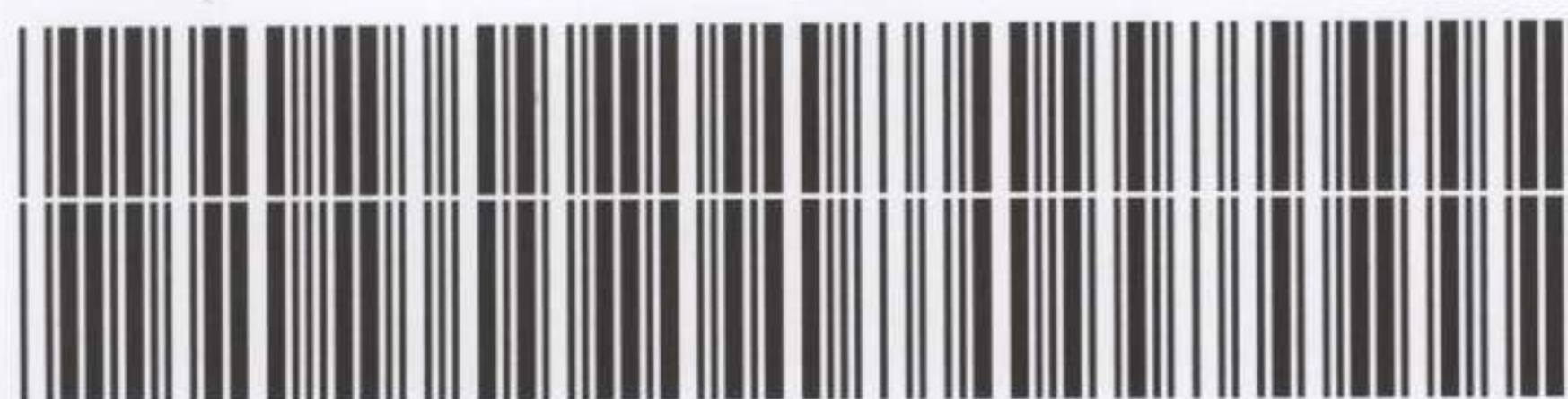

	1st.		Nil.	
	3rd.		A detail of Prisoners of War Labour has been secured to remove the ravages of the flood of last month.	
	5th.		The classes for Educational Training have been started. The number of students is not as great as anticipated.	
	6th.		Instructions received to hold in readiness all mattress & hammock invalids in the hospital. The total number in these two categories awaiting transport is 470.	
	7th.		Lecture by Sir William Willcocks on "From the Nile to the Jordan" Owing to shortage of A:A:M:C personnel in Egypt the relaxing of the standard of invaliding is not to apply to them. Members of the A:A:M:C are to be boarded in the usual way & the standard of invaliding is unfit for duty for a period of 3 months.	
	9th.		The possession of uniforms by invalids of their uniform while remaining patients in hospital is detrimental to discipline. As delays have occurred in getting the invalided men away I have removed all the uniforms to store again. These were issued in a hurry as it was anticipated a lot of patients would embark from here. The billiard tables have now been put together again & are availed of by the staff & patients. The Orchestra plays each afternoon in the wards. Concerts are given periodically & occasional lectures. The cinema is well under way. All these things tend to lessen the idle time of patients. As well two afternoon outings are arranged each week & afternoon leave to the extent of 15 per cent. is granted from 2 to 6 p.m. The Red Cross Society give a basin of tea & bread & jam etc. at 2-30 p.m. to the walking patients who do not get leave.	
	11th.		Demobilisation papers A:I:F:No.534 was filled in for every member of staff & all the patients.	
	14th.		A number of the staff have been demobilised or sent to field units for demobilisation. Also a larger number are sick in hospital than usual. With 1065 patients in hospital today this has meant that the duties of the unit are practically as strenuous as during the period of active warfare. More especially as an excess of invaliding is taking place.	
	16th.		Classes in Esperanto, Veterinary Work, Theory of Electricity started for members of the unit. Also a dissected aeroplane engine secured (with instructor) for demonstration of the principles of an internal combustion engine.	
	19th.		Six invalid officers & 101 other ranks invalids were despatched to Australia per H:T: "Lancashire"

	22nd.		Including admission of 127 patients today the total number in hospital is 1134. Owing to the unlikelihood of arrival of transports the standard of invaliding has again been raised & also those already put down for transfer are being daily reviewed & sent to duty or convalescence in Egypt. The standard adopted for invaliding now being that a patient is unfit for duty for at least 3 months.	
	24th.		Seventeen of the senior Sisters embarked for leave in England. These have all been in Egypt two summers & are in need of a change to a colder climate.	
	26th.		Word has been received that invalids will be embarked on the H:M:A:T: "Port Sydney" on 3-3-19. For these the A:I:F:Form 536 is being used for the first time in lieu of the invaliding A:F:B:179 previously employed.	
	28th.		<p>Meeting of the A.A.M.C. &amp; R.A.M.C. Officers attending classes &amp; lectures in post graduate work was held at this hospital on 26th &amp; 28th when 4 lectures were delivered by members of the staff.</p> <p>Two cases of modified smallpox have occurred in the hospital - one patient &amp; one member of the hospital staff. This has necessitated the re-vaccination of the whole hospital. Sporadic cases are continually occurring in &amp; around Cairo amongst the garrison, for smallpox is endemic in Cairo amongst the local inhabitants.</p> <p>During the last two <del>month</del>-weeks 8 cases of Rotheln have been found &amp; transferred to the Infectious Hospital, Choubra. These have been amongst the staff &amp; patients but chiefly the latter. The infection has been prevalent at the Details Camp, Moascar &amp; at the Anzac Mounted Division Camp, Rafa. The influenza ward was placed out of isolation for a week, but a fresh batch of cases were admitted &amp; I have again placed the embargo on it &amp; all suspect cases are admitted to the one ward &amp; strict isolation enforced.</p> <p>Already 10 cases of venereal disease have been admitted for in future this hospital is to receive these cases &amp; not No. 2. A.S.H, which is to close down shortly.</p>



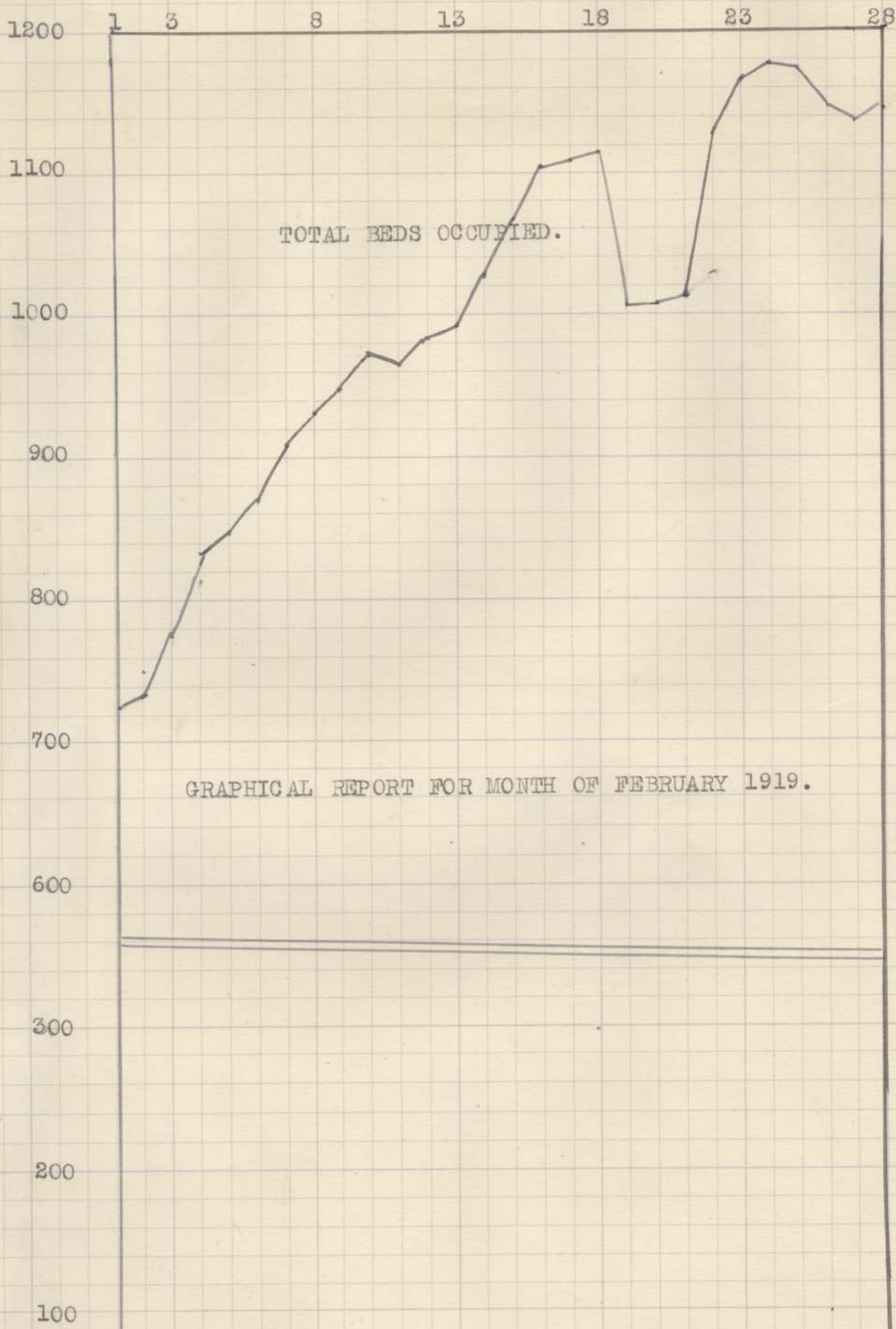

WAR DIARY FOR MONTH OF FEBRUARY 1919 - QUARTERMASTER

CLOTHING STORE. During the month difficulty has been encountered in clothing patients on discharge from hospital and members of the staff owing to no supplies being received from Ordnance. On 10/2/19 a letter was sent to C.O.O., Kantara East asking that delivery be expedited but without result. The D.A.Q.M.G., A.I.F. has now been applied to for assistance in obtaining supplies. The matter of clothing patients has always been more or less difficult for the same reason that supplies could not be obtained, evidently due to lack of appreciation by C.O.O.s of the work done in this direction by the Q.M.'s department of a General Hospital.

PERSONAL FORM B.

During the month instructions were received re clothing and equipping patients and staff proceeding to Australia for demobilization. A copy of the personal form B is attached. This new scale necessitated larger stocks being kept by the Q.M. Previously authority existed here in Cairo for the Q.M. to carry 200 complete sets of clothing, kit, & necessaries but owing to the large number of invalids to be equipped application was made to the C.O.O. for authority to stock 500 complete sets. This authority has been granted and stocks of kit & necessaries have been received up to 500 sets. As the clothing is Australian pattern the difficulty as shown above exists.

SHORTAGE AT 28/2/19.

On 28/2/19 the following items were not in stock and could not be obtained from Ordnance, Kantara:--

Breeches, M.S. (Small Sizes)      Boots A.B. (Small sizes)  
Hats, K.F.      Drawers, cotton, long,      Leggings.

VENEREAL PATIENTS.

During the month instructions were received to accommodate Venereal Patients, and as the hospital clothing and bedding was in good condition, indents were submitted on Ordnance for such marked V or only fit for such use. These stores have been received and put into use for venereal wards only. Dining utensils were issued from ordinary hospital stocks to the Venereal store and these will be kept for such patients only.

CHANGES IN STAFF.

During the month Sgt T. Baird who had been in charge of the linen store left for Australia and the vacancy thus caused has been filled by promoting L/Cpl D. Dainty, who is carrying out the duties most satisfactorily.

SICKNESS OF STAFF.

This month has seen quite a lot of sickness among members of the Q.M.'s staff, mostly slight illnesses which cause a certain amount of dislocation in the working of the department. To help, use has been made of light duty patients who, not having the interest of the department at heart require constant urging & supervision.

WATER SUPPLY.

On 26/2/19 owing to repair of a leakage in the water mains the water had to be turned off for two hours. This was arranged to be done at 1320, and although some ~~xxx~~ inconvenience was caused the greater part of the working of the hospital went on uninterruptedly. It would be as well in such large hospitals as these if the water mains were worked by two or more stopcocks, so that when necessary to repair leakage in any part of the pipes the whole of the hospital would not have to be deprived of water at the same time.

PRIMUS STOVES.

Primus stoves and parts of same are again unobtainable from Ordnance, and the Australian Red Cross Society were again appealed to to provide a dozen burners which they did and thus enabled the urgent demand to be met. Word has been received from C.O.O. ~~xxxxxx~~ Cairo that primus stoves and parts are being received from base. In the direction of primus stoves and parts more difficulty has been met at Ordnance by this department than in connection with any other stores.

Return showing cost of subsistence for month of December received from A.S.C. Port Said 2/2/19.

Increased cost of officers subsistence 4/5 against 4/1 for November and Other Ranks 3/- against 2/9 for November is attributed to the extras supplied to patients at Christmas time together with increased cost of commodities.

Cost of subsistence for months of January and February are not yet known but it is estimated that a general decrease will be shown as commodities are less expensive in this area than they were at Port Said. Number of patients subsisted during month was:-

COAL

The following scale was set down for supply of coal to this hospital:-

- 10 lbs per head per week ( Patients & Staff)
- 115 lbs per Boiler per 12 hours (Hot water)
- 110 lbs per Disinfector per 12 hours

On taking over from 31st. General Hospital the work placed on the Disinfectors was exceptionally heavy and it was found necessary to work the machines the full twentyfour hours consequently double demand for coal was essential during January and early portion of this month; the amount of work on the fumigators together with the demand for hot water decreasing it was found necessary to work both the disinfectors and hot water boilers for twelve hours a day only so demand for coal was reduced accordingly from 20/2/1919.

REGIMENTAL FUNDS.

During the month the sum of Twentynone pounds was spent for purchase of extras for patients during the month; this was chiefly spent on fresh tomatoes to supplement evening meal in Dining Hall and Dried peas to supplement vegetable ration periodically. The sum of nine pounds ten shillings was spent for purchase of extras for Staff during the month; this was spent on purchase of eggs thus enabling members of staff to have eggs for breakfast once a week and two egg puddings per week which proves a very substantial supplement to scale of rations.

General.

The past month has been a comparatively light one in regard to sickness, but the clerical work of the Medical Officers has been very considerably increased. This has been due to the necessity for collecting so many data for Demobilisation & Medical Board purposes.

The uncertainty of obtaining transport for invalids has also led to several changes in standards.

At one time when it was thought that a large ~~transpoe~~ amount of space would be available in vessels passing through the canal all the patients in the hospital were reviewed & those not likely to be fit for duty in/ one month had their case sheets endorsed to this effect that they would not be fit for duty in one month & were suitable for "Transfer to Australia."

This review of cases had hardly been completed when copies of Army Form 536 came to hand & it was announced that these forms would have to be filled in for all cases before embarkation. As soon as these forms had been printed, the staff & medical boards began feverishly on the task of supplying some 500 medical reports in a few days. Soon, however, a halt was cried because it became evident that the rumour of the large amount of shipping space available had been exaggerated so that there was a liability of the hospital becoming over crowded. Instructions were therefore issued to revert to the "three months" standard for invaliding & patients began to be discharged who had 1/12 before been marked for transfer to Australia, much to their dis-satisfaction.

This was the stage reached at the end of the month.

The chief medical work has consisted of the treatment of recurrent malaria & of influenza early in the month there was a recurrence of the influenzal-pneumonia epidemic in Cairo & several patients were admitted to the influenzal ward. Two of these died with pneumonia.

The two other deaths that took place were in patients else who had been in a desperate condition for some time, one with chronic intestinal nephritis & subacute uraemia & the other with advanced pulmonary tuberculosis.

During the month 19 new cases have commenced therapeutic treatment, the majority being clinically "Oriental Sore" or indolent septic sores which have resisted other forms of treatment. All the cases gave a history of at least two months duration & some cases as long as nine months duration. The Leishman Donovan body has not been discovered in any of the cases examined bacteriologically.

During the month 16 old cases have been discharged relieved or returned to Australia with the condition greatly improved.

In one case sent for treatment, epithelioma of the lip, an operation was recommended in lieu of therapeutic treatment.

Twenty one cases were under treatment on March 1st 1919.

Photographic prints of cases of interest have been sent to the War Records department, but as the majority of our most interesting plates have already been sent to Australia & our supply of printing paper is extremely limited, the collection is rather a small one.

Staff Sergeant Broomhall, who acted as Assistant Radiologist since the arrival of the 14th A:G:H: in Egypt, has returned to Australia. His work, while occupying that position, was well done & entirely satisfactory.

Sergeant Hudswell is now acting as Assistant Radiologist & his work also is to be highly commended.

The Xray plant is working satisfactorily.

REPORT ON NURSING SERVICES FOR MONTH OF FEBRUARY 1919.

A number of changes have taken place on the Nursing Staff during the past month - the first sisters from this unit to get special leave to England left by "H:T:Ormonde" on the 24th February. The sisters granted this privilege were Sisters G:H:Burns (REC) W:M:Scott (RRC) E:M:Cooke, E:Behrens, E:M:Thomson, P:O:Hyland, N:Nagle, E:M:Thomsen, J:M:Tomlins, P:S:Simpson, B:K:Smithers, I:T:Barwick, F:Spaven, D:Mearns, E:M:Roberts, M:E:Shields, M:N:Johnson & V:Everett.

We are all anxiously awaiting news of their arrival as we have heard so many disquieting rumours regarding the lack of <sup>suitable</sup> accommodation provided for Sisters who have been given short leave to England.

If there is any truth in these rumours, surely something might yet be done by someone interested in the welfare of the A:A:N:S. to secure proper accommodation in London as some Sisters have been obliged to spend the whole of their three weeks furlough in Scotland on account of not being able to secure lodging in London. It is admitted by all that the Army Nursing Sisters have played their part, and done their duty in this great war, just as nobly & unselfishly as our Officers & Men - yet the former have every provision made for their comfort when on furlough - whereas Sisters are expected to find their own accommodation & some have even been known to drive around the city half the night, trying to find some place to stay on their arrival in London.

The Sisters on leave to England were replaced by Sisters (AANS.) from the 71st British General Hospital which had just been closed down & In addition to the above mentioned, nineteen <sup>other</sup> sisters from Salonica have been attached for duty pending their departure for Australia.

S/Nurse I:L:Shidel, the first sister boarded from this unit, left for Australia by the H:T:"Novgorod" on the 22-2-19. She had been off duty 5 months altogether, but could have gone back much sooner, only there was no accommodation for invalided sisters on the transports going to Australia.

The health of the Sisters has been excellent since our return to Cairo. At <sup>the</sup> time of writing there are only three off duty ill - one has Diphtheria, another Measles and the third has been boarded for Australia. (Dilated Heart)

Thirty one sisters have had 14 days leave of absence during the past month. Some have spent their leave at Luxor & Assuan while others have spent theirs visiting the sights around Cairo.

The marriage of Sister V:M:Phillips to Major N:Hamilton Fairley AAMC. took place at the Garrison Chapel, Abbassia on the 12th February. The ceremony was performed by Chaplain Major Gordon. (C.of E.) They were both very popular members of this unit & carried with them the good wishes of every member of the 14th Australian General Hospital.
