3. CONVALESCENT WARD

Every effort will be made to at once increase the comfort and efficiency of the convalescent ~~ward~~ department. Nursing Sisters will be added to the existing personnel. Independent messing arrangements will be made by the Q.M. Medical Comforts, curtains and matting are available on application to Red Cross Commissioner. Anzac Mounted Divisional Band will no longer be accommodated in this ward.

4. DISTRIBUTION OF WARDS

The present subdivision of Ward 4 has ceased to exist. From this date Ward 4 A and half of ward 4 C will be known as 4 West, 4 B and half of 4 C as 4 East, each of 105 beds. Rearrangement of staff to be made to correspond.

5. HAIRDRESSER

The unit hairdresser will be available for haircutting free of charge to all members of the unit between 1.30 and 5 pm daily, except when he is on leave, as shown by General Duty Roster. Each man will be entitled to a haircut once a month, and the hairdresser is responsible that each man signs a book kept for the purpose on completion of the haircut. He will be available at the officers' lines from 1.30 to 3 pm on Mondays. Shaving will be charged for as previously, but no shaving is to be done while men are waiting to have their hair cut between the above mentioned hours.

6. CENSORSHIP

The attention of all ranks is drawn to the fact that it is strictly forbidden to allow any mention of names or movements of ships, or anything relating to the port, to appear in their correspondence. This applies especially to photographs.

7. PICKLES AND JAM JARS

It must be impressed on all ranks that it is most important that G.R.O. 3476 of 30/1/18 regarding the return of all pickle and jam jars (stone and glass) to the nearest supply depot should be strictly obeyed and carried out.

8. ANTHRAX
PRECAUTIONS

The bacillus of anthrax has been discovered in shaving brushes which have been purchased from Navy and Army Canteens in 1918. In order to avoid danger of infection from this source O.C. units will immediately collect from all ranks under their command all shaving brushes which have been purchased from N and A Canteens since 31/12/17 and will ensure that they are burnt.





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The laundry difficulty mentioned in report for March now seems to have been got over, although at one period it was necessary to send 4021 pieces to Kantara for wash. This latter course is not good, except in case of emergency, as it took eight days to get the washing back again. The new contractor took up work on 24/3/18 and except that he could not clear up the back work, owing to insufficient employees, has done very well, the washing is well done and a big improvement on previous laundryman.

During the month a great deal of inconvenience has been caused to patients on discharge and to staff owing to a shortage in uniform for issue. Ordnance have been unable to meet demands due as stated by C.O.O. Kantara to fact that no Australian clothing has lately been received in this area.

As frequent application to R.E. failed to get the X Ray engine and dynamo erected, the work was undertaken by the Q.M. staff and carried out. The Radiographer reports that the plant is working perfectly.

A forge and a blow (brazing) lamp mentioned in last report as being frequently required have now been supplied by Ordnance to this hospital and very good work is being done with same.

Work at pack store this month has been very heavy indeed owing to large amount of admissions and all kits received being verminous and very dirty; each kit before being finally placed in packstore is handled six times; this has necessitated employing extra hands working long hours.

Personnel - The Quartermaster Sergeant having been detailed for a school at Moascar has left the Department short handed as the Sergeant in charge of the linen store had to take up the duty of Q.M.S. In addition to this the linen store Sergeant has lately changed over, the one who has been carrying out the duties for some time having gone to a field unit and one of the sergeants from the field unit having taken up duty at the linen store. This change is in the best interests of the service but with the Q.M.S. away has just now caused a little inconvenience.

During the month arrangements have been made whereby 350 beds are set aside in one ward as a Convalescent Department, and Dining Hall accommodation provided for same separate from the hospital patients Dining Hall. The extra furniture (dining tables and forms) has been received on loan from R. Engineers.

Alongside the convalescent ward accommodation was found for the Australian Red Cross Society to provide a Billiard Room. Recreation Room and a Buffet.

Bathing sheds have now been provided for Officers - Nursing Sisters - Staff - and two for Patients, one for deep water and the other on the back beach where water is shallow. Patients bathing sheds have been provided with life-buoys, lines, etc.

The Officers (Staff) lines have now been provided with electric light and this is very much appreciated by all.

During the month changes have taken place in the wards and Operating Theatres and a plan is attached showing the disposition of the hospital at 30th. April. 1918.

Inter-departmental telephonic communication would very greatly assist in the working of the hospital.

The accommodation provided for cooking for over 1,000 patients is as follows:--



One patient that had been transferred from the medical wards to the special ward for an operation upon his throat and who was depressed and anxious lest he had contracted venereal disease met his death by falling from the top floor to the base of a two-storeyed ward.

There have been several changes in the staff of the medical wards during the past month.,

Captain Fetherstonhaugh, who has been in charge of various wards for nearly 18 months, has been made the chief anaesthetist and been relieved for the present at least of ward work.

Major Arnold also has changed his duties, having given up the ward ~~xxx~~ has had in his charge for the last two months and taken over the charge of the Convalescent Ward.

Captain Bateman after six months of most thorough and painstaking work in the medical wards has been recalled to the field.

I wish to call attention to the excellent work of Sister Erica White. This sister has been acting as special nurse in charge of typhus fever patients and has carried out her duties in a most devoted and commendable manner. Special mention should also be made of No. 845 Dvr. Davis. P.E., who has been on duty in the typhus fever huts during the recent epidemic, he has shown marked eagerness to learn his duties and great aptitude for the work. His nursing of an Egyptian patient, who was under his especial charge, has been all that could be wished.

There have been more cases than usual admitted with the diagnosis "Pyrexia. N.Y.D". Practically all of them have had normal temperatures by the time they have reached this hospital, but the histories have usually suggested an acute fever of about 3 days duration. A few cases of this type of fever have recently occurred among the hospital staff. In them there has been an acute onset, often with a chill, severe aching pains in back and limbs, and fairly high fever of 2 or 3 days duration followed by considerable prostration. The fact that many members of the staff have been bitten by "sandflies" lately and that these insects are reported to be very numerous in Palestine at the present time suggests that the epidemic is one of phlebotomus fever.

The principal interest from the medical point of view, during the past month has been centred in our share of the cases of typhus fever that have resulted from an outbreak of this disease among the natives of Port Said. Special interest has attached to these cases owing to the prevalence of relapsing fever among the admissions of the past few months.

It has already been pointed out, in the history of the first year and one half of the work of the hospital, that the type of relapsing fever admitted from Palestine was very different both in the clinical and in the pathological aspects from the type received when troops were operating in Egypt in 1916-17.

stress was therein laid upon the close resemblance between the new type and the form of relapsing fever usually known as West African Tick fever, and also upon the fact that the diseases, particularly the relapses, are extremely liable to be diagnosed as malaria. This latter mistake still continues to be made owing to the difficulties of finding the scanty spirochaetes in the blood films, and to the relatively high percentages of large mononuclear leucocytes.

Since this hospital has been removed to Port Said several cases of the ~~West~~ African (or Egyptian) type of relapsing fever have been received from the ~~next~~ neighbourhood and these have provided an opportunity for direct comparison with the Palestine cases, a few of which are still coming in. The result has been to confirm our opinion that the two ~~classes~~ are quite distinct.

Unfortunately it has been impossible to ~~decide~~ decide the question as to whether the intermediate ~~test~~ of the parasite is different in the two types as we have not so far been able to secure any of the suspected house ticks from Palestine.

As so many of our patients are infected with lice when admitted considerable anxiety has been felt as to the liability of the hospital staff being infected. So far, however, there has been only one instance of infection, in a Nurse, and it is very probable that in this case the infection was direct, as she attended a patient with a very profuse epitaxis 6 days before she herself developed symptoms and may possibly have had some slight abrasion of the skin of her hands. Our immunity, apart from this case, would suggest either that the precautions to destroy vermin have been adequate or that the louse is not the host of this variety of spirochaete.

d x

The treatment of the Palestine cases with Salvarsan and Galyl has not proved as satisfactory as in the cases of the Egyptian type, for most of those so treated relapse repeated after the injections. Though the number of cases of typhus ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ admitted so far is quite small, - only 10 - the fact that the disease is not seen in Australia has been responsible for an unusual amount of interest being taken in them.

The well established close relationship with relapsing fever, generally considered to be due to the infecting organism in both being lice-borne, has been well exemplified in our series of cases. One of the patients had the two diseases concurrently. Again in one day two men were admitted at the same time, who had been working together in a department where native labour was employed, and who gave histories of having been taken ill on the same day with practically identical symptoms, yet one of them turned out to have relapsing fever and the other typhus.

The clinical features of our cases have conformed fairly closely to the classical type. All have had typical rashes and in ~~xx~~ some the rash has been extremely abundant. On the whole the pulse rate, especially in the first few days of the illness, has been rather slower than the text book lead one to expect, in most being under 100 and some under 80, with a temperature of about 104°. We found also that the leucocyte counts had not the diagnostic value that we had anticipated. Instead of ranging from 10,000 - 50,000, our highest count was 10,000 and in the other cases the range was from 5000 - 8000. Our mortality has been relatively high as three cases have died, two from acute toxæmia and the third, nearly three weeks after the crisis, from hæmorrhage and pelvic cellulitis resulting from an ulcer of obscure origin situated in the bowel about 2 inches above the anus.

The majority of the operations were for G.S.W. and the increase in the number of surgical admissions was due to the same cause. The cases of G.S.W. admitted were not nearly as septic as on previous occasions, due in fact to improved facilities for early treatment at the front, but also due to a larger proportion being through and through rifle or machine gun bullet wounds.

I have been anxious to have the Carrel treatment of wounds used on a more extensive scale but have been unable to get Carrel's tubes or tubes of fine calibre, or the necessary glass tubing, or metal connections.

The treatment of chronic joint affections is still hampered by the absence of hot air chambers.

The surgical wards lack any portable lights for use in an emergency at night. This is an urgent matter in view of the likelihood of secondary haemorrhages.

Major Kennedy has commenced work on the surgical side.

Major Brown was in hospital for a week with phlebotomous fever and is now away on convalescent leave.

The work of the staff has been satisfactory.

Concerning routine laboratory work there is little of interest to report except the presence of Relapsing fever and malaria as continued from last month's report.

4.(1) Of very special interest has been an investigation of an organism sent to the laboratory for investigation by Captain P.H. Bahr, R.A.M.C. and Captain Craig., R.A.M.C., of No.2 Field Laboratory, Palestine. This organism was obtained from a Jewish bacteriologist at Jerusalem and had apparently been used by the Germans in the detection of typhus cases by the agglutination phenomenon identical or similar to that described by Weil and Felix in 1915.

An investigation of the morphology, the staining, ~~reager~~ reactions and cultural characteristics etc of this microorganism showed that it was allied to but not identical with M.X2 and M.X,19 stains described and utilised by the Germans, but was probably a member of the Protean group.

The agglutination Reaction was next investigated, over thirty five observations being made on 17 cases of definite typhus fever. In addition 20 pure negative bloods were found negative.

In all cases either during the disease or in convalescence agglutination was obtained in varying dilutions of patients' serum, the limits being

1. Minimum dilution	1	in 20.
2. Maximum	"	1 " 2500.

Preliminary investigation would indicate that the test may prove of considerable diagnostic value, but that the most intense reactions are obtained after the 7th day. Diagnostic agglutination prior to the incidence of rash was not observed.

The intensity of the agglutination reactions afford no index to the prognosis of the case. The mildest case of typhus only developed agglutinin in convalescence, whereas patients with much agglutinin have died.

Culture. from blood and urine and from spleen.P.M. were negative.

The complement fixation test.

The complement fixation reaction was investigated in 15 cases using a bacterial emulsion as antigen. The investigation was entirely negative.

Monkeys were than inoculated subcutaneously with 24 hours broth cultures and strong positive complement fixation tests were obtained within six days of inoculation. Simultaneously agglutination in dilutions 1/320 of monkey's serum was obtained.

Animal Inoculations.

Inoculation of guinea pigs and monkeys were completely negative. No change in temperature was observed nor was there any other indication of pathogenicity on the part of the organism.

Conclusion.

As a result of this investigation it would seem that German observers are wrong in describing this agglutination phenomenon to the presence of this organism as a constant secondary invader. If this were the case the complement fixating body should also be present in typhus case as well as agglutin. It is more rational to ~~have~~ assume that the phenomenon is of the nature of a pseudo-agglutination (possibly of the nature of a group agglutinin).

2. Investigation of the liability of Bilharzia cercariae to chlorinated water.

The following observations were carried out at the request of Captain Briercliffe, R.A.M.C., L of C., Palestine. Bilharzia snails have been found in natives wells in Palestine; bilharzia infection has been found in school children. The advisability of efficiently sterilising well water to bilharzial cercaria has therefore arisen.

Solutions prepared. 4 grams chloride of lime (25% avail oil) to 1 litre of water and stock used in preparation of other solutions.
 First Series. Inacurated infected liver of Planortus snails was added to 50 c.c. of solution.

CONCLUSIONS: The use of chloride of lime in strengths of 1/500000 available chloride as at present used is non-lethal to cercariae. Much stronger solutions must of necessity be used and subsequent de-chlorination be adopted if this method of sterilisation be adopted.

REPORT RE PATHOLOGICAL STAFF:

A most regrettable incident has been the loss of Pte E.V. Panelli who has been boarded for Australia owing to early pulmonary tuberculosis. Pte Panelli joined the laboratory in November 1916 and has worked extremely hard and exceedingly efficiently. It will take many months to train a man to replace him as a medium maker.

Staff Sergeant SULLIVAN was temporarily attached for 1 week to the Institute of Hygiene, Cairo, for instruction re analyses of water, available chlorine etc.

During the month there has been increased activity in this department owing to the arrival of convoys of wounded from Palestine.

TRANSPORT

The transport of patients from the more distant wards to the X ray department, although not severely taxed, was unsatisfactory. At times considerable delay was experienced and on one occasion there was a delay of $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours in transporting one patient from the X ray room to the ward and bringing the next patient for examination.

At such times when there is an extra amount of work to be done especially with many stretcher cases to be examined, it is essential to have at least two separate stretcher parties detailed for this department.

PLATES The number of defective plates has been unusually large, especially the Ilford Plates.

This entails extra work and expense as all these defective plates were rejected as useless, the work had to be repeated, while the remaining plates in the packets from which the defective plates were taken had to be condemned and returned as unserviceable.

The Wellington plates, which were sent with the last requisition are giving satisfactory results.

THERAPEUTIC WORK.

All the therapeutic work is entirely suspended, only a small portion of the necessary apparatus, which was urgently requisitioned on 19/3/18, having come to hand.

EQUIPMENT .

One of the new X ray tubes recently received was found to be broken when the box, in which it was packed, ~~was~~ was opened.

The Lister Engine has been assembled and is working very satisfactorily.

The 31st General Hospital asked for an exchange of localisers offering their slide rule localiser, for our cross thread localiser. No objection was raised but as a slide rule localiser is not required here it was suggested that some therapeutic apparatus left by the 14th A.G.H. at Abbassia should be exchanged in lieu of the localiser.

An offer was also made by the Officer i/c X ray department, 14th A.G.H., subject to the approval of the O.C., 14th A.G.H. to exchange the stereoscopic outfit.
