No. 14. AGH.	April.	1919.	<p>1st Six Sisters &amp; 58 other ranks were sent to Australia as invalids. This is <del>the</del> practically the only form of demobilisation at present taking place owing to the Egyptian unrest. The remaining troops are taking the delay extremely well. Many of those patients who were called on for guard duty last month have returned to hospital.</p>	
			<p>5th Capt Silverton reported for duty from No.2 A:S:H: He will be taking charge of the V:D:Section. The patients of this section have had as much liberty as those in the other wards. Their time has been kept as much occupied with games, library, cinema pictures. There has not been any greater trouble with their discipline than amongst other patients. Leave has been curtailed generally because of the rioting.</p>	
			<p>8th Two cases of small-pox were sent 6-4-19 to Infectious Hospital - one was not admitted here but diagnosed on his reception, the other had been in hospital as a suspect for 18 hours only. A member of the staff Pte W:J:Barnes developed the disease on the 1st of the month. He had been vaccinated on three occasions, the last being March 23rd. This last time it was successful. Pte Barnes subsequently died April 10th at the Infectious Hospital, Abbassia.</p>	
			<p><del>Five</del> Five officers &amp; 77 other ranks were transferred to Australia as invalids on the H:T:Koroca.</p>	
			<p>9th Three officers &amp; 120 other ranks of staff of No.2. A:S:H: were taken on strength. 			<p>12th Seventy three patients mostly cot cases that had been waiting a long time for a hospital boat entrained for Port Said for embarkation on the H:S:"Wandilla". In addition 102 Other ranks walking cases were transferred to the Rest Camp Port Said to await embarkation.</p>	
			<p>10th Lt.Col. O'Sullivan sent from the General Staff to lecture on the present state of unrest in Egypt gave an interesting lecture that was well attended by the staff &amp; patients of the hospital.</p>	
			<p>12th The hospital orchestra has been got partly together again &amp; is giving performances in the hospital as hitherto.</p>





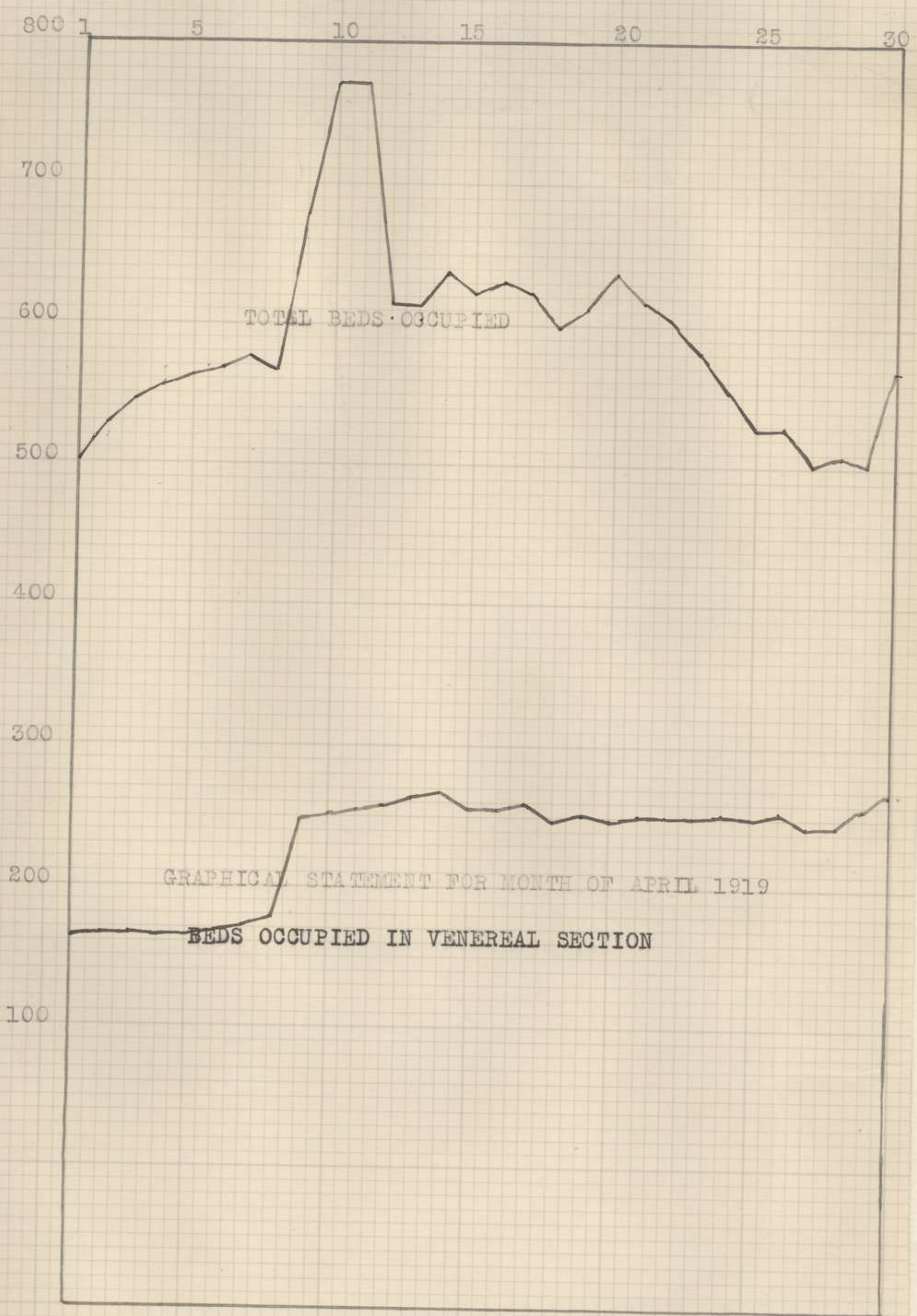

CHANGES IN STAFF. L/Corp. Dyer having embarked for Australia Pte Sharpe was promoted in his stead. L/Cpl Dyer has been employed in the Q.M's department for 1 year and 8 months and has at all times given satisfaction. He was painstaking, punctual, clean, and had the interest of his department at heart. It is desired that this record be made of his services.

CLOTHING STORE.

This store has again had a busy time fitting out men prior to embarkation for demobilization. Most items of clothing have come to hand but there is great difficulty in obtaining small sizes of Hats, khaki, fur, and of Boots.

LINEN & HARDWARE STORES.

Advantage has been taken during the month to overhaul most of the equipment in these two stores, and quite a lot of u/s equipment and clothing was returned to Ordnance. Owing to the number of patients lessening a re-demand for equipment to replace the u/s has not been submitted.

REPORT ON NURSING SERVICES FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 1919

There has been steady decrease in the number of patients in Hospital during the month. At present there are 250 patients who come under the care of the Sisters - 250 who are attended to by Orderlies only.

There are 100 Sisters on the Staff, and they have been able to have every third or fourth day off duty in consequence of number of Wards being reduced.

Perhaps the most important change in the personnel of the Unit has been occasioned by the return to Australia of the O.C. Col. W. Summons. He will be missed by the Nursing Staff, in whose welfare he was always deeply interested. Prior to his departure he was presented with a pair of pictures, which the Sisters hope will serve to remind him of their appreciation of him whilst he commanded the Unit.

Head Sister Woods, R.R.C. and Sister M. I. Crawford, both valued members of the Staff, left for Australia on H.T. "Dorset" on or about the 29/4/19.

Sister Woods left Australia in Nov. 1914. She served in Egypt and England, then returned to Australia on transport duty. She was appointed on the Staff of the 14th. A.G.H. and came to Egypt with it in August, 1916.

During the month six temporary Sisters and twelve Staff Nurses were appointed to the substantive rank of Sister - viz.

Leave to Cairo has been granted at infrequent intervals since March 13th. The C.B. has been irksome but necessary owing to the unsafe condition of the Streets consequent on the rioting by the natives. Things appear to be more settled now and authority has been given for usual leave to be granted to Sisters.

Staff Nurses Stephens and Alton are still working at the Egyptian Govt. Infectious Hospital where there are Australian and British soldiers suffering from Small Pox.

Many Sisters have volunteered to relieve them but both Sisters desire to remain there whilst there are any Australian patients in Hospital.

In the afternoon a Memorial Service was held. Sacred music was rendered by the Northumberland Fus. Orchestra from 3.30 to 4pm. At 4pm His Excellency The Special High Commissioner and Commander in Chief, General Sir, Edmund Allenby. G. C. B. G. C. M. G. arrived and addressed the audience, and referred in feeling terms to the soldiers of the Southern-Cross- Seas who had given up their lives to the interests of the Empire. Lieut. Col. Cash. A. P. C. CofE. also delivered an address which was inspiring and comforting.

Then followed Kiplings Recessional sung by "Corporal Lloyd" the Dead March in Saul which was most impressive.

Classes have been conducted in the undermentioned subjects. A summary of the work that has been dealt with is appended.

ENGLISH. A series of eight lectures has been given on English Composition, following, in the main, Meiklejohn's "The Art of Writing English". Grammar has been dealt with, as yet, only incidentally and for corrective purposes. Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar" and Macaulay's "Essay on Bacon" are in the hands of the students.

LATIN Classes have been hampered by the lack of good text books. Postgate's "Grammar" has now been procured and is in use. Work has covered the declensions of nouns and adjectives, the comparison of ~~xxx~~ adjectives and adverbs, and the indicative active of the four conjugations. Syntactical exercises have been given on Agreement of nouns and adjs; use of the preposition motion, and time.

ARITHMETIC Pendlebury's "New School Arithmetic" has been followed. The work has covered :- The four rules, H.G.F. & L.C.M., the use of the tables of money, wights and measures, both English and metric; and fractions.

ALGEBRA Hall & Knight's "Elementary Algebra" has been used. Progress has been slow. All the work has been dealt with as far as simple equations.

GEOMETRY Theoretical :- Hall & Stevens' "Geometry" Theorems I - XII with exercises on each theorem.  
Practical :- Geometrical instruments have been available only for the last few days. Work covered has been :- bisection of lines and angles; construction of angles; construction of triangles from varied data.

FRENCH Two classes have been conducted, advanced and primary.  
Primary :- Elementary grammar and pronunciation, following Hugo's Grammar.  
Advanced :- Seipman's French course has been followed.

BOOK KEEPING. General explanation of the terms of bookkeeping; exercises in the use of cash book, journals, ledgers etc.; F.O.B., and F.O.R.; instructions re. costs and discounts. The L.C.C. junior examination paper of 1912 has been worked out.

#### CINEMETOGRAPH OPERATION

Lessons have been both theoretic and practical. The majority of the month has been occupied with the electrical part of the subject -- the arc light, the switch board, wiring etc., together with practical operation.

#### ELECTRICAL FITTINGS

The subject of all classes for the month has been that of wiring, commencing with the simple circuit, and concluding with the wiring of a seven light house, and the use of the three plate ceiling rose.


