	1st.		Hospital visited by Colonel Westropp White A:D:M:S: Cairo District. Lt. Col. N:Hamilton Fairley returned from Detachment to be Senior Physician.	
	8th.		R:C:Garrison Chaplain complains that proximity of Venereal Patients to his Chapel was a nuisance. On enquiry from Chaplain Mullins No. 14 A:G:H: the allegation of the Garrison Chaplain was not supported. Arrangements however have been made to remove the patients from every area in which proximity might be complained of. This reduces the bed capacity of the hospital by 95, and the sanitary accomodation for the area concerned by 75 per cent.	
	11th.		Major S:R:Stafford, Registrar, left to join 3rd L:H:F:A:. He is succeeded by Capt R:C:Bassett.	
	12th.		Control of Sanitary Natives passed to civil Employment Bureau. Instructions received that men were only to be invalided to Australia on a basis of three months prospective disability.

	28th.		Three Invalid Officers to Australia per "Hungarian" Seventeen Sisters to Australia per "Hungarian" (2 sick) Twenty Nursing Sisters to United Kingdom per "Caledonia".	
	31st.		Major General Ryre, G:O:C: A:I:F: in Egypt visited the Hospital. The number of General cases in Hospital has increased steadily from 303 to 450. This is due to the instruction referred to on the 12th. inst. holding up discharges from hospital. During the month 291 cases have been transferred to D:M:C:Rest Camp, Port Said to await embarkation for Australia.	
			During the month regular entertainment has been provided for the patients. A Picture show has been given 3 times a week, there have been concerts given by the Zeitoun School of Instruction, the Anzac Hostel Concert Party and the No. 14 A:G:H: Concert Party. The Red Cross Society has arranged outings on several days of each week including visits to the Cairo Museum of Antiquities, the Pyramids, and Felucca excursions on the Nile.

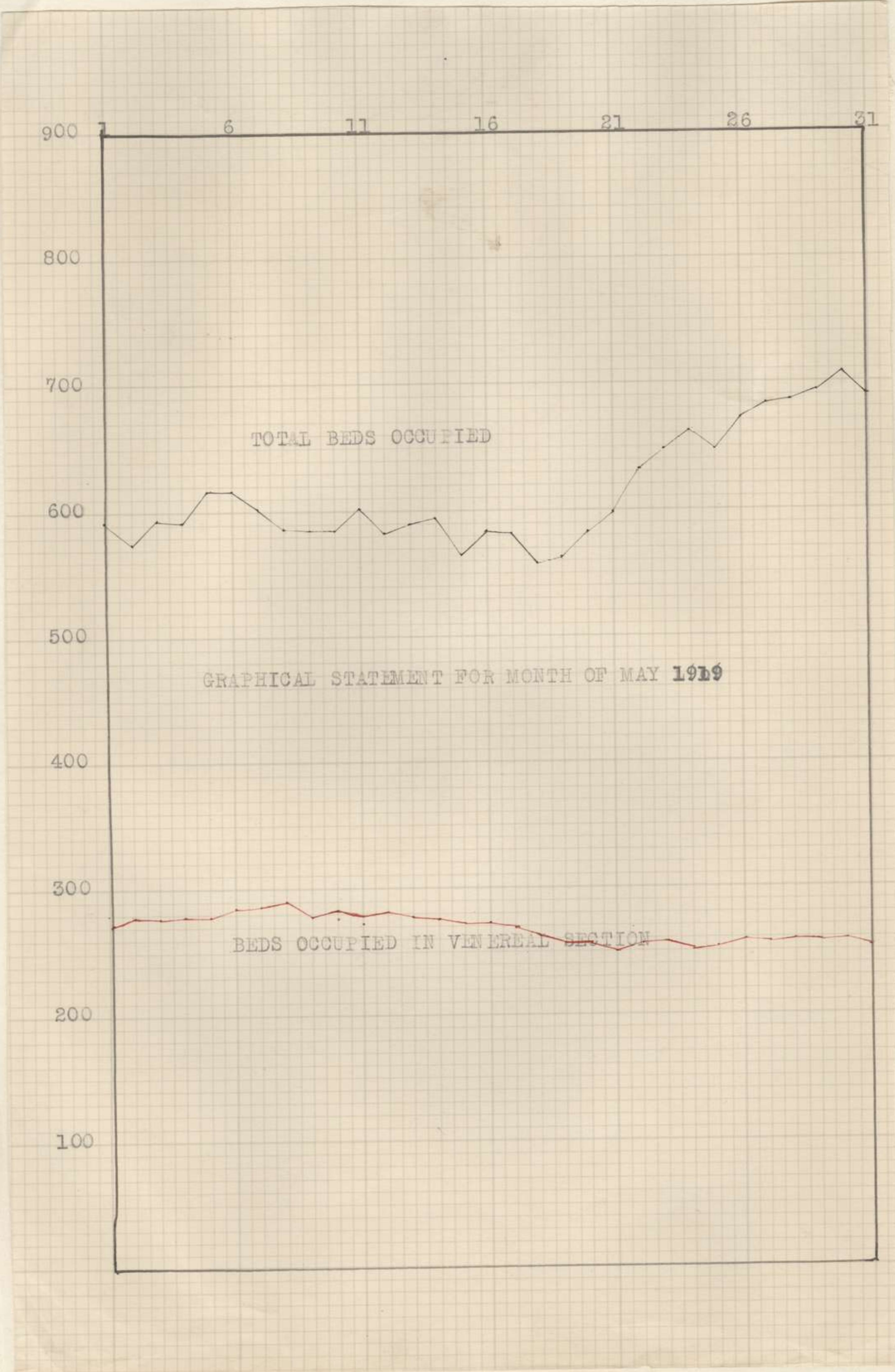

Sgt Nankervis who had been in charge of the Packstore for a long time, marched out for transport duty to Australia and demobilization, Corp. R.T. Crago was promoted Sergeant and placed in charge of the packstore.

Provisions.

During the month potatoes have not been an issue from A.S.C. and have had to be purchased in Cairo, money being supplied from Regimental Funds. Tinned fruit is very difficult to obtain from A.S.C. consequently only the serious cases of illness in hospital can be supplied with such. Another item which is badly missed (not now being obtainable) is cheese. Cheese when available helps out the evening meal considerably.

Reduction of Beds.

On the 27th. instructions were received to reduce the number of beds to 1040, surplus stores being returned to Ordnance & Base Depot Medical Stores.

This reduction will allow of a lot of stores that are getting the worse for wear although still serviceable being returned. As the surplus stores are disposed of by sale it is thought advisable to return the worn ones.

Concert Hall.

Consequent on the old Concert Hall in H Block being required as a ward for Venereal Patients it became necessary to provide one elsewhere. During the month Ward F.4 was converted into a Concert Hall with necessary stage, lighting, etc.

There is little information to be given on the Medical side beyond data incorporated in Report of admissions, discharges for month of May.

Recurrent Malaria continues to constitute the commonest medical disability. It is noteworthy that Benign Tertian is much the commonest clinical parasitological type met with at present in Hospital, and this despite the fact that they have probably been quite as many soldiers infected with M:T: Malaria during the past two years as with B:T: variety.

It is possible that the more rigorous treatment of M:T: in the year 1918 by inter-muscular injections of Quinine in addition to Quinine per ~~os~~: is partially responsible for lack of recurrence in this variety.

Three cases of Bilharziasis and one case of Malaria are being treated by intra-venous administration of tartar Emetic! A full report will be forwarded later.

Re vaccination more cases have been successful since new stock of Lymph were obtained and kept permanently in the Ice Chest, please.

NO 14 AUSTRALIAN GENERAL HOSPITALREPORT ON NURSING SERVICE FOR THE MONTH OF MAY 1919

The number of patients in Hospital remains about the same as in April. Consequently, until the last week Sisters have been able to have every third or fourth day off duty, however, the departure of 41 Sisters on the same day made it necessary to curtail all leave for the present- with the exception of the four days which are given to allow Sisters to visit Jerusalem- which leave was re-opened on 18th:inst, thus, four Sisters are on leave continuously.

The health of the Sisters has been satisfactory, when judged by the few admissions into Hospital, but the Medical Board classified 7% as being medically unfit to remain in Egypt for another Summer.

These Sisters were able to enjoy a holiday at Montazeh Convalescent Home Alexandria, before returning to Australia. They spoke very appreciatively of the treatment they received at Montazeh, the somewhat difficult means of transit between Alexandria & Montazeh being the only inconvenience.

About 40 Sisters applied for leave to the U:K: in order to take up studies under the Non-Military Employment Scheme, but, up to the time of writing only one Sister's application has been approved. The remaining applicants are anxiously waiting to hear results. The Sisters who have taken up the courses of Study in England, write such glowing accounts of the benefits they have derived from them, that the Sisters in Egypt most earnestly desire to be allowed to proceed to U:K: to share the advantages.

There has been a general re-arrangement of the Sisters Quarters. Previously two houses were occupied, but since the Staff has been reduced No:2:House has been vacated and taken over by the Garrison Adjutant Abbassia.

REPORT FOR MONTH ENDING 31/5/19

English:-

A series of lectures on English Composition, and English Literature, has been completed. One lecture each week is now devoted to English Grammar, one to English Literature. Work covered has been:-
GRAMMER:- The parts of speech; the formation of the Plural number; Gender and case of nouns; adjectives; their classification and comparison; punctuation.
 An introductory lecture to Shakespeare's "Julius Caesar" has been given dealing with the history of the drama from Homeric times to Shakespeare's sources and metre, and the Shakespeare Theatre.
 Acts 1, 11 and 111 of "Julius Caesar" have been dealt with in class.

LATIN:-

Comparison of Adjectives and adverbs. The Cardinal numerals. The personal pronouns and the rules governing their uses. The setting of test papers and correction with exercises on those sections of the work where laxity was shown.

Book-Keeping:-

Class is divided into two sections.
Primary:- General principles of double entry, journal, cash -book and Ledger. Progress has been slow owing to the continued entry of new members to the Class.
Advanced:- Practice in Book-Keeping with subsidiary books. The working out of Examination Papers, with exercises on the principles and methods involved.

Electrical &

Cinematograph:- Work dealt with has been practical house wiring, the explanation of electrical terms.
 Projectors, Switch-Boards and practical operating.

Moter-

Mechanism:- Magneto's and timing gears. General overhauling of a car; car taken down and assembled by number of class. Driving lessons have been given to the advanced Students when they have reached a working knowledge of the mechanism of the car.

Stock -

Raising :- Lectures have been given on the Economic aspect of the subject: the most suitable country for stock raising; various types of cattle throughout various countries. The Shorthorn Breed. Selection of Sires for Stud and for herd purposes.

Boot-Making:-

Demonstration of work done by a bootmaker. Half-soleing and heeling by nailing methods, Handsewing of soles.

FRENCH:- Classes are divided into two Sections-Primary and Advanced. Work dealt with has been:-

Primary :- Lessons in Hugo's "French Simplified" conjugation of verbs.

Advanced:-First and second conjugation- Seifmann's course with conversational practice.

Arithmetic:-Revision of previous work, Addition and subtraction of decimals; Reduction of decimals to vulgar fractions; decimalization of money, weights etc.

Algebra :- A primary class for new students has been commenced; introducing work as far as multiplication (simple) has been dealt with.

Fractions composed of simple expressions; introduction to Simultaneous equations, involving two, three and four unknown quantities.

Geometry:- Exercises on Theorems IX to XV -the Corollaries dealing with exterior and interior angles of the polygon, regular and irregular. The use of the rules in the construction of various polygons (Practical Geometry).



Building and

Construction :-Explanation of Plan and Elevation regarding Hor; and Vert; Planes, Prism, cube and cone as applied to technical geometry. Foundation of modern villa with Govt. specification. General building methods used and technical terms illustrated or explained. This class has now lapsed.

Several Students are attending "Art" Lectures held under the Education Service of the Abbassia Garrison (British). The work has been most satisfactory for the month and progress has been excellent. Keen interest is shown by both Students and Instructors.
