

ARTILLERYO " Four years of Scientific Warfare have seen a consistent and progressive development in the power and influence of Artillery, both in actual infantry battle and in all the stages which have lead up to it. Despite the handicap under which we started the War, British Artillery has played a large part in that development, and of late has dominated the enemy's artillery to an ever increasing degree. The influence of this fact upon the moral - both of our own and the enemy's troops - could scareely be exaggerated. During the present year the greater number of guns available for our use, and the amount and regularity of our ammunition supply, combined with the enemy's weakened powers of resistance, due to the better fighting of the last two years, have for for the most part lead to the substitution of sudden and intense outbursts of fire for the prolonged destructive bombardments which preceded our attacks in 1917. All ranks of the artillery have adapted themselves to these new conditions with complete success, and in the rapid movements of the latter stages of our advance have shown the highest technical skill and the most indefatigable energy. The accuracy and intensity of our barrages, frequently arranged at short notice and with little opportunity being given for ranging or previous reconnoitring of the ground have contributed largely to the success of our infantry attacks. 



You arrived and you were like us, or rather better than us, because you don't know the selfishness of our old civilisation; you do good for the pleasure of seeing others happy and make us love you, and we tell it you quite simply; you did ducceed. The charming feast you organised on the 1st Jan. has shown too well the qualities of your hearts for that ours could be insensible to it.

Under the hard German rule our mothers were only able to procure us bread - often not enough and always black and very dry. The treat you secured us has been as a sunbeam in our childish hearts. You learned the youngest that in life there would be for them something else as dry bread: thus you opened our young hearts to the hope of a better future.

Thanks for the very little ones, also thanks for us. The toys you distributed will be kept as relics; in twenty years we will show to the young generations the gift which was given us in 1919 by the AUSTRALIAN troops billeted in our houses.

And if wewere tempted to forget you, two very eloquent voices are here which would speak of you to the

children who will succeed us on the school benches. The splendid colours of AUSTRALIA and BELGIUM floating above our heads would say us incessantly "These two nations were formerly related by trade. The war made them brothers in the real meaning of the word. Are they not in the future united by the bands of blood?. Did not the sons of the noble AUSTRALIA come freely to defend the Belgian soil and to fall side by side with our soldiers?".

Gentlemen, you gained our gratitude by too many rights that we could never forget you; our hearts are pressed at the thought that every day passing shorts your stay among us.

However, we will not be selfish. We know that in your nice country, numerous are the loving hearts which are praying God to give you an early return.

We will join our prayers to theirs and to children of Catholic Belgium, we will ask the Almighty to bless always our dear Australians and to render their country already so rich, more and more prosperbus.

Soon, the so desired peace will spread at last its favours on the world, and will allow you to return, covered with glory, to the distant country which you did leave voluntarily, to be the eager defenders of Right and Justice.
