Motor Post MERICOURT 52 gallons of drinking water in petrol tins were kept for Forward Posts if required. ORDNANCE. The system of drinking stores in a motor lorry to a central point near the Unit's supplied is very satisfactory. All indents for the month were promptly supplied. STRETCHERS AND BLANKETS. Stretchers and Blankets sent down with patients from A.D.S's to M.D.S. were replaced by equal number in the usual way. Two blankets were held for each stretcher at the post. During ordinary times 16 stretchers were kept at each line R.A.P. 8 at each support or reserve R.A.P. and a reserve of 100 at A.D.S's. The system of fumigating all blankets brought from front line by P.U.O. and gassed patients was carried out by Foden Lorry stationed at M.D.S. St. GRATIEN ROAD near QUERRIEU. SALVAGE. Every effort was made to collect as much salvage as possible, the result obtained was very satisfactory. In addition to clothing and equipment a great number of cartridge cases were forward-

ed to 2nd Aust. Division Salvage Depot. During the month wisits were

made to the town of CORBIE and a great number of valuable drugs were

salvaged from chemist's shops and forwarded to Advanced Depot Medical Stores.

COMFORTS FOR PATIENTS. At the two A.D.S's and Motor Posts a good





MEDICAL STORES. The distribution of Medical Stores is at present carried out by 3 Staff Sergeants. 1 Staff Sergeant is attached to A.D.S. PEARL BAY to look after all supplies required by that post and supply any urgent demand made by Units in the vicinity. 2 Dispensers are at Ambulance H'qrs to keep up the stock of Medical Stores and Dressings necessary to supply all Units requisitioning on them for such. To facilitate this work a "Wants Book" is kept in which items are entered daily to be placed on order from Medical Stores. R.M.O's send their weekly requisitions to Ambulance H'qrs on Mondays. This gives a fair idea of the quantities of stores necessary for the ensuing week. This requisition is sent in on Tuesday of each week to A.D.M.S. for counter signature and is collected by the Ambulance stationed at M.D.S. The supplies are then drawn by that Field Ambulance from Advanced Depot Medical Stores and finally forwarded on to this Unit. This is a new system of collecting Medical Stores and works very satisfactorily. The Ambulance collecting stores returns all empties such as cintment pots, bottles, cartons, bales, tins etc. also U.S. articles for exchange. These are forwarded to them by this Unit on the day previous. Drugs and dressings arrive from Medical Stores in a very satisfactory condition. Urgent requisitions from R.M.O's are supplied at all hours, once Staff Sergeant always



being on duty at the Dispensary. All requisitions for Forward Posts pass through the Orderly Room and if approved by the C.O. handed to the 4.M. for supply. Units camping close proximity collect their requisition on Thursdays. For those in the Forward Area stores are packed carefully in sand bags distinctly labelled, and forwarded through the various advanced posts. During the past three weeks 160 requisitions have been supplied to the various R.M.O's, these include a large variety of medical stores such as, Tablets, Drugs, Dressings, Instruments (either rendered U.S. or destroyed by shell fire) anti Gas Ampoules (i.e. N H 3) Tourniquets and Splints. An approximate estimate of the amount of stores required during that period will be obtained from the following articles distributed:-Cotton Wool 260 lbs. Shell Dressings 2,500, Bandages 3,000, Bandages triangular 300% TABLETS. Acid Acetyl Sal 8,000, Sodi Salicyl 8,000 also large quantities of other tablets. Excessive demands on tablets such as Acid Acetyl Sal. and Quinine resulted from an epidemic of P.U.O. among the troops. Being the forward Ambulance we have been supplying requisitions for Medical Stores to all Units in the battle_area which includes not only the 2nd Aust. Division but all British Units attached and stationed in the vicinity. SICK PARADE. Medicine is supplied daily as ordered by the M.O. to all men reporting on sick parade.


GENERAL

On May 2nd the Transport accompanied the Unit on the move from BEAU-COURT to QUERRIEU. On arrival at destination the horses were stabled in a barn and wagons were parked some 200 yards away in a paddock. During the stay in these stables all harness was thoroughly washed and overhauled. On the morning of 11th instant the Unit moved forward to the A.D.S. I.4.b.8.0. 1 Ambulance Wagon, 2 G.S. Wagons 1 Limber and 2 Water Carts moved to the A.D.S. with the Unit, carrying equipment. After unloading equipment the wagons returned to LAHOUSSOYE and occupied the wagon lines vacated by previous Ambulance, except Water Carts, 1 of which went to PEARL BAY A.D.S. I.6.b. 7.6. the other remained at Ambulance H'qrs. The remainder of the Transport remained at QUERRIEU and took over stables and wagon shed vacated by the outgoing Ambulance (10th Aust. Field Ambulance) While in wagon shed the wagons were painted. On the evening of the 18th instant the 2 remaining Ambulance Wagons with 14 additional horses moved to wagon lines at LAHOUSSOYE to be in readiness to move forward to evacuate wounded during impending operations by 2nd Aust. Division (6th and 5th A.I. Bdes) against VILEE-sur-ANCRE. At 1 a.m. on 19th instant 3 Ambulance Wagons, with 4 horses to each, left wagon lines to proceed to post at Station (HALTE), South of HEILLY, and to work forward to post at MERICOURT as

required. At 7 a.m. a relief of 12 horses and 6 drivers went forward to relieve the horses and drivers which had left at 1 a.m. 3 Ambulance Wagons with 8 horses and 4 horses from the 7th Aust. Field Ambulance and 5th Aust. Field Ambulance respectively reported back to wagon lines at LAHOUSSOYE at 5 a.m. At 7 a.m. 3 Ambulance Wagons of 7th Aust. Field Ambulance left LAHOUSSOYE wagon lines to report to PEARL BAY A.D.S. where some congestion of walking wounded was reported. These, with three 3 ton motor lorries commandered from a Brigade S.A.A. Park dealt with the situation promptly. At 3.30 p.m. all wagons and horses reported back to LAHOUSSOYE wagon lines. There had been no casualties to men or horses during the operations. At 8.15 a.m. on 20th instant the enemy started to shell the village of LAHOUSSOYE heavily. The men and horses were all moved out of the village to the open fields beyond. 2 horses were slightly wounded before they were out of the village. At 11.30 a.m. 2 Ambulance Wagons of 6th and 3 of 7th Aust. Field Ambulances respectively and all horses, except those that were originally at LAHOUSSOYE wagon lines returned to QUERRIEU. On 21.5.18 the horses and wagons from LAHOUSSOYE were moved up to the HAPPY VALLEY A.D.S., where the horses were dug into a bank, a parapet 4' high running at the rear and a 4' parapet between each 2 horses. On 25th instant the rear Transport lines were moved out of QUERRIEU to a small valley some three quarters of a mile S.W. of the village, on account of shelling of the village in the area near the stables. In the new position the horses were dug into a bank and a 4' high parapet built at the rear and between each two horses from the earth excavated from the bank. The personnel, also dug into the banks and erected shelters for themselves. The horses are now very sheltered from wind and also from the sun during portion of the day. 1 half-Limber is stationed at MIDDLE HARBOUR Motor Loading Post doing road repairing work. On 29th instant an extra Limber and a half reported to MIDDLE HARBOUR M.L.P. for road repairing work, making two in all.

The cars accompanied the Ambulance on move from BEAUCOURT to QUERRIES on 2.5.18. While at this village the opportunity was availed of to paint 1 Daimler & 1 Ford car, minor repairs being effected prior to painting.

On 10th inst. 1 Daimler was sent to workshops for repairs - front axle bent & play in front hubs. Car turned out ready for the road the following day.

On 11th inst. all cars (less 1 Daimler attached to A.D.M.S.) moved to HAPPY VALLEY A.D.S. (Amb.H'qrs) 62d/I.4.b.8.0 and the following cars were attached for duty: - 5th Aust.Fld.Amb. 3 large cars 7th Aust.Fld.Amb. 2 large cars.

On 12th inst. 1 large car was stationed at new loading post established at J.27.a.5.8.

K 1 Ford car replaced large car at RIBEMONT MOTOR LOADING POST.
On 15th inst. 1 large car was put out of action owing to rear spring breaking, and was replaced making the car fit for the road the following day.

On 19th inst. the 2nd Aust. Division carried out an attack on VILLE-sur-ANCRE. At 3a.m. the first load of wounded arrived by horse ambulance at HEILLY STATION. All available cars were kept on forward running until rush was over or well in hand. Three large cars were withdrawn from the forward running to clear a congestion of patients at PEARL BAY A.D.S. to M.D.S.

All patients cleared by 3p.m. & three extra cars attached for temporary duty were returned to their Unit. At 4p.m. the running had resumed its normal condition.

On 25th.inst. 1 large car out of action owing to broken front spring which was replaced during day & car again ready for the road.

On 28th.inst. 1 large car out of action owing to ball race breaking—shearing axle housing and breaking drive shaft. This car reported from workshops ready for the road on 31.5.18.

On 29th.inst. Ford car stationed at VAUX out of action left axle shaft broken - diff. pinion casing broken. Repairs being effected.
