	22:12:18		Lieut-General HOBBS, the G.O.C. Aust. Corps, while passing through the village of MORIAUME saw the Div. Artillery Guard, Lieut. L.C.WADE, Adjutant 2nd F.A.Brigade, is the Officer in charge of the Guard and was complimented of the smartness of turn-out and work of the Guard by General HOBBS.

	25:12:18		A Merry Christmas was spent by all ranks of the 1st Aust. Div. Arty.; each Battery had its own Christmas Dinner so arranged for the whole Battery to be seated at one sitting.	
	26:12:18		Final arrangements were made for the parade to be held to-morrow, when H.R.H. the Prince of Wales would present medals and review the 1st Aust. Div. Artillery.	
	27:12:18		Units were formed up on the parade ground in good time; H.R.H. the Prince of Wales' car drove up and was escorted for the last half mile by a mounted escort drawn from the 1st Aust. Div. Arty. and the 3rd Army Brigade A.F.A. The Escort was very well trained by Capt. SHALDERS and proved itself by its correctness of turn-out and movements. On arrival at the parade ground the Guard of Honour was inspected by H.R.H. the Prince of Wales; this also had been drawn from the 1st Aust. Div. Arty. and the 3rd Army Brigade A.F.A. and was trained and commanded by Lieut. L.C.WADE. The marching and smartness of this Guard could not be improved on. H.R.H. the Prince of Wales inspected the parade (1st Aust. Div. Arty. and the 3rd Army Brigade A.F.A.) then the whole parade marched past by Sections and formed up again; then advanced in Review Order; the flanks were then swung round and three (3) sides of a hollow square formed; H.R.H. the Prince of Wales then presented medals to men of the 1st Aust. Div. Arty. and 3rd Army Bde. A.F.A. After the presentation of medals the parade was dismissed and a mule flat race and a mule hurdle race were run; Unfortunately the day was very cold and towards the end of the parade it rained; no man on the parade was cloaked and H.R.H. the Prince of Wales earned the admiration of all by refusing his coat when the rain started.

GENERAL SUMMARY OF THE MONTH'S WORK.

On the 6th December 1918 Brig-General H.W.LLOYD, C.M.G., D.S.O. took over the command of the 1st Div. Artillery from Brig-General S.M.ANDERSON, D.S.O. who proceeded on 75 days leave to ENGLAND.

The Divisional Artillery moved from the SOLRE area to the MORIALME area on the 15th, 16th and 17th. All units were very comfortably housed, horses stabled and a large majority of the men got good accommodation in the shape of comfortable beds, many of them with sheets on.

The Divisional Artillery has been inspected by the Divisional Commander who has expressed his satisfaction for the general turnout and smartness of all ranks.


On the 27th inst. the Divisional Artillery was inspected by H.R.H. the Prince of Wales. He expressed his satisfaction at seeing such a splendid turn-out despite the bad weather prevailing at the time of the Parade.

The Mounted Escort was trained by Capt. SHALDERS, M.C., 3rd Army Brigade A.F.A. and a Guard of Honour was trained by Lieut. L.C.WADE, Adjutant 2nd F.A.Brigade. This Escort and Guard were both inspected by the Prince of Wales and very highly praised.

Many football matches have been arranged and played, and every effort is being put forward to give the troops as much sport and relaxation as possible.

The Div. Artillery Band and Orchestra are both well trained and prove very helpful in entertaining the troops. The Div. Arty. Orchestra was complimented by H.R.H. the Prince of Wales after giving a performance at Divisional Headquarters when the Prince of Wales was dining there.

The spirit of the whole 1st Div. Artillery is at a very high standard and all men appear to be very happy and contented.

ROUGH NOTES FOR ASSISTANCE IN PACKING VEHICLES AND TURN OUT CENTRALLY.

HATS	Pinched turned up and worn smartly.
CLOTHING	Clean and treated with petrol where necessary; in repair; complete with buttons and colour patches.
TREACOAT	Under accoutrements; when worn; complete with colour patches as soon as practicable.
WATER BOTTLE	Strap passing also over left shoulder.
HAVERSACK	Resting on right thigh; not too long.
GAS RESPIRATOR	Strap may come from lower corner of Respirator on left side; Respirator to be worn well up on back.
ENAMEL MUGS.	Not to be seen dangling from equipment.
PACK	An Infantry pack per man for creature comforts and spare things may be carried, to hang .... neatly over rear of carriage. Limber of wagon body will take three packs.
STEEL HELMETS	Of Drivers on off side of off horse of teams; attached to surcingle and resting on waterproof sheet.
BLANKETS and WATERPROOF SHEETS	Of Drivers, blankets folded backwards and forwards (not over and over) edges coincident; waterproof sheet folded similarly in slightly smaller folds leaving about $1/2$ inch of blanket margin, or waterproof sheet may neatly enclose all but <del>under</del> blanket, at discretion of Battery Commander; sheet must on no account rest on horses back.
NOSE BAGS	Rolled round and compact; tight up against rear arch of saddle.
WHIPS	Complete. While waiting completion substitutes carefully arranged by Section Officers.
LINKS	On front end of traces tied up to rings on breast collars.
BITS	Clean always, even when other harness cannot be properly tended.
THROAT LASHES	Easy.
MESS TINS	Of Drivers, behind nose bags, lids uppermost, holes to the rear.
VEHICLES	Stores on vehicles clean and neatly arranged. Straps on body complete, points inwards and downwards, ends not rolled but tucked under blankets etc. Drag ropes clean and wound neatly round brackets or laths on footboards. Mess tins on hand guard leathers of carriage, holes up and lids inwards. Blankets folded smaller than space between strap brackets, flattened and enclosed in waterproof sheet,

**VEHICLES** Greatcoats neatly folded and flattened.  
**(contd.)** Helmets resting on flattened top of greatcoat with st crossed over crown of helmets. (or when packs are complete, on pack).  
Stores cared for in small store trays on carriages.  
Ammunition clean, not oiled; howitzer driving bands free from dirt.



INSTRUCTION No. 1.

On arrival in the new area the following points will receive attention :-

1. Guns and wagons will be parked at close interval.
2. Vehicles will be stripped and washed.
3. Drag-ropes will be replaced on brackets on the footboards. Balance of equipment after being cleaned will be put into Quartermaster Sergeant's Store. Racks for rifles will be built in the Quartermaster's store and all rifles except those for Guards will be kept there.  
A Fitters' and Saddlers' Shop will be established in each Battery. The Quartermaster Sergeant will be responsible for these shops under the direction of the Battery Captain.
4. Ceremonial (Foot Parades) will be practiced at special times during the morning. Officers and N.C.O.s. should know their positions on Ceremonial Parades, Guards, etc. All parades will be conducted regimentally.
5. SALUTING. The practice of saluting all Officers must be instilled into all ranks. It should be explained to them that it is no disgrace and that it should be done instinctively and smartly. When moving in groups (not in form of Parade) all men salute. If standing the ~~sir~~ must call them to Attention and salute. It is the duty of all Officers to return salutes properly. They should be an example in this respect.
6. BILLETS. It is expected that Billets will be clean with kits properly arranged and fit for inspection by 9 a.m. daily and that they remain so until 4 p.m. Boxes and receptacles will be provided in all Billets for odds and ends (such as candles, papers, etc.) that tend to untidiness.
7. If practicable arrangements should be made for messing and recreation rooms for Batteries. Tables and forms should be provided and endeavour made to make the rooms attractive.
8. Cookhouses should be provided with ovens so that the diet may be varied by providing roasts, etc.
9. Officers, not men, should be paraded and dealt with for untidiness, etc., as they are responsible for the behaviour of those under them.

TRAINING No/1/.

1. The training of the troops during the period of an Armistice and during demobilisation is of the first importance. The object of such training must be -
  - (i) To maintain a high standard of discipline and to prepare for the resumption of hostilities should this take place.
  - (ii) To fit those returning to civil life for their future occupation.
2. Training will therefore consist of
  - (a) Military training.
  - (b) Educational and vocational training.
  - (c) Recreational training.
3. The Divisional Commander desires to emphasise the necessity of maintaining the military standard of efficiency and a proportion of the time must be devoted to purely military training. To effect this, strict attention will be paid to ceremonial within Units - Guard mounting, sentry duties, stable watering and exercise parade, saluting and dress. Ceremonial parades and Brigades reviews will also form part of programme of military training. There must be at least one parade each day and all troops going to Educational or Vocational training should do so under parade conditions. They must be inspected before moving off at least once each day.
4. Educational training will be carried out in all Units on lines laid down.  
Recreational training will be encouraged by the organisation of competitions in football, running, boxing etc.; in all formations.  
It is proposed that the mornings be devoted to Military training and the afternoons to Recreational and Educational training less personnel required for stables, guards, etc.
5. In order that the necessary military training and duties may be got into the morning it must be impressed on all ranks that while working they must put their backs into it as it is not desired to cut into the afternoon.
6. Brigade and D.A.C. Commanders will forward to this Office each Friday a programme of training prepared for ensuing week. This programme will show both military training and recreational arrangements (football fixtures etc.).



REVIEW ORDER NO. 1

First Australian Divisional Artillery Review Order No. 1,

1. Paragraph 5 of the above Order is cancelled and the following substituted :-

On the 27th inst. Units will arrive on the Review Ground punctually as follows :-

10.30 a.m.	1st F.A. Brigade
10.35 a.m.	2nd F.A. Brigade
10.40 a.m.	3rd Army Brigade
10.45 a.m.	1st D.I.C.
10.46 a.m.	3rd D.I.C.

2. STRENGTH. Batteries, Sections of D.I.C. and 3rd B.I.C. will each turn out 34 Other Ranks, and in addition 1 Sergeant to 10 Other Ranks exclusive of Battery Sergeant-Majors, Garrison Sergeants, etc.

3. Paragraph 8 of Review Order No. 1 is cancelled and the following substituted :-

Programme is as follows :-

- (a) H.R.H. the Prince of Wales will approach by motor car from direction of MORIAME along the main MORIAME - LEPRET road.  
(b) The mounted Escort under Capt. T.R. SHALDRIS, D.C. will meet H.R.H. at cross-roads S.H. 30.53 at 11.15 a.m. and escort him at the trot to point S.H. 45.55 where H.R.H. will be received by Guard of Honour under Lieut. L.C. WADE. The Guard of Honour will give a General Salute as the Corps Commander will be present and will take the salute.  
(c) After leaving the Guard the party moves to the Saluting Base. On arrival the General Salute will be given and taken by the Corps Commander.  
Flag at Saluting Base will be broken out.  
(d) H.R.H. then inspects the Artillery.  
(e) During the time H.R.H. is inspecting the Artillery the Guard will move and take post directly in rear of Saluting Base.  
(f) After the inspection Officers will be ordered to take post and the Artillery will march past; Brigades in column of Sections, D.I.C. and B.I.C. will conform.  
Salute will commence 10 paces from the Reviewing Officer (The Corps Commander) and finish 10 paces beyond him.  
Section Commanders will give the order "Eyes right" and later "Eyes front".

Adjutants are responsible up to marker 'A' that their Units are at proper distance. On arrival of their last Unit at marker 'A' they will place themselves 5 paces in rear of it and covering the right flank man.

- (g) After the March past the Artillery will reform on original alignment. They will then advance in review order and give the General Salute which will be taken by the Corps Commander.  
(h) 1st F.A. Brigade and 1st D.I.C. will then be ordered to left and right wheel respectively. H.R.H. then presents medals to those to be decorated.

Officers, N.C.Os. and Other Ranks to be decorated will form up 15 paces in front and in the centre of 2nd F.A. Brigade and 3rd Army Brigade A.F... in line; Officers 2 paces in front of N.C.Os. and men.

On their name being called out they will advance towards the Dais and when 5 paces from H.R.H. will halt and salute, then move forward to be decorated. After being decorated they will step back 3 paces and salute, right turn and march back to the position they started from.
