

Dental Parade held when Dental Officer inspected personnel of all Units. Training proceeding satisfactorily. 2/hieut. J.S. Murray reported formduty from 1st. D.A.C. C.R.A. and Brigade Major visited Brigade Headquarters and interviewed C.O. and Battery Commanders re commencement of Battery manoeuvres. Batteries at manoeuvres. Notification of cessation of hostilities received to-day. Flags of Allies were hung in the town by the civil population and bells were chimed. Lieut. G.G. Paterson, Signal Officer attached, recalled to Divisional Headquarters. Lieuts. P.P. Scrivener, J.L.G. Duffy, and A.N. Lewis proceeded on leave to Faris. Another measles case reported in 1st. Battery, as a consequence of which Battery was isolated. Notification received that French Legion D'Honneur (Chevalier) had been awarded to Lieut-Col. E.T. Deam, D.S.O. Batteries at manoeuvres. R.M.O. commenced inoculation. Capt. Heckle, R.A.F., lectured on "The Air Service". C.R.A. and Brigade Major attended. Lieut-Colonel E.T.
