

	19th		While away from the Unit the acting C.O., altered the internal organisation of the relationship of the Matron, Wardmaster and General Duty orderlies. After due trial I have decided to return to the original scheme which is the accepted one in most military Hospitals. Vide Appendix 15.	
	20th		Because of the possible removal of the Hospital from these buildings I have discussed the proceeding on of R.E. work etc., and stopped all except ones of urgent necessity for the continuance of efficiency.	
			Today I took a summary of evidence of a case where a patient in this Hospital broke bounds and assaulted with intent to do bodily harm on a native of the country, using a revolver. This class of case and other breaches of discipline would be far more numerous if the Hospital was on the other side of the canal. It would be impossible to prevent patient breaking bounds. 2. SMUGGLING

G.R.O. No. 3793 is re-published for information:-

"Cases have recently been brought to notice where parcels have been received by the Army Postal Authorities addressed to officers and men containing, not personal goods, but merchandise obviously intended for trade.

"By this means it is hoped to evade Customs duties and to ensure a free despatch by Army Post.

"This practice must cease, and all ranks are warned that they are strictly forbidden to lend their names for such a purpose.

"All parcels of this nature will be detained at the Base, and serious notice will be taken of any cases which may be reported in the future."

3. CENSORSHIP

G.R.O. No. 2446 of 7-5-17 is re-published for information.

"It is notified for general information that uncensored letters may not be carried about by officers N.C.O'S or men.

"N.C.O's and men about to proceed on leave in Egypt will be informed that if, while on leave, they are found in possession of uncensored letters they will be sent back to their units forthwith.

"It is also brought to the notice of all ranks that it is strictly forbidden to carry any letters or newspapers, whether censored or not, out of Egypt or Palestine, to or from England, France, India, Australia, or elsewhere. Cases have occurred in which members of the Egyptian Expeditionary Force proceeding on leave to England have been found to be carrying letters while travelling through France, and have accordingly been placed in arrest. All ranks should therefore be warned of these prohibitions before proceeding on leave out of Egypt."

" Half pay for officers and other ranks commences from date of embarkation in Egypt to date of disembarkation in Egypt on return journey, irrespective of whether they are detailed for duty or not, with the exception that half pay in respect of leave to England, will only be granted up to (3) three months from the date of embarkation, and no pay will be granted for any time in excess of that period.

Officers granted leave of absence to England or Australia will be granted indulgence passages, which involves payment of 6/6 per day for Messing fees, unless detailed for duty on voyage by Australian Headquarters, Egypt.

Half pay in this circular means half pay including deferred and half field allowance. No field allowance is payable in Australia, except whilst in camp. The deduction of half deferred pay will be made on closing accounts.



WAR DIARY FOR AUGUST 1918 - QUARTERMASTER - EQUIPMENT DEPARTMENT

During this month quite a lot of temporary dislocation has occurred in the working of the Department owing to the amount of sickness among members of the staff. This, together with a complete stock-taking of the Unit, and the getting ready for departure of a large convoy of invalids for Australia, made this month one of the hardest that the Q.M.'s staff has had, but I am pleased to be able to record that all the members of the staff worked most loyally (often when not feeling fit) and thus enabled the work to be got through satisfactorily.

The amount of washing sent to, and received back from the laundry during the month was 104670 pieces.

The check of dirty etc sent for wash from each ward for the months June, July & August 1918 showing totals per ward per month and daily average of articles per patient are as follows. N.B. Only linen common to use in all wards was taken notice of, i.e. bandages, which would only come from surgical wards, were ignored.)

This month permission was received for Q.M.S. Gaulton of this Unit to change over with Q.M.S. McRae of the 4th. L.H.F.A. Q.M.S. McRae reported for duty and was put to work with Q.M.S. Gaulton. After a fortnight and just when Q.M.S. McRae was about conversant enough with the duties here to carry on by himself he was ordered away on transport duty to Australia. Q.M.S. Gaulton is still doing duty with this Unit although his transfer originally approved has been referred to A.I.F. Headquarters, Egypt.

A change in the staff of the department has been made by L/Cpl Hope who has been Transport Corporal of the Unit for so long being promoted to Corporal and having to take up other duties. The position of Transport N.C.O. has been filled by Pte Cottle from the Packstore. I would take this opportunity of placing on record my appreciation of the good work done by Cpl Hope as Transport Corporal, and Pte Cottle while employed in the Packstore.

A convoy of more than 200 invalids left for Australia during the month. Over 2500 articles of clothing and necessaries were issued prior to their leaving. As Hats, khaki, fur were not available for issue most of the invalids were wearing badly worn hats. An issue of second hand clothing was made of Cap, S.D., Khaki Jacket & Slacks and a White Hat. Each man was also issued with a second hand sea kit bag. All the second hand issue was made from stores collected from re-inforcements from Australia.

As this was the first convoy of patients sent to Australia since the order that no leggings were to be sent with them, a small amount of grumbling was heard about having their leggings taken from them and being issued with putties.

An order was received from A.I.F. Headquarters during the month that all invalids to Australia were to wear blue arm-bands. Immediately on this order being received A.I.F. Headquarters were asked to supply the arm bands but had not done so in time for men of this convoy to be served out with them. A letter was received from Commandant A.I.F. Hqrs to the effect that the bands would not be ready in time.

STORES SUPPLIED BY AUSTRALIAN RED CROSS SOCIETY.

The following are some of the stores supplied from Australian Red Cross Funds:-----

ANVIL, smith's. This has proved a very valuable adjunct to the hospital in allowing of repairs of various sorts being carried out on the place, and in connection with the forge supplied from Ordnance has done a lot of good service.

TOOLS, various Carpenter's, Blachsmith's, Bootmaker's and Plumber's tools of various sorts have been supplied. By having a good outfit of this nature much more work has been carried out on the place.

RESTS, bed. A very useful addition to the hospital stores, and as a saving of the the use of pillows alone more than justify themselves.

Another useful store the use of which is constant. The supply of these from the Red Cross is in addition to those supplied from A.O.D. and allows of many more patients making use of such comfort.

CHAIRS, wood &c These have proved very useful indeed in many directions but more especially in making comfortable the Officers' Ward. They cannot be taken into general ward use in any number owing to lack of space and the requirement is not so great.

PYJAMA Suits. The most useful article supplied by the Red Cross Society and the greatest difficulty would be met with if the supply of these very necessary stores were not kept up.

BAGS, hot-water & covers A store not so universally required in this climate, but very useful and necessary.

SCREEN FRAMES & Covers The screen frames and covers supplied by the Red Cross have allowed of much greater privacy in the wards. A few screens are supplied by A.O.D. but the supply is very limited and the colors of the screens are most frequently an eyesore. The white screen covers with red crosses have helped considerably in brightening the wards.

COUNTERPANES The Red X counterpane as supplied by Australian Red Cross Society although it makes a great amount of washing of counterpanes themselves saves the washing of blankets as the counterpanes practically stop all dust from going through. This store is inestimable in giving the wards a clean, bright appearance and they are store that can always be made use of.

FANS, ELECTRIC In a climate such as this these are priceless, and many an invalid has been greatly relieved by the fans so thoughtfully provided by the Red Cross Society.

STOVES, PRIMUS The A.R. Cross Society have relieved the pressure on A.O.D. supply by supplying 20 stoves, "Primus"

MACHINES, bread-cutting One of the best stores provided by Red Cross and has proved to be a great labour saver and preventer of waste.

OVERALL, nursing A very useful store which has been the means of saving orderlies much service uniform, besides being much cleaner and having a better appearance.

SOCKS, bed Not so much used in this climate but still a very useful store.

BINDERS, body Full supplies of these are always necessary as very " abdminal much use is made of them.

COVERS, muslin These are absolutely necessary in a climate and beaded country like this. The actual benefit derived from their use cannot be calculated.

2nd. Statement showing cost of subsistence for month of June received from A.S.C. to-day. Cost compared with month of May as follows:--

The number of patients subsisted in June showed an increase of  $\text{£}$  Nine Officers 1903 O/Ranks on May figures.

The increased cost of Officers' subsistence is attributed to variation of diets and fluctuation in cost of commodities.

8th. EGGS. The eggs supplied by Contractor have been most unsatisfactory since the beginning of the month. Short deliveries have been made regularly and a very high percentage of eggs received have been stale. No receipts are given for numbers of eggs found bad or short delivered. Of eggs boiled for Dining Hall patients on morning of 7th. inst. approx. 20% were bad. The matter was reported to O.C., A.S.C. and reply received that as present contract expires on 8th. of month it was not considered necessary to take any action beyond deducting number bad and short from contractors receipts.

9th. CONTRACTS. New contracts for supply of Eggs, Fruit & Fresh Milk commence to-day.

EGGS. The contract price shows an increase of P.T. 12½ or approximately 50% on price paid under old contract during the past three months. The increase in cost seems most unreasonable and will certainly influence the cost of subsistence of patients at this hospital as eggs are amongst the chief items of diet, an average of 240 eggs per 100 diets being used.

CONTRACTS. FRUIT The contract prices show an increase for oranges, mandarines, Bananas, and a slight decrease for grapes, Figs, Apples & Apricots. As grapes and figs are the only fruits available at present the difference in price will be hardly noticeable at present but when oranges are available again the difference will be greatly felt as increase in price equals approx. 22%.

MILK. Following on several tests made with Damietta milk which were made here during July and reported as satisfactory a new contract has been made for the supply of fresh milk to this hospital. The previous experience with fresh milk during Jan & Feb. of this year was most unsatisfactory; the milk having a particularly strong flavour at best of times, the delivery being most irregular, and the supply often arriving unfit for use. To get over chief difficulties experienced under previous contract with the A.S.C. have made a special provision for the sterilising of the milk at Damietta before despatch. The price to be paid is P.T.1 per pint with additional P.T.1 per pint for sterilising. The cost against this hospital is thus P.T.2 per pint. On this basis it is maintained that fresh milk is far from being more economical than tinned milk as the following comparison will show:--

The regulation scale laid down is:-

One tin condensed milk equals 2½ pts of fresh milk; this is a liberal scale as for most purposes one tin has been found to equal at least three pints.

Taking it at regulation One tin equals 2½ pts the cost would be:-

One tin condensed milk (Highlander Brand) (2½pts) costs 6½d. per tin. i.e. the cost of 2½pts of condensed milk is 6½d while the cost of fresh milk under this contract is :- 2½ pts fresh milk - 1/-½d. Economy in initial cost cannot therefore be mentioned and it is hardly conceivable that the value of freight space etc would nearly equal sixpence per tin.

Owing to the absence of regular supplies of "Ideal" milk the fresh milk will be appreciated for Milk Diet Patients but for cooking purposes it will be more in the interests of economy to use the condensed milk as far as possible.

10th. MILK. The first delivery of fresh milk was received last night. Of 32 cans, each containing 4 gals, received four cans were thick on arrival while the bulk of the remaining 28 cans were found to have been burnt, apparently whilst being sterilised. This milk was used for cooking of porridge & puddings with the result that the whole of these dishes were wasted.

No receipt was given to Contractor for this milk. Report was made to A.S.C. with request that contract be cancelled.

11th. MILK. Fresh milk received 49 cans, each 4 gallons found satisfactory

14th. COAL. Once again the attention of A.S.C. has been drawn to the inferior quality of coal being issued to this hospital. Of average weekly issue of ten tons as much as 20% has been coal dust only. This is most unsatisfactory and makes it next to impossible for staff to keep up with their work in the kitchens. The coal question has been a vital one for some time and considering what important factors the proper working of the kitchens, <sup>and hot water appliances</sup> are in the efficient working of a hospital it is contended that every effort should be made to ensure the regular supply of good quality fuel.

16th. MILK. Fresh milk deliveries have been cancelled since 12th. inst.

21st. OATMEAL. As oatmeal was not available the following substitutes have been made for breakfast meal during past three days:-

19th. Ground Rice ) Both at scale.

20th. & 21st. Rice ) Rice 1 oz, milk 15 ozs, sugar  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz.

These substitutes were naturally not found as acceptable to patients as the oatmeal.

GENERAL.GENERAL

FRESH MILK. Supplies have gone on since 17th. and apart from the peculiarity of taste it has been satisfactory.

JAM. Several consignments of jam made by "Stanmore Preserving Coy" Australia put up in six lb tins have been received lately. The jam has been good and well assorted but for hospital use either one or two lb tins are far preferable owing to the many small distributions that have to be made.

BUTTER. The supply of Australian butter having been exhausted tinned butter made up in one lb tins by "The Nel's Rust Dairies", South Africa have been supplied. This has been found satisfactory though slight tin taste is noticeable.

POTATOES. No potatoes have been issued for patients or staff for past ten days. Onions being issued in lieu.

STAFF RATIONS. On whole staff rations have been good. Meat ration has been rather skimpy, mainly owing to high percentage of bone & fat received with each cut. Vegetables were indifferent but have improved slightly of late.

CLEANING MATERIALS.

Supplies of Soda crystals and soft soap have been unobtainable since the 6th. inst. Advice has been received of a consignment coming forward. It is impossible for standard of cleanliness to be maintained in kitchens and hospital generally if regular supplies of these commodities are not available.

REPORT OF MEDICAL DEPARTMENT FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 1918

The work of this department has been very heavy again this month.

The number of deaths has been unusually large - 5. Of these 4 can be traced to the epidemic of Influenza which has swept over the Hospital during the past few weeks. Almost every patient contracted the disease and where the general health was already unsatisfactory the additional strain of the new infection caused great anxiety in a large number of cases and resulted fatally in four. In two patients just beginning to recover after severe attacks of dysentery, one amoebic and the other both amoebic and bacillary, death resulted from acute bronchialitis with rapid heart failure within 36 hours of infection. In a third, admitted from the field a few days before for marked general debility, extensive pneumonic consolidation took place and ended fatally in three days. The fourth patient had been drinking rather heavily and was admitted with acute nephritis and apical pneumonia and died two days later.

In the fifth case that died there were features of special interest. He had received a punctured wound of his foot 11 days before while bathing in Port Said and was sent into Hospital with typical tetanus with definite spasms. He received daily intrathecal injections of anti-tetanic serum as well as intramuscular and from the start of the injections his symptoms began to assume a type more characteristic of cerebro-spinal meningitis and when he died days later there had not been any evidence of tetanic symptoms for some days. At first a secondary infection was feared but the cerebro-spinal fluid was daily examined and failed to reveal any organisms or any cellular evidence of their presence. Post-mortem, there was evidence of marked cerebro-spinal inflammation but no signs of any purulent exudate and the microscope again failed to reveal any organisms and all cultures were negative, both aerobic and anaerobic. There were, however, extensive old adhesions throughout the serum cavities of the body showing a tendency to polyorxhomenitis. The serum used was all old - the only kind available - and it is impossible to say whether the intense reaction of the meninges to the introduced fluid was due to an idiosyncrasy of the patient or to any defect in the serum.

General. There have been several changes in the personnel of the Medical Staff. Capt. Machin after six months very painstaking work has returned to the field and several of the M:O's from Field Ambulances have been attached for periods of three weeks during which they have taken charge of wards. Unfortunately the period is a very short one in ~~experience~~ which to refresh the memory of the M:O; in regard to his medical work and the break in the continuity of the ward work is a distinct disadvantage. However it is realised that it is the best compromise that can be made under present circumstances.

There has been a good deal of sickness among the staff of this Hospital as it has suffered as much as the patients from the Influenza epidemic. Except in the most severe cases every one has managed to carry on during the 2 or 3 days of the illness, but with several this has been impossible and some of the Medical

nursing and orderly staff have had to be admitted for a few days. Major Kennedy, on the Surgical Staff, after a few days illness with Influenzal symptoms developed acute bacillary dysentery and in spite of prompt treatment with serum is making rather slow progress.

Owing to the prevalence of Influenza among the troops recruiting their health at the Rest Camp there have been a great many admissions from there this month and in consequence ~~usual~~ *several* convoys from the field have had to be directed to Cairo. It is probably partly on this account that there have been not so many cases of Malaria admitted as during the previous month.

Cases of Dysentery are still being received and there are 12 cases of dry pleurisy.

Pneumonia has been more than usually prevalent, chiefly in association with Influenza both lobar and lobular types being met with.

The transfer of a large number of boarded cases to Australia relieved temporarily the pressure on the beds.

The month of August has again witnessed an increase in the total number of examinations - a total figure of 1234 being reached.

667 blood films have been examined for possible Malarial infection with positive results in 108 cases. Of these 20 were Malignant and 7 were cases of quartan Malaria. Colonel Blackburn states that the clinical picture in these cases, is that of quartan Malaria the laboratory diagnosis thus being fully confirmed.

The incidence of an influenza epidemic continues, unavoidably to entail a large per cent of negative examinations. *Micrococcus catarrhalis* has proved to be the dominant organism in the sputa of these cases.

During the month work has come in from the Rest Camp, the Armenian Camp, the Central Laboratory, Kantara, and from No. 2 Military Laboratory Ludd.

Major A.R. Ferguson, R.A.M.C. requested me to re-standardise certain packages of haemolytic sera recently subjected fire owing to an outbreak in the Central Laboratory, Kantara. The following results were obtained:-

Sera Nos. Cl, I, L, O, Z, all had a titre of approximately 1 in 1000 and are all workable.

Sera Nos. Bl, N, W, X, P had a titre of approximately 1 in 500

Sera Nos. R and S have a titre between 1 in 500 and 1 in 250

Sera Nos. J and K have been completely destroyed by heat titration was therefore impossible.

The remainder Nos. A, B, C, D, E, F, G, Al, Dl, El, Fl, Gl, H, M, Q, T, U, V, Y, had a titre of less than 1 in 250.

As suggested in my previous report work of this nature came well within the scope of a base laboratory.

During the month a supply of Cholera toxin - alcoholic-heart extract (Syphilitic Antigen) has been manufactured. Three rabbits have also been immunised against sheep corpuscles and a haemolytic serum produced. Such procedure is not only economical but it enables more delicate work to be done as reagents are fresh when used and have never been subjected to deleterious temperature changes.

During the period under review the work of all members of the Laboratory Staff has been eminently satisfactory, please.

REPORT ON NURSING SERVICES A:A:N:S: DURING MONTH OF AUGUST 1918

The work of the Nursing Staff has been very heavy during the past month, owing to the large number of patients in hospital, the majority of whom were Medical cases suffering from Malaria, Influenza or Pneumonia. Cases of this description need careful nursing and take up more time than ordinary Surgical cases. Unfortunately many of the Sisters and most of the Orderlies also contracted Influenza and had to go off duty, while those remaining on had a very busy time and in addition were obliged to give up their weekly day off duty as well.

The health of the Sisters has not been up to the usual standard, due, I think, to the work being more constant, then hours of duty longer, and the weather conditions more trying, also the majority of the Sisters have already done two summers in Egypt, consequently are not feeling as fit to cope with the work as they did 6 months ago.

On 19th August I received instructions from A:I:F: Headquarters, England, to give two consecutive weeks leave to Sisters on the completion of 6 months duty. I replied stating that this is not practicable with my present Staff of 93 and asking that the number be increased to 100, and if possible, kept at that strength as eight at least would have to be away on leave all the year round.

No reinforcements have arrived for this unit since December 1917, when 1 Sister and 20 Staff Nurses came by the "Canberra". Since that date 22 have been detailed for Transport duty to Australia, 5 have married, and 6 have been transferred to 31st General Hospital, Abbassia - thus leaving me 10 short of the number I had in December 1917.

It has been suggested that members of the A:A:N:S: in Egypt might be given the opportunity of a trip to Australia by exchanging duty with sisters on Hospital ships. Personally I think this a good idea if it could be arranged, as the Sisters concerned would only be absent from their respective units for one voyage. I have known of instances where a Sister's personal affairs needed urgent attention, and a few days leave in Australia would have been ample to adjust matters.

Applications for three months leave to Australia and New Zealand respectively, from Sisters G:H: Burns; A:G: Bonnar; W:M: Scott and E:M: Cooke have been received and forwarded to A:D:M:S: in Egypt for consideration.

On Col: Summons return from Australia he decided to take over the administration of the Orderlies again. This change took place on the 18th August 1918.

During the month 20 members of the Staff have had their half yearly leave, some went to Cairo, others to Alexandria but Sisters M: Jones; G:H: Burns; W:M: Scott; E:M: Cooke were fortunate enough to spend part of their leave in Jerusalem, and have come back delighted with the reception they received. Their time there was limited to 48 hours, but fortunately for them kind friends had planned how they could best spend the short time at their disposal. On the afternoon of their arrival they were taken to Bethlehem, the Church of Nativity, Solomon's Pools, etc. The whole of the next day was spent sight-seeing in Jerusalem. They were able to see the Mosque of Omar, The Church of the Holy Sepulchre, and other places of interest. The following morning they went to the Mount of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, did some shopping and caught the 3 o'clock train back to Kantara.

It has not been thought worth the trouble to work out the figures on a percentage basis. The number of Staff and Patients both have been greater at Port Said. Thus one can consider that the standard of discipline has been about the same amongst the personnel. Amongst the patients, on the other hand, there has been a decided improvement. Patients do not receive leave in Port Said whilst 10% of leave was granted in Abbassia. Patients secured alcoholic drinks contrary to standing orders and this was the cause in a great majority of cases of the crime. In Port Said it is a well nigh impossibility for patients to get any alcohol except on a medical certificate.

93A Comparison of two methods of Ward Administration.  
-----

During my absence on leave the Officer Commanding instituted a change in Administration in that the position of assistant ward master was abolished in the most of the wards of the Hospital. An assistant N.C.O was given to the Wardmaster to enable the latter to perform the additional duties. It was found necessary to retain the assistant wardmasters in the Convalescent Ward and in Isolation. The placing of orderlies was handed over to the matron and added responsibilities were given to sisters i/c of wards.

This arrangement has been tried in other military Hospitals but found not to be as satisfactory as the one I had in existence when handing over. For information I decided to keep on the new arrangement for a month and found as anticipated that the position of assistant wardmaster is necessary for the maintenance of efficiency and cleanliness of the Hospital. In this large hospital only three N.C.O's were required in addition to those already doing similar allotted duties for there was a wardmaster in fact, but not in name in the Officers' ward and the assistant N.C.O. to the wardmaster was taken from that post and given a group of wards to attend to.

- The ways in which the absence of wardmaster were felt were
- (a) The sisters prime duty being that of Nurse and less of general management, the latter became neglected. Thus articles of equipment strayed. The standard of cleanliness and tidiness decreased especially so in the annexes of the wards where it was impossible for the sister to enter and so maintain order at all.
  - (b) In the parades of patients for discharge, dental treatment, admission and removals of kit continually there were irregularities that did not tend to efficiency or smooth running.
  - (c) The extra duties were uncongenial to the Nursing sisters. The assistant wardmaster worked in conjunction with the sisters in charge and assisted them in drawing equipment, returns of unserviceable articles, and so forth. These duties were associated with the Q.M's department. The Q.M's opinion was that the work went more smoothly when assistant wardmasters existed. This also was the opinion of the Q.M. who attended to the rationing of the Hospital.
  - (d) There was an indefinite feeling among the male staff, that they preferred to work for men and not for the Nursing sisters. This relationship varied. In some cases the staff worked harmoniously, in others the sister in charge may have not possessed the tact in issuing orders to the male orderlies who had recently been serving in field Units.

Already discontent existed in the Officers' Ward and an N.C.O., had been appointed to supervise the mess orderlies. His duties were extended. Thus only two additional N.C.O's were required to fill the number of assistant wardmasters required. Under both arrangements a night wardmaster was necessary.

The Nursing Orderlies come under the direction of the sisters and the duties of the general duty orderlies are arranged by the wardmaster in consultation with the sister, for the amounts of outside duties vary in each group of wards. Already the change has confirmed me in the advantages of the pre-existing arrangement.

INSTRUCTIONS TO ASSISTANT WARDMASTERS

- 1: Wardmasters are responsible to the O.C. for the maintenance of discipline amongst orderlies and patients.
- 2: They will keep the "Orders for Patients" and other notices on ward notice boards up to date and replace when removed.
- 3: A return is to be furnished to the Wardmaster daily by the specified hour of the Daily Bed return for the wards under his charge.
- 4: The admission, transfer and discharge of patients will be supervised
- 5: Wardmasters are responsible for seeing that the patients have obtained their kits and have returned all hospital equipment and clothing prior to parading them for discharge
- 6: The maintenance of the cleanliness of the ward surroundings and annexes is the responsibility of the wardmaster. He will arrange with the Sister in charge of the ward as to the times at which orderlies are available to do these duties
- 7: All parades of patients for special treatment must be strictly made to time
- 8: You will acquaint yourself with the orders for patients and see that they are obeyed
- 9: Deaths are to be notified to the Wardmaster's Office or Registrar if the former is away. The body is to be reverently removed to the mortuary
- 10: They will assist to carry out all orders of the unit and to maintain the cleanliness of their wards by the return of unserviceable articles to store, the return of all articles temporarily used and perform any other duties as may be specially allotted from time to time
