Extract from G.R.O. No. 4208 reads:- The following warning against the collection or communication of Naval or military information will be brought to the notice of all ranks, and its provision will be strictly observed:

NOTICE.

The attention of the public is drawn to clause XV of the Military proclamation dated 14th May, 1916 as under:-

15. "All information as to numbers, disposition, equipment, organisation or movements of any of His Majesty's Forces, or as to the military operations or military plans, or means of defence of His Majesty or of any of His Majesty's Allies, or otherwise as to matters of military interest, shall be deemed to be susceptible of being of assistance to the enemy. No person shall attempt to collect information as to any such matters as aforesaid. No person who shall, whether lawfully or otherwise, be in possession of any such information as aforesaid which is of a confidential nature shall communicate the same to any person other than a person whom he knows to be entitled to have knowledge of the same. No person shall make public or communicate to any other person any such information as aforesaid, not being information of a confidential character, unless he shall have good reason to believe that there is no reasonable possibility that the making public thereof or the communication thereof to the person to whom it is communicated can be of assistance to the enemy or can otherwise prejudice the military interests of Great Britain. And no person shall seek to elicit any such information as aforesaid from any person who, by either of the two paragraphs last preceding, is forbidden to communicate the same to him."

The word "military" includes "naval". All ranks of His Majesty's services and the public are therefore warned that it is an offence under Martial Law to attempt to collect information or to communicate same (either by letter, telegraph or telephone or any other means) respecting the movements of ships of any kind or their arrival or departure at any port except in conformity with the clauses of the aforesaid Proclamation.

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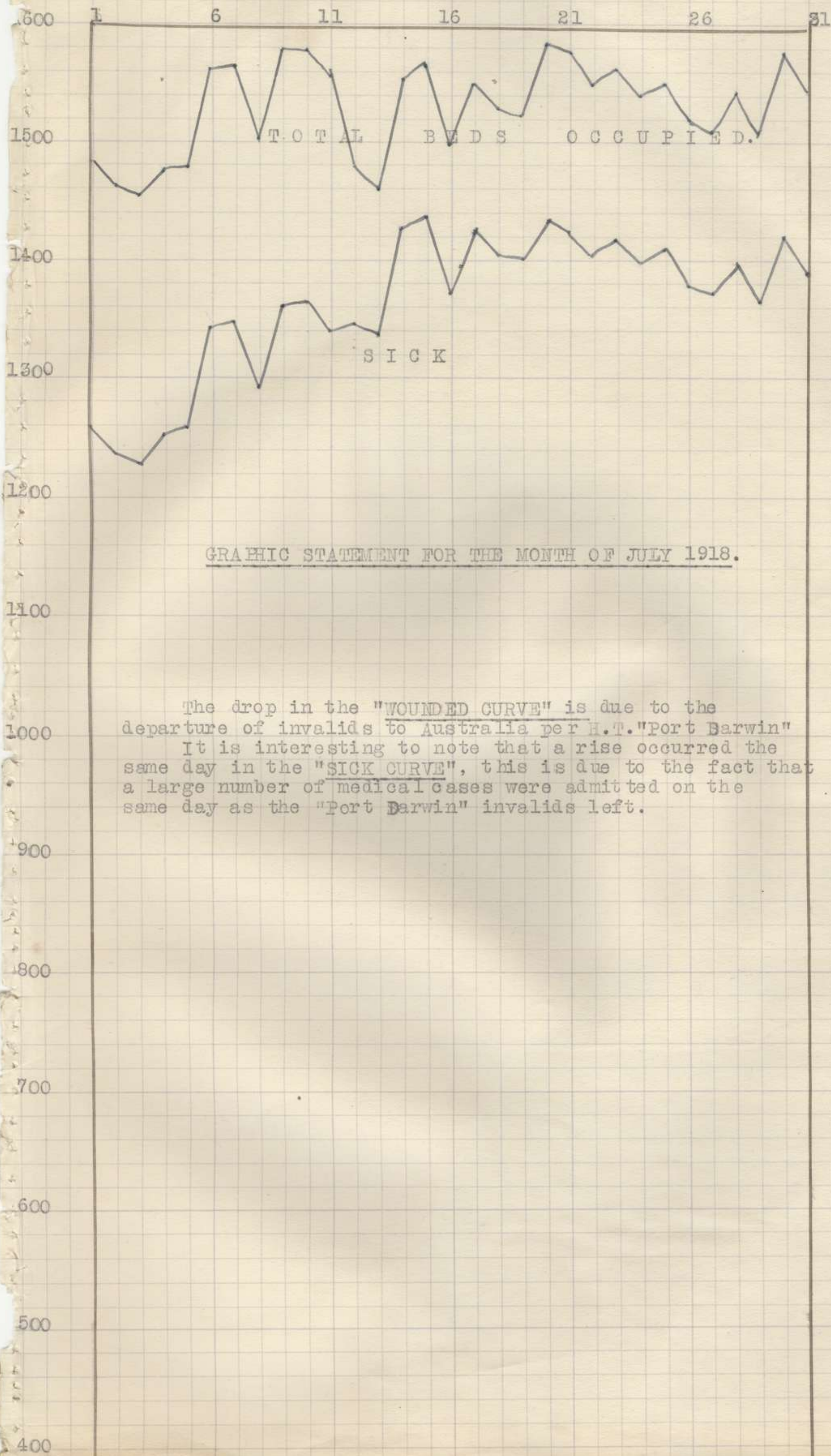

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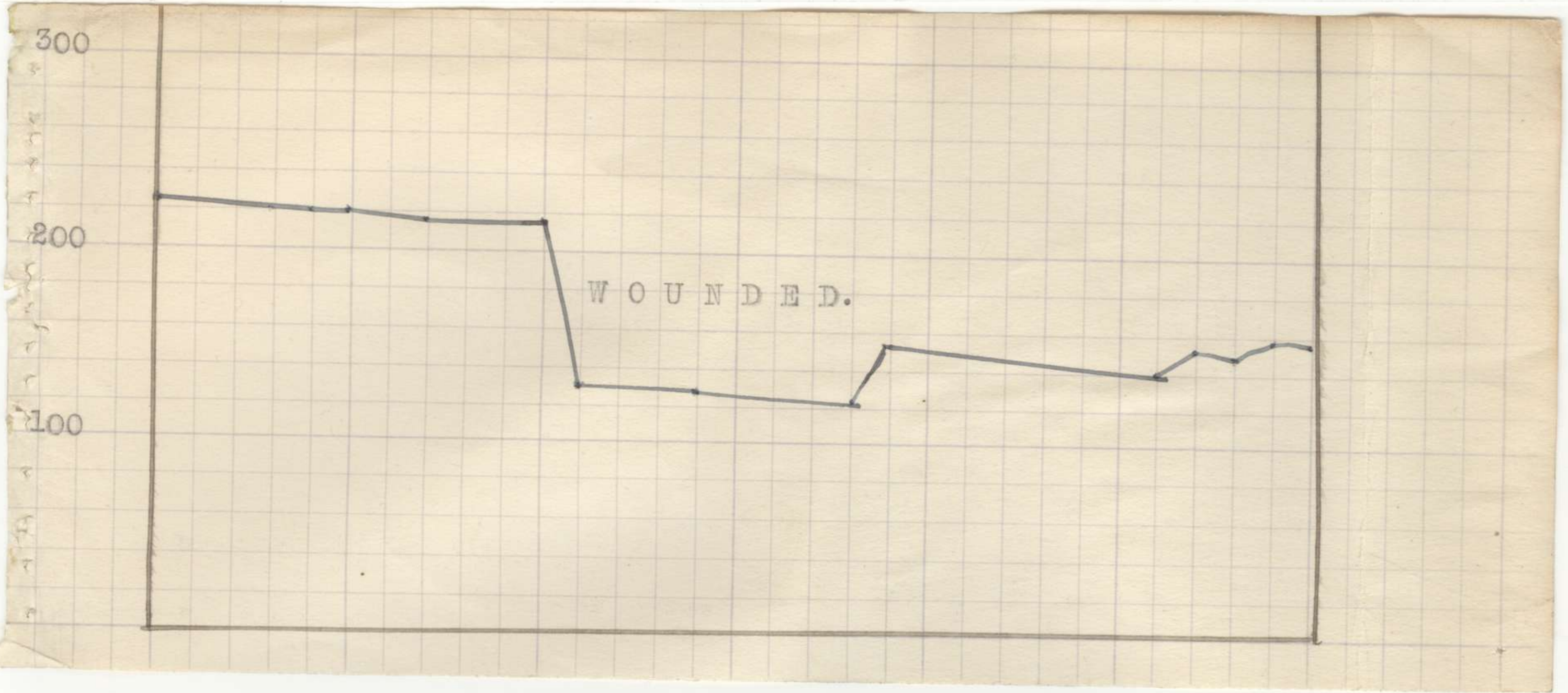


GRAPHIC STATEMENT FOR THE MONTH OF JULY 1918.

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The following comments and the suggestions made are based on the experience of this Unit working on the L of C. for a period of six months with the scale of equipment as laid down in Army Form G1098 - 65A of April 1917.

Aprons, cooks', dowlas, }  
Frocks, dowlas }  
Trousers, duck, universal } The supply of these for the use of the cooks employed was not found sufficient. The number of each at all times in the wash, and others unserviceable, with the very dirty coal supplied for fires must be taken into account when laying down the number of each of these. An increase of at least 100% is recommended.

Aprons, operating

These are very often used by pantry orderlies to save their clothing and for cleanliness as overalls are not provided, consequently some of the aprons in use in the operating theatres are not as clean as could be desired. It is recommended that an overall of some distinctive pattern of material be supplied for use of pantry orderlies and that at least 300 be placed on the M.S. Table.

Basins, enamel, iron, 6"

Quite a number of these are in use in the wards for dressing bowls and for sterilizing dressings. This points to a shortage of proper dressing bowls or that the one quoted is a better one for the purpose. It is at present confusing and difficult to decide whether the 6" basin is going to be used for a dressing or a milk diet, perhaps a deep good sized soup plate could take the place of the 6" basin for diets.

Baths, open, long

In a climate such as this, and for large convoy work the number of these could very well be increased by 100%

Bins, ash, moveable, small

These very useful and necessary adjuncts do not appear on the M.S. Table and it is strongly advised that they be included in the proportion of 2% of beds for the hospital itself with 20 as a fixed scale for kitchens, messes, etc. When the unit moves smaller stores can be packed in them.

Blocks, chopping, small  
Boards, chopping  
(For kitchen use)

It has been found that these are necessary. The first named at the main ~~xxx~~ kitchen where quite a lot of butchers work has to be done, and the boards, chopping, one for each ward for pantry use.

Bowls, sugar

Are recommended for inclusion either in enamelware or glass for use in Officers' Wards. It will be noted that tongs, sugar, are on the M.S. Table but sugar basins are not included.

Carts, hand, common  
Barrows, wheel

Some form of vehicle to permit of manual transport of stores is necessary. At present the ambulance stretchers play many parts, but it takes two men, whereas with either of the stores mentioned one man could do a lot of work. It is recommended that they be put in the M.S.T. "as required" up to, in the case of Carts, hand, common, 3 per 1040 beds, and in the case of barrows, wheel, 4 per 1040 beds.

Refrigerators,  
Machine, ice

It is thought by the experience here of at all times being able to obtain supplies of ice from the A.S.C. than an ice machine on the M.S.T. of a General Hospital is not likely to be required. By refrigerators it

Refrigerators. Machine, ice	is taken is meant the ordinary ice chests which have been supplied here. These can very well be increased in this climate. It is recommended that they should be "as required" up to 1% of beds for hospital use with three large ones for provision department.
Dishes, baking	Please see remarks under Stoves, portable.
Dishes, butter, enamel	Not used at this hospital and can therefore be deleted.
Disinfectors, portable	Where this store is "The Thresh" disinfector it is recommended that one for every 750 beds be supplied. See notes under " Lamps, candlesticks etc."
Drawers, flannel	Not used. Climate unsuitable with the present hospital clothing. See remarks under Hospital clothing.
Forge, field, G.S.	This very useful store is specially recommended for inclusion in the M.S. Table. The experience of this unit since coming to this station has more than proved the necessity for including this store, as as the Unit has to be as nearly as possible self-contained. The field forge supplied to this unit has been of the greatest assistance.
Lamps, brazing	The remarks under the heading of Forge, field apply equally well to this store, in addition to which attention is drawn to the very necessary work performed by this store during the past month. Some of the wards and furniture were found to be very badly infested with bugs, and the best of results was obtained by using the brazing lamp wherever possible.
Forks, carving Forks, flesh Knives, cooks Ladles, cooks Slices, fish or egg	Where the diets are made out on to the different plates, basins etc in the wards, as happens here, an increase of these stores is recommended to 2% of beds of each store, for use in ward pantries. This not to include the number at present allowed for kitchen use.
Games	To be deleted as Red Cross and other Societies supply sufficient of such.
Grater, nutmeg	To be included for kitchen use in preparation of milk puddings, etc, the vegetable grater already on the M.S.T. being too coarse for nutmegs.
Grindstone.	This was found to be a very necessary store for general use but more particularly for sharpening of all kitchen implements requiring sharp edges.
Mosquito nets & hoops	An essential store for this part of the world, <del>not</del> if not for all parts. The number supplied should be one for each bed with 5% in addition to allow for washing, and the exchanging of unserviceable.
Implements, butchers Balances, spring.	The scale as laid down could be made more serviceable by making the spring balances 10 lbs instead of 4 lbs and the number of balances, spring, of 30 lbs could be increased with advantage by 100%
Jugs, enamel, 1 qrt " " 2 qrt	The number allowed is totally inadequate for ward use. The number recommended in each size is 4% of beds.

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Jugs, enamel, 4 qrts A large jug for conveyance of hot water, sterilizing fluids etc is constantly required in wards and it is recommended that these be added to the M.S.T. in the proportion of 1% of beds.

Kettles, fish, copper or enamel, large Are recommended for inclusion in M.S.T. in the proportion of 2% of beds, for use as ward sterilising apparatus. A few in use at this hospital. (supplied from outside funds) have been found most valuable in saving time and trouble.

Knives, opening tins This store should be a combination of Corkscrew, tin opener, and bottle cap remover.

Machine, bread-cutting, small . Recommended for inclusion in the M.S.T. in proportion of 1% of beds. The machines in use here (provided from outside funds) have been the means of saving much bread etc that otherwise would have been wasted.

Machine, weighing, platform 1000 lbs Found very necessary for use in provision store owing to large stocks of provisions coming in daily in boxes, crates etc. Could be well included and marked "as required" 1 per unit.

Mops, common, heads  
Mops, common, handles Where the hospital is located in buildings or tents with floors other than canvas the number laid down is inadequate and under such circumstances could well be made of 10% of beds.

Pans, dust This store ~~XXXX~~ has been found very useful especially as tins of any sort cannot be cut down and used. 1% of beds is recommended.

Pots, chamber, enamel Not used.

Safes, bread )  
Safes, meat ) Small are recommended for ward pantries say 2% of beds.

Saucepan, iron, tinned 2 quart An increase is recommended to allow of one for each pantry say 2% of beds. Quite a large number are in use here in preparing diets at the wards for patients.

Saucepans, F.A. (Nests of 8) Not wanted if Saucepans I.T. 2 quart are provided for ward use.

Screens, bedside. An increase is badly needed 8% of beds is recommended.

Screens, bedside, Covers for These it is recommended should be removable and easy to wash and an allowance made in the number supplied to allow of some going to laundry.

Skewers It is recommended that this read:- Skewers, iron, tinned, large - 36 for kitchen use.

Skewers , 12 to a set Delete.

Slices, fish, 5 inch Increase of 300% recommended.

Slippers, leather, prs Not used at this hospital. The few patients able to get about who cannot wear boots are provided with canvas shoes by Australian Red Cross Society.

Sponges, bath Not required.

sterilizers, milk, 100 gals. Should be included and made "as required" 2 per unit of 1040 beds.

Stoves, portable.

These, as far as General Hospitals go, can be cut out as they are far too small and would necessitate a lot of fuel being used and a very large increase in the amount of labour employed.

As General Hospitals cannot be said to be mobile units it is recommended that large size kitchen stoves be provided, all of a standard ~~xxxxix~~ pattern and size so that all dishes, baking etc can be of a regulation size, and all parts would be interchangeable. By the adoption of a standard stove all the parts could be numbered thus saving time and labour when indenting for new parts to replace broken or unserviceable parts.

From the experience of this unit "Wiles Cookers" could very well be adopted. They are compact, efficient, occupy very little space and can be portable or otherwise as required. Owing to the number of different diets at a hospital it would be necessary to allow of one "Wiles Cooker" to 500 patients. For economy of fuel the "Wiles" stands out on its own and very considerable savings would be effected in the quantity of fuel consumed.

Cupboard, medicine )  
Cupboard, linen ) Both these stores are made very much use of by this unit. They are not at present on the table and are usually obtained from R.E. It is recommended that they be put on the M.S. Table in the proportion of 2% of beds of each.

These cupboards could be made strong and could very well be used to pack stores in for transport, in the event of the unit having to move, or for the transport of stores from Ordnance to place of mobilization etc.

They are a very essential part of ward furniture, and should be available immediately the unit is mobilized, or takes in patients.

Stoves, oil, "Primus". No 5 .

An increase of at least 200% is recommended. In Egypt the primus stove is absolutely essential to good ward work, and is indispensable. The "Primus" is going night and day and with the very thick crude paraffin at present being used many of the stoves are constantly needing attention, and for this reason alone an increase in the table is required.

Stoves, oil, Primus No 5. Parts for.

Provision should be made in the table for a ~~small~~ supply of all the small parts. that are usually easily replaced when worn, and for the necessary tools for carrying out this work. The experience of this unit by employing a plumber from among the staff to replace worn parts and to overhaul the stoves has proved what a boon having these parts is, not to mention the time saved in sending everything back to Ordnance for repair. Situated as this unit is, to send everything back to Ordnance would be a fearful waste of time and a probable cause of long delays.

HOSPITAL CLOTHING For the greater part of the year in this climate  
 Hospital blue serge suits are too heavy, also flannel shirts, and  
 drawers are not used. This could probably be allowed for by substituting  
 other material in tropical climates; see remarks further on about making  
 M.S.T. under different headings.

Provision should be made for the supply of flanelette  
 (in this climate) and flannel (in cold climate) pyjama suits for patients  
 to sleep in. As no provision is made for such at present patients have  
 to sleep in their shirts. With this hospital the Australian Red Cross  
 Society provide flanelette pyjamas and they are very much appreciated  
 and save the hospital shirts etc.

LINEN . It has been found that the quantity of linen allowed is  
 barely sufficient, when the time taken up by laundry work is considered,  
 along with the time taken to replace unserviceable articles. An increase  
 of from 20 to 25% is recommended on all articles that are constantly  
 being washed.

MATTRESSES At this hospital where "Biscuits" are in use two biscuits  
 are used on a bed instead of three, as by putting two biscuits  
 lengthwise on the bedstead with a bolster, it is quite sufficient,  
 thus saving one biscuit and a bolster case which is not needed. This  
 is not the case where Mattrass S.S. is in use.

Lamps, Candlesticks, etc. It is generally recognised that a General Hospital is not a Mobile Unit, consequently consideration can be given to the provision of lighting other than by kerosene lamps or wax candles. When it is taken into consideration that a General Hospital has two or more departments using electricity i.e. X Ray, Electro-Therapeutical, it would seem worth while for the provision of electricity for electric lighting of the hospital, and in this climate for electric fans, and to provide the current for the departments mentioned.

An electric generator sufficient to provide electricity for the lighting, fans, X Ray & Electro-Therapy would not require to be such a large one. It is suggested that such be provided and to supply the motive power to drive the generator that a portable steam engine be provided (A disused steam tractor or something of that sort would do). A steam engine is recommended because it is thought that if such steam engine is available, then by providing some sort of steam tight box or cabinet the "Thresh" disinfecter could be done without. The "Thresh" has a very limited capacity and many articles of hospital furniture cannot be put into it. Also owing to this limited capacity it is very slow work where much has to be done. The "Thresh" is also very heavy to move and can just be termed portable.

If a portable steam engine can be provided to drive the electric generator, and also to provide steam for a disinfecter, it will be possible to have the disinfecter of sufficient size that most of the difficulties in connection with the "Thresh" would be done away with. If necessary this box disinfecter could be put on small wide wheels and so with the engine be a portable apparatus.

It would not be necessary to limit the scope of the ~~xxxx~~ steam engine to the generator and disinfecter, no doubt other uses could be made of it.

A much more compact motive power plant could be provided by an internal combustion engine either paraffin or petrol, but this could not in any way provide steam for a disinfecter hence the recommendation of a portable steam engine.

Provision would necessarily have to be made for wire, electric lamps, insulators, switches etc and from the point of expense no doubt would appear a formidable item but no doubt after the initial expenditure a saving in upkeep would manifest itself. In any case the advantages of electric light are obvious over the present system of hurricane lamps. with all their dirty connections, risk of fire, and poor light. and the labour involved with them.

The whole of this plant could appear on the M.S.T. "as required" as where electric current is available from existing supplies no doubt it will always be used.

#### General

~~XXXXXXXX~~ There is great difficulty in trying to make one Mobilization Store Table do for all General Hospitals whether in buildings or tents, or partly in each, and for all climates. Perhaps the difficulty might be lessened if the M.S.T. were made in four columns. The first column being Cold climates, 2nd. Tropical Climates, 3rd. & 4th columns Women Nurses, Cold and Tropical Climates respectively. It is not thought advisable to try and make the table also meet the case of buildings or tents; as stores not suitable to the particular case need not be drawn and on the other hand the stores laid down on the table may be used pending receipt of other stores more suitable and which could be indented for as a special case.

From the suggestions and recommendations made here it may be seen that the personnel establishment provided for a General Hospital might require attention. From the experience gained that is so and the following alterations are recommended. A carpenter to be provided and to be paid Special Duty or working pay at rate of 6d per day. A blacksmith or Ironworker; able to do all kinds of brazing, brass working, and possessing a working knowledge of fitters work to be provided and to be paid special duty or working pay at rate of 6d. per day. An electrician to be provided and to be paid special duty pay at rate of 6d. per day. At the present time at this hospital a carpenter is constantly employed, also an iron worker, both members of the unit but not drawing any working pay. There is also an electrician employed at the hospital but he is a civilian and employed by the R.E. It would hardly be necessary to pay any special duty or working pay to the men detailed to look after the steam engine.

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General. Continued. Whether the notice plant is installed or not the recommendations regarding the carpenter and the blacksmith being shown on the establishment are worthy of consideration.

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Carpenters & Ironworkers tools.

A more complete and varied set of carpenter's tools should be provided for on the M.S.T. than the chest at present provided and by the experience here, ironworkers tools sufficient for such work as would be carried out in repair of hospital equipment, making and altering of wire and iron splints etc, should also be provided for on the M.S.T.

Bootmaker & Bootmaker's Tools. It is recommended that a bootmaker be added to the establishment of a General Hospital and that working pay or special duty pay at 6d. per day be allowed. Provision to be made on the M.S.T. for a complete set of bootmaker's tools. a bootmaker in this unit is constantly employed in repairing the boots of the staff, and making alterations to boots for patients as ordered by the surgeons in charge of wards.

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PROVISION & EXPENSE STORES

EGGS.

The supply of eggs has been most unsatisfactory during past month a very high percentage, up to 10%, of stale eggs being found in one days consignment. As eggs are one of the main items of diet throughout the hospital this supply of bad eggs causes not only annoyance but great inconvenience. The contractor has also been making short deliveries i.e. sending crates marked 1,000 which on being opened have been found to contain nine hundred only. O.C., A.S.C. has been notified of the matter and requested to place the supply on a more satisfactory basis.

FRESH FISH.

The scheme of supplying fresh fish from the local fisheries has not been satisfactory up to date. The supply is too uncertain; during the past month there has been no fish supplied on six different days. The non-delivery means that patients specially requiring fish as part of their treatment are deprived of same.

MILK.

The supply of "Ideal" milk has been curtailed owing to shortage of stocks in Egypt. Sweetened condensed milk has had to be issued for milk diets and has not been found satisfactory. Steps have been taken to ensure as regular a supply of "Ideal" brand as possible by O.C., A.S.C. and it is understood that a further trial is to be given to fresh milk from contractor in a few days.

CLEANING MATERIALS.

Report of the Medical Department of the 14th A.G.H. for July 1918.

The past month has been an exceptionally busy one as the medical wards have received 1066 out of the 1308 patients admitted to the hospital.

The whole staff has, however, worked so keenly that the extra strain has not led to any disorganisation.

The only death was due to acute septicaemia with multiple pyaemic abscesses in the lungs in a patient who developed a rapidly spreading cellulitis from some septic sores on his forearm and hand while convalescing from a mild attack of B.T. Malaria.

There have been some changes in the Medical Staff. Capt. Anderson who has recently been in charge of one of the medical wards has gone to the field and his ward has been taken over by Capt. Ahern. Major. Arnold who has had charge of the Convalescent ward for some months has been placed in charge of one of the medical wards and his place at the convalescent ward has been taken by Capt. Leahy who has just rejoined the staff. I wish to make special mention of the extremely capable way in which Major Arnold has managed the Convalescent department of the hospital and I am confident that the popularity it enjoys is largely due to his personal influence and enthusiasm.

Admissions for malaria have continued to be very numerous the great majority of the cases being received from Palestine though there have been quite a number of patients admitted with this disease from among the British Troops stationed at Port Said. Most of these latter have been apparently cases of relapse in men infected elsewhere. In the case, however, of one of the members of the Hospital staff who was found to be infected with the B.T. parasite the infection was clearly of local origin. Though not very numerous, a fair number of anopheles have been noticed about the Hospital. Since the Australian Troops have been operating about the Jordan Valley the number of cases coming to the base with the diagnosis Pyrexia N.Y.D. has increased so noticeably that there is no doubt that in very many of them the correct diagnosis is malaria. Quinine has been given to most of the patients at first but stopped after one or two negative blood findings and on arrival here the problem arises as to what is the most economical plan to adopt from the point of view of man power. As in several instances definite malaria has developed after two or three weeks interval we have now instituted the plan of treating as "clinical" malaria all patients with the above diagnosis whose state of general health is such that they are likely to be three or four weeks before being fit for duty, but to allow those who seem to be practically well on arrival to go to Convalescent Depots without further treatment.

The plan of treatment officially laid down has been strictly carried out and seems to be giving very satisfactory results. In all cases of M.T. infections in which the full course of three intramuscular injections has not ~~given~~ been given on the way to the base three more injections are given on arrival even if the condition is a febrile and the same plan is adopted where relapse takes place under oral treatment for either B.T. or M.T. malaria. Every case receives arsenic and most of them iron in addition to the Quinine.

In a few cases the parasites of quartan fever has been recognised. A considerable number of cases of dysentery both bacillary and amoebic have been admitted and some have been very acute but all the patients seem to be making good progress. There are in the wards at present a few cases of very persistently recurring diarrhoea of a type that gives more difficulty in effecting a complete cure than the more acute dysentery cases in some of these either Trichomonas or Tetramitis have been constantly present in the stools.

Cases of dry pleurisy with but slight general symptoms are still being admitted but in much smaller numbers than two months back. The number this month was seven.

Cases of particular interest have been.

- (1) A case of acromiagaly with typical clinical and X Ray features in a man who has been 2 years on service.
- (2) A patient admitted with signs of broncho-pneumonia affecting both lungs, who, when practically convalescent, coughed up typical pus from a liver abscess and who now, after treatment with emetine, is apparently quite well.
- (3) A case of tetanus in a private stationed in port said who cut his foot while bathing and who developed signs of cerebro-spinal meningitis in addition and is at present in a desperate condition. The organisms causing the meningitis so far has not been identified as it will not grow on any of the ordinary culture media.

The cause of death in the one fatal case was meningitis following fractured base of skull. (Ethmoid bones and frontal sinus) from an aeroplane accident. An interesting feature of this case was the absence of any signs of concussion following the accident although the ethmoid was extensively shattered, a fracture of the frontal bone extending into both frontal sinuses and a laceration of the L. frontal lobe revealed post mortem.

An interesting case admitted under Major Brown's care was a ruptured spleen with intra-abdominal haemorrhage. The laceration in the spleen was sutured and the patient made a good recovery.

Amongst the cases that returned to Australia, was an interesting one, Capt. S. of G.S.W. pelvis followed by arterio-venous aneurysm of the Sciatic A and Vein. with paresis of muscle supplied by the right sciatic N. and hyperaesthesia of skin of leg and foot with bluish black discolouration of skin over heel and ball of foot (trophic lesion). The intl. iliac A was tied and the Sciatic Artery as it emerged from the aneurysm. The thin sac was dissected off the Sciatic Nerve to which it was adherent., the nerve itself appeared uninjured. The aneurysmal sac extended through the sciatic foramen into the pelvis and could not be dissected out. in fact was so thin walled that it tore very readily and bled freely from regurgitation along the dilated intl. iliac vein. The patient made a good recovery, the aneurysm was cured, the severe intolerable pain disappeared and the paresis of the leg and foot muscles had much improved when he left for Australia.

In this case I think it would have been perhaps wiser to have tied the dilated intl. iliac vein before attempting to dissect out the sac., for although the intl. iliac artery had ~~not been tied~~ been tied the haemorrhage from the sac was not easily controlled. (Unfortunately the hospital does not possess Crile's artery clamps, they have been twice requisitioned for but are unobtainable in Egypt).

The treatment of Arterio-venous aneurysm is not an easy one and authorities seem much divided as to the correct procedure. No doubt to dissect out the aneurysmal sac and repair the torn artery and vein is an ideal, but it must seldom be practicable, at any rate has seemed quite utopian in the seven or eight case I have seen here.

In the case of the main artery and vein of a limb (e.g. femoral and popliteal) Makin advocates ligature of both artery and vein above and below the sac and dissecting out the sac and this procedure seems to be finding favour. In the only instance in which this teaching was followed at the 14th A.G.H. the result was disastrous extensive gangrene following on ligature of both artery and vein in a popliteal arterio-venous aneurysm

Whereas in two cases in which the Femoral artery was tied in Hunter's canal an apparent cure resulted. (I say apparent because as both patients were boarded to Australia their after history could not be followed.)

PATHOLOGICAL REPORT.

The month of July has again shown an increase in the total number of examinations made.

Malaria is still increasing, 137 cases being positive out of 581 examinations.

A number of cases have had specimens of blood examined as often as nine times. From the standpoint of economy in time I would suggest that after 4 negative blood examinations have been returned, the diagnosis should be made on clinical grounds, assisted if the clinician so desires by a leucocyte count taken during the pyrexial period.

The presence of Benign uartan Malaria from Palestine (3 cases) is of no little interest.

128 specimens of faeces have been examined microscopically. In 2 cases Flexner and Shiga bacilli were isolated, in 9 cases amoebae histolytica and in 6 cases of cysts of Amoebae histolytica were present. Only 19 of these 128 specimens of faeces contained blood and mucus.

I have consulted Colonel W. Summons and Lt-Col. C. B. Blackburn on this matter and they agree that examinations of normal stools for histolytica cysts or flagellates except in the presence of definite clinical reasons for such procedure, are not indicated.

The work of the Laboratory has progressed satisfactorily during the month. All members of the staff have worked most industriously and efficiently, please.

As usual cases of injury to bones and joints greatly predominate and it is worthy to comment that, in all cases examined, great care skill and ingenuity have been shown in fixing the splints and appliances used, ensuring immobility of the injured part and the utmost comfort to the patient during his transport to the base from the front line.

The arrival of a wheatstone stereoscope after much trouble and delay has supplied a long felt want.

Stereoscopic examinations are particularly useful in examining head injuries to demonstrate the nature and extent of fractures of the skull and to localise foreign bodies in the head.

It seems to be impossible to obtain the necessary equipment for therapeutic work. Some improvised apparatus has been made and therapeutic work is being attempted.

With the exception of the quality of the plates supplied, which are always variable, the rest of the apparatus is in good working order.



Christmas 1917. Xmas 1917 was celebrated in the Hospital with much joyfulness. Great rivalry existed among the Sisters and Patients as to who would have the best decorated Ward, etc., as a rumour had spread, that prizes were to be given for same. Several of the ladies belonging to the Red Cross Society were asked to do the judging and awarded the prizes as under, viz:-

Every patient was given a special bag by the Australian Red Cross Society, which contained some useful gifts. These were distributed between 9 and 10 a.m. on Xmas morning by the members of the Society and were much appreciated. An excellent Xmas dinner was served at midday and was enjoyed by all. The caterer supplied Roast Chicken and assorted vegetables. The Xmas puddings, jellies, assorted sweets, wines, beverages and trifles were all gifts of the Australian Red Cross Society. The Xmas Cakes, (three tier ones resembling small wedding cakes) were given by the Sisters of the Wards and were cut for afternoon tea, which was a sumptuous one.

Concerts and entertainments were given throughout the day and late in the evening by various concert parties. The Orchestra belonging to the 14th A:G:H: rendered sweet music during dinner and after tea.

B:1: Ward. Sister Bonnar who won the 1st Prize for the best decorated ward certainly deserved it. She and her staff received widespread congratulations. It was a typical spring time scene in Australia, the peach and apple trees were all bursting into bloom. The ward throughout was most artistically arranged and the table decorations all in keeping. The color scheme was perfect, pale pink, merve, white and apple green blending most beautifully.

E Ward. Sister McGregor's ward gained 2nd prize. The scheme of decoration was Westeria blooms trailing everywhere. (All made from the covering of the cotton wool wrappers.

G 3 Ward. The majority of patients and many of the Sisters thought Sister Scott's ward should have been given a special prize. This ward was known as the "mechanical ward", as it represented many phases of war. A battle was raging in mid air between Australian and Hun planes ~~and~~ also a naval battle between the Sydney and Emden. The lamp shades were made of cardboard with the names of the different towns in Palestine cut out with the date of their fall. When the lights were on these dates could be easily read. It also contained an effigy of Hughes's last conscript from Australia. The patients in this ward were consoled when they heard that their dinner table had been given a prize.

G 2 Ward. This was another ward which was quite unique in its decorations. The centre of the ward represented a palm grove, the pillars being covered with palm bark and branches. Branches of beautiful Pointseilias gave a note of color which was very effective.

The other wards all deserve special mention for the time spent and the great interest taken by the Sisters and Patients. Every effort was made by all on the staff of the 14th A.G.H: to make Xmas day 1917 as festive and joyful as circumstances would allow.

23-1-18. Preparations were made by this unit to move to Port Said, to the buildings occupied by the 31st General Hospital. Sister C:L: Hyde and Staff Nurse Teasdale were sent down to make the necessary arrangements for the Sisters Mess, as we were going on rations for the first time. This entailed a good deal of work and management but has proved a great success, enabling the Sisters to live within their Mess allowance and reflecting great credit on the above named Sisters.

26-1-18. Head Sister Chapman and nineteen Sisters were detailed to take over the Wards and prepare for the admission of over 500 patients who were being transferred from Abbassia. The remainder of the personnel arrived from Cairo on the 29-1-18.

The wards were found to be very scattered with few conveniences. The average ward contained 110 beds which is too large a number for one charge Sister to supervise. Since arrival here the number of patients has increased to 1600, and tents had to be erected to cope with the large number of admissions.
