

The enemy retaliated on the Battery position very severely with 5.9s. and 4.2s., wounding all his detachment. He manned his gun alone and continued the barrage under constant heavy shell fire. He set a fine example to the remaining detachments who had also been depleted by casualties. "



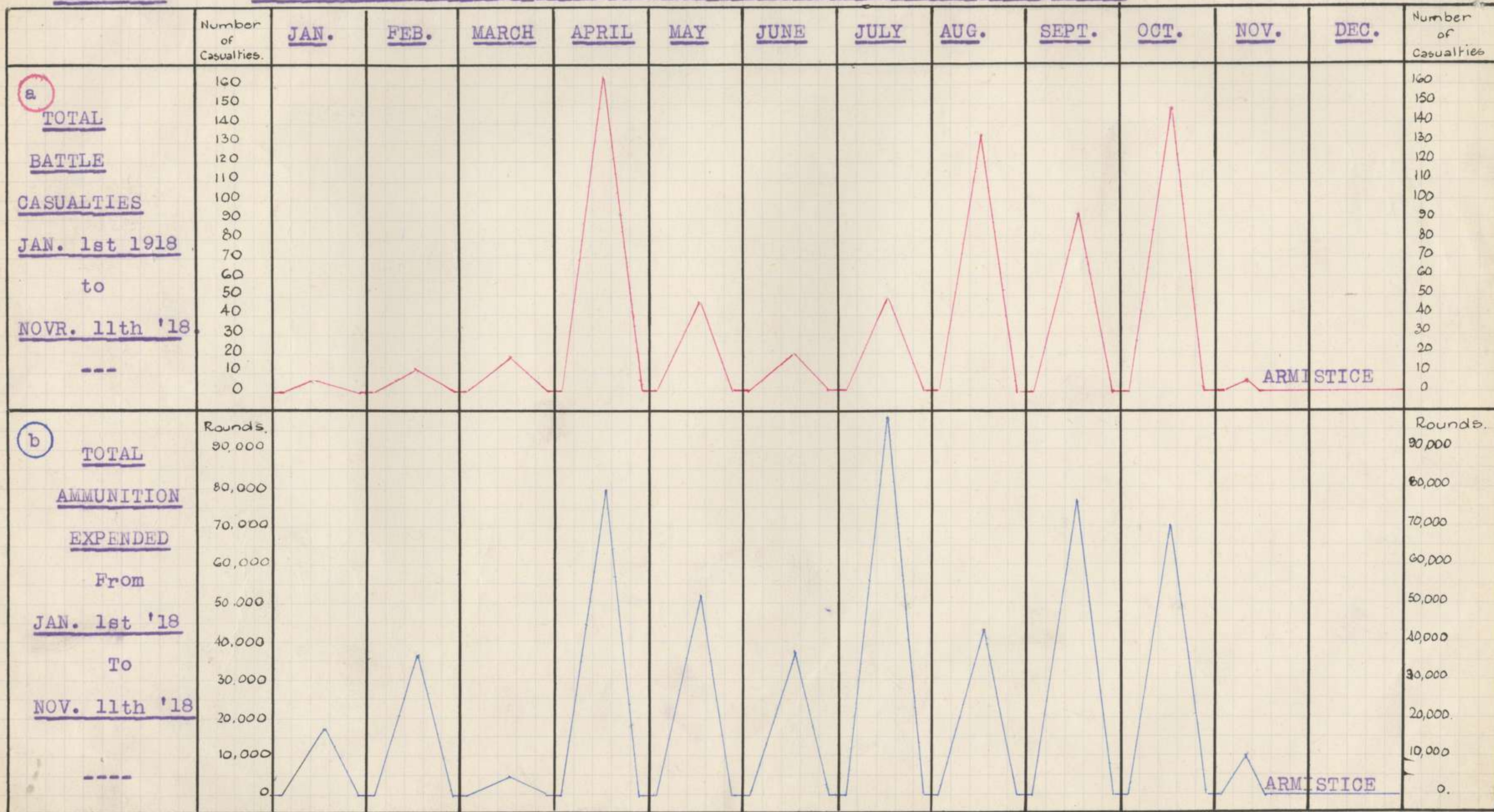

7. It is suggested that prizes should take the form of medals or trophies.

- (b) To organise an Army Championship Meeting.

3. It is of primary importance that as many men as possible should be interested directly in the Competitions, hence competitions should be fostered in all formations. The Army Meeting affords an opportunity for Championship Competitions in events which have been practiced and competed for in the lower formations.

It is necessary, therefore, to settle in advance the events which are to be recognised at the Championship Meeting, and formulate the necessary rules for the same.

Subject to the above, all competitions in the lower formations will be competed for under arrangements made by the formations concerned.

It will be advisable to form a Central Sub-Committee for the Army, and it is suggested that this Committee should consist of the President, one member for Army Troops, and one member for each Corps.

It is considered that competitions should commence early in March, and should be terminated in time to permit the Army Championship to take place about the 15th April.

4. It is suggested that Divisions should inform Corps, and Corps inform Central Sub-Committee, of the dates of the various Competitions in order that they may be widely known, and similarly of the names of suitable judges, in order to further mutual assistance in this respect.

5. It is suggested that each Corps should hold a meeting to discuss matters put forward in this paper, and that subsequently there should be a meeting of the Central Sub-Committee to come to a final decision.

6. Competitions should not be unduly numerous nor of a complicated nature. The following are suggested for the Army Championship meeting :-
