

The 2nd Aust. Div. speration will be supported by a creeping barrage in accordance with Barrage Map herewith, and also covered by a smoke barrage as laid down in para 4.

Procedure for Creeping Barrage will be as follows:-

Open at Zero on Start Line, remain there till Zero
plus 6 mins., then lift and move forward at a uniform
rate of 100 yards per four minutes. After batteries lift
off the RED line shown on Barrage Map they will engage
selected localities(@), always moving forward according
to the times and lifts shown on the Barrage Map. All
batteries will cease firing as they reach the Objective
(GREEN Line).
