TARGET PRACTICE.

1. Target practice will be carried out as under on the DAVENINCOURT Artillery Range, and at the times and dates shown.

(a) June 6th 1917 at 10 a.m.  
 Right Section. 4th Battery  
 Centre " " (Air recuperator).  
 (under the command of Major F.L.BIDDLE, D.S.O.).

The practice is to be illustrative of the new air buffer and an endeavour will be made to ascertain the amount of negative jump of the new equipment.

A comparison of the shooting of the two classes of equipment will also be shown.

(b). June 11th 1917 at 10 a.m.

Practice to illustrate successive Frontal Creeping and Flanking barrages.

1st and 2nd Bdes Aust F.A. will each provide one 3 gun battery for this practice. Orders for the actual barrages will be published later.

1. The 5th Australian Divisional Artillery, at present in the line under the orders of the G.O.C., IV Corps will be relieved by the 1st Australian Divisional Artillery.
2. (1). 1st Australian Divisional Artillery will march on June 20th into bivouac and billets as follows-
  - (a). 2nd F.A. Brigade and D.A.C. and Trench Mortar Batteries to OVILLERS Huts.  
Route WARLOY - AVELUY.
  - (b). 1st Australian Divisional Artillery Headquarters and 1st F.A. Brigade to SPRING GARDENS.  
Route, via ALIENS-ALBERT Road - ALBERT.
- (2). Parties will be sent on in advance to report to the Commandant, No.1. Area, at OVILLERS Huts, who will detail all bivouacs and billets.
- (3). 1st F.A. Brigade to be clear of BEHENCOURT by 6 a.m.  
2nd F.A. Brigade to be clear of BAVELINCOURT by 6 a.m.  
D.A.C. head of column to leave FRECHENCOURT at 6.30 a.m.  
Trench Mortar Batteries will march with D.A.C.
- (4). Intervals of 200 yards will be maintained between batteries and sections of the D.A.C. on the march.
3. Orders for the march on June 21st from OVILLERS and SPRING GARDENS to the line, and for the relief of 5th Australian Divisional Artillery in the line, will be issued later on receipt of orders from IV Corps.
4. 1st Australian Divisional Artillery will march with ammunition echelons empty.
5. Detailed orders re supply and disposal of ammunition will be issued separately.
6. 1st Australian Divisional Artillery Order No. 94 of 17th inst., is hereby cancelled.

1. Reference 1st Aust Div Arty Order No. 95, para 1.  
The 1st Australian Divisional Artillery will relieve the 48th Div. Arty in the right sector of the IV Corps front instead of the 5th Australian Divisional Artillery.
2. A table showing disposition of 48th Divisional Artillery and relieving Units of 1st Australian Divisional Artillery is attached as Appendix.
3. The relief will take place on the nights of 22nd/23rd and 23rd/24th June under detailed arrangements to be made by C.R.A. 48th Division.
4. Battery Commanders of 1st Australian Divisional Artillery will report to Headquarters 48th Divisional Artillery I.34.A.2.5, at 10 a.m. on 21st inst, where guides will meet them. They will take their kits with them.
5. Brigades and D.A.C. (together with T.M. Batteries) will move from SPRING GARDENS and OVILLERS HUTS on morning of 21st inst. They will bivouac in vicinity of wagon-lines of Units they are to relieve (see Appendix) until relief takes place.
6. (i). 1st F.A. Bde will be clear of SPRING GARDENS by 8 a.m.  
2nd F.A. Bde will be clear of OVILLERS HUTS by 8.30 a.m.  
D.A.C. will be clear of OVILLERS HUTS by 9 a.m.  
(ii) Intervals of 200 yards will be maintained between batteries and sections of the D.A.C. on the march.
7. Brigade Commanders will report to C.R.A. 48th Division at I.34.A.2.5 at 9 a.m. on 22nd inst., and will receive detailed instructions concerning times of relief from him.
8. C.R.A., 1st Australian Divisional Artillery will take over command of the sector from C.R.A. 48th Division on morning of June 24th. Until then Headquarters 1st Australian Divisional Artillery will remain at BAVELINCOURT.
9. Details of relief of Trench Mortars will be arranged direct between D.T.M.O's. D.T.M.O 1st Aust. Div. will get in touch with D.T.M.C. 48th Division as early as possible.


