The following information obtained from Refugees is forwarded for information :-

## (a) From a Refugee from ST BENIN :- (Dated 11/10/18)

" His name is CELESTIN MEREOSE and he has a German Identification Card No. 462. He comes from ST BENIN. He is 56 years of age. He left ST BENIN the day before yesterday and has just come through the lines. He states that for the last fortnight the Germans have been engaged in some work the nature of which he does not know in Q 15 b and d. Some 30 or 40 men are working there. He states that the Germans have blocked the River just below the MILL in Q 28 c 3 3. The Germans have some small trenches and probably M.G. Posts in front of the high bank along the road in Q 23 c, particularly at Q 23 c 8 7. The part of LA ROUX FARM in R 19 a, JONCDEMER FARM in R 25 b and EAST GABLE in Q 24 a are fortified strong points. The main German trench which is a more substantial work with wire in front of it runs approximately from Q 24 a 1 8 to Q 24 Central about to Q 24 d 3 0 to Q 30 b 4 0 to the road junction in Q 30 d. MEREOSE is now going to BECQUIIGNY where he is going to stop. The information was obtained from him through a Gunner DALLEY of 2nd Div. Arty. who acted as Interpreter."

## (b) From two civilians who came from ST SOUPLET this morning (12/10/18):-

## " Machine Guns : -

Many machine guns are located on the Cross Road Junction at Q 34 d 5 8. Others are situated at BANDIVAL FARM in Q 29 c and at "L'ARBRE DE GUISE" and "L'ARBRE GUERNON" in Q 36 and W 6. The M.Gs. are out in front of the houses, and cellars are used as dug-outs.

/ Trenches .....

(b) Continued.Trenches :-

A system of trenches has been dug along both sides of the Railway Lines, running - to the knowledge of the Refugees - throughout the length of Square Q 34 and perhaps more. Communication trenches from the Cross Roads at Q 34 d 5 8 run up to these trenches and they state that it is this trench which has prevented the AMERICANS from crossing the River. There is also a traverse trench near "LE PLATEAU" in Q 34 d.

Wire :-

A double row of barbed wire runs down between the Railway Line and the River. The refugees were told that this had been electrified, and that to touch it meant immediate death. Wire is also in existence along the road running N. and S. through Q 34 a and c.

Artillery :-

The Refugees know nothing of the positions of his guns, excepting two large guns which are firing from just behind the Railway Station. These are presumably in the Sunken Road at Q 34 d 5 9 as they cannot see the guns but know that they are concealed there somewhere.

Mines :-

All the little bridges - foot and other bridges - are mined, and they were warned about them. The roads are also probably mined but that is not certain.

Tracks :-

The main tracks used by the enemy are :-

- (1) The main road between ST SOUPLET and ARBRE GUERNON
- (2) The road N. & S. through Q 22, 28 and 34.
- (3) The road from Q 34 b 4 9 - Q 23 d 8 3.
- (4) The main road from LE CATEAU to WASSIGNY,

Enemy Intentions :-

This, apparently, is to fall back on to MAUBECHE which is already a strong fort.

Morale :-

The morale of the Boches is very low. Many of the soldiers are only young boys and are afraid to go into the line for fear of being killed. They have not system of ration supply and in consequence are robbing the civilians of all they have.

They have great fear of the American and British soldier, whom, in their eyes, have great courage. Of nine Divisions that went to CAMBRAI, two Divisions remain, the remainder being captured or made casualties.

Our aeroplanes do great damage to the retreating armies and inspire great fear among the enemy.

ADDENDA :-

The Refugees state that there is nothing in front of ST MARTIN RIVIERE and that it will be quite easy to cross there and take ST SOUPLET from the rear. (Whether this is correct or not is uncertain). "

1. HARASSING FIRE :-

The minimum expenditure of ammunition for harassing fire will be

18-pr.      4.5" HOW.

Harassing fire will be carried out under Group arrangements.

Two thirds of the above allotment will be expended in crashes during the hours of darkness upon all roads, approaches, trench works and areas likely to afford cover to the enemy, between the following boundaries :-

On the NORTH	--	Q 28 c 0 0	-	Q 24 d 0 6.
On the SOUTH	--	W 22 a 0 8	-	W 12 d 5 0

Those are approximately defining the new Divisional Front to come into force in the near future.

During the hours of daylight all movement and enemy works, etc. will be engaged with direct observation, and within the areas given for night harassing wherever visible all enemy wire will be engaged with direct observation for destruction.
