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

1. PLAN OF ATTACK.(a) OBJECTIVE:-

The General plan was to capture the line HERLEVILLE-CHUIGNES.

For this purpose the attack was to be divided into three phases, first phase to be the taking of the line as shown on attached map A, the second phase exploitation forward of this line to the line as shown on attached Map A and the third phase which was more or less dependent upon the success attending the preceding phases, was to consist of an advance by the Reserve Brigade. Line, shown on attached Map A., Brigade boundaries for each phase are shown on attached Map A.

(b) FORMATIONS:-

For the 1st and 2nd Phases, the 2nd A.I.Bde. with 2 Battalions in line (6th Bn. on right, 5th Bn. on left) and 2 in support (8th Bn. on right 7th Bn. on left) was to be on the right, and the 1st A.I.Bde. with 2 battalions in line (4th Bn. on right 1st Bn. on left) 1 in support (3rd Bn) 1 in reserve (2nd Bn) was to be on the left.

The 3rd A.I.Bde. was to be in Divisional Reserve.

The 3rd A.I.Bde. was to undertake the 3rd Phase, at the completion of which it would be the left Brigade in the line, 1st A.I.Bde. the centre Brigade in the line, and the 2nd A.I.Bde. the right Brigade in the line.

At Zero Hour the 14th Bde. of 5th Aust.Div. was to come under orders of G.O.C. 1st Aust.Div. in Divisional Reserve.

(c) FLANKS:-

32nd Division on the right were to attack simultaneously

3rd Aust.Div. on the left were also to attack simultaneously but the action was cancelled on the 20th August, the G.O.C. 3rd A.I.Bde. being instructed to throw back a defensive flank on the line SQUARE WOOD - FROISSY BEACON, after his objectives had been made good.

(d) ARTILLERY.

Nine Field Artillery Brigades were to be available for the operation.

Corps Heavy Artillery were to fire on selected targets.

3rd Aust.Div. Artillery supplied a smoke barrage to cover the 2nd Phase of the operation.

8" Newtons belonging to Divisional Artillery were to be emplaced and employed.

Artillery barrage map was issued by Aust.Corps.

At Zero plus 3 minutes the barrage was to lift at the rate of 100 yards in 2 minutes for 3 lifts.

From the 4th lift inclusive, the barrage was to lift at the rate of 100 yards in 3 minutes as far as the barrage halt line, shown on attached Map B. The barrage was to halt on this line for 15 minutes and was then to lift at 100 yards in 3 minutes up to and beyond the final objective, when the barrage was to halt for 15 minutes and then cease.

Ammunition to be used for barrage purposes was 50% Shrapnel 25% 106 Fuze, H.E. and 25% 101 Fuze delay or non delay H.E. Artillery smoke screens were to be placed on BRAY Spur in L.23. and across the mouth of the CHUIGNOLLES Valley. No special percentage of smoke was to be used to define stages of the barrage.

(e) TANKS:-

The allotment of fighting and supply Tanks was to be as follows:-

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12 Mark V. Tanks from 13th Tank Bn. to 2nd A.I.Bde.
 12 Mark V. Tanks from 2nd Tank Bn. to 1st A.I.Bde.
 3 Mark 4 Supply Tenders from No. 4 Tank Supply Coy. to
 each of the 1st and 2nd A.I.Bdes.

Tank Coy. Commanders were to be responsible for liaison with the Infantry to which they were allotted. Tanks were to assemble in the MORCOURT VALLEY by dawn on August 22nd.

Tanks supporting the 32nd Division viz., the 8th Tank Bn. on seeing the 32nd Division fairly established on the objective, were to turn north and assist the 2nd A.I.Brigade if the high ground in R.24. and 30 and K.19, 25 and 31 was still holding on.

2½ Hours after Zero, Tanks were to be released automatically and were to rally in the valley N. of PROYART. Details regarding the supplies to be carried by the Mark IV Supply Tenders were to be arranged direct between the G.O.C. No. 4 Tank Supply Coy. and G.O.C. Brigades concerned.

(f) MACHINE GUNS.

1 M.G. Coy. of 1st Aust.M.G.Bn. was to be affiliated to each Brigade for the operation.

1 Coy. was to have barrage tasks on the left flank of the 1st A.I.Bde.

The 14th and 15th A.M.G.Coys. were to assist in barrage tasks until Zero plus 5 minutes.

(g) AEROPLANE CO-OPERATION.

Contact planes were to call for ground flares from the most advanced line of infantry. For this purpose a contact plane was to fly along the line of the objective at Zero Plus 2 hours.

Metal discs in addition to flares were issued to the Infantry for showing their advanced positions.

Counter attack aeroplanes were to fly constantly. Ammunition carrying planes were to drop ammunition for Vickers guns at positions which were to be defined by white cloth "Vs".

Smoke bombs on the side of the Knoll in Square 35 D. were to be dropped by aircraft.

(h) FORMING UP AND ASSEMBLY POSITIONS.

A taped line shown on attach Map for the assaulting troops to be formed up on was to be laid by Field Engineer Companies, 1st Aust.Div. under the supervision of the General Officers Commanding 1st and 2nd A.I.Bdes.

Assaulting troops were to be formed up on the taped line one hour before zero.

Troops of the 5th Aust.Div. were to remain in the front line positions until the forming up was completed, and were then to be withdrawn to the old trenches in R.13, 19 and 25, reverting to the Command of the G.O.C. 5th Aust.Div.

Patrols of the line Battalions were to remain out in front until Zero minus 15 minutes.

The 3rd A.I.Bde. the Reserve Brigade, was to move at Zero hour to positions in Squares R.19, B and D, and R.25.b.

(i) ZERO HOUR was fixed at 4-45 a.m. on 23rd August, 1918

2. OPERATIONS.

(a) APPROACH MARCH.

(1) Infantry. The approach marches of the two assaulting Brigades were made during the night 21st/22nd August, the 1st A.I.Bde. Group moving from VAUX area to support positions in old trenches,

Squares R.7., R.13., Q.12, and 18 and the 2nd A.I.Bde. Group from HAMELET area to support positions in trenches R.19 and 25 and Q.30.

The Reserve Brigade Group (3rd A.I.Bde. Group) moved on the afternoon of the 21st August from VAIRES area to the Reserve Bde. area of the 5th Aust.Div. South of MORCOURT.

All moves were by march route.

Complete groups moved except tents sub-divisions of Field Ambulances.

D.H.Q. opened at Q.13.a.3.8. at 6 p.m. 22nd August.

The march of the assaulting Brigades (1st and 2nd A.I.Bdes.) to the forming up positions was made during the night 22nd/23rd inst.

1st A.I.Bde. reported "in position" at 4-17 a.m. 23rd August and 2nd A.I.Bde. reported "in position" at 3-45 a.m.

Several casualties were suffered during the forming up caused by the enemy's intermittent shelling.

2. TANKS.

Tanks for the operation were assembled in the MORCOURT VALLEY by dawn on August 22nd.

On night 22nd/23rd August, Tanks commenced moving forward at 9-30 p.m. to the Tank start line, which was approximately 100 yards in rear of the Infantry taped line. They moved under full engines to a line not nearer to the Tank start line than 300 yards and from there they continued the movement to the Tank start line as slowly and as quietly as possible.

Tanks reached Tank start line well on time.

At Zero minus 20 minutes Tanks moved forward from Tanks start line, so that they could be deployed in front of the Infantry on the infantry taped line when the barrage lifted at zero plus 3 minutes.

Aeroplanes of the 5th Bde.R.A.F. flew continuously over the forward area between 9-30 p.m. and 1 a.m. night 22nd/23rd and from Zero minus 1 hour to Zero, in order to conceal the noise of the Tank engines.

Normal Field Artillery and M.G.fire was also employed for this purpose.

(b) 1st PHASE. (Stages of each advance are shown on att. Map R)

At Zero Hour the Barrage which was reported to have been good in all respects fell about 200 yards in advance of our taped line. Battle tanks supporting the left Brigade, well to time, moved through our line and at once commenced to follow the barrage to attack.

Battle Tanks supporting the right Brigade however, were behind time, and only succeeded in catching up to the infantry at a later stage of the advance.

The left Battalion of the left Brigade moved to the attack in artillery formation covered by a screen of scouts.

Little opposition was met with in the initial stage and by 5-30 a.m. the village of CHUIGNOLLES was in our hands. Tanks played an important part in this capture and when the village had been enveloped gave valuable aid in mopping up.

Almost immediately CHUIGNOLLES WOOD fell into our hands. Owing to heavy M.G.fire being encountered in front of the wood, a temporary withdrawal was made to the sunken road south of the wood.

On the extreme left however the enemy was not easily dislodged. Enemy L.Guns gave considerable trouble and it was only after stiff fighting that the left flank platoon was able to reach the objective.

The right Battalion of the left Brigade made full use of the available Tanks. Two companies led the advance of the Battalion in lines of sections.

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At 5-15 a.m. our troops were entering MATTO WOOD. ROBERT WOOD was found to be strongly held, but when surrounded, the enemy occupying the wood freely surrendered. Resistance from the outskirts of MATTO WOOD was quickly overcome with the assistance of a Tank and the advance continued. The sunken road at R.16.d.9.6. provided a large batch of prisoners who surrendered without offering resistance.

Meanwhile the Right Bde. had followed the barrage without the assistance of the Tanks.

The opposition offered the Loft En. was unexpectedly light though the supporting Companies had to be utilized to mop up the large expanses of St.MARTINS WOOD.

In this work the forward companies of the left support Bn. also became involved. However, the leading infantry were able to keep touch with the barrage and at 5-30 a.m. when the barrage halted for 15 minutes the situation was well in hand.

The right Bn. however had met much more severe opposition. The ground was difficult country to advance over, being broken by deep gullies and sunken roads. Small thick woods were in abundance. The enemy outlost line was quickly and easily over-run, but the defence of St.DENIS WOODS supported by enfilade fire from R.29. central delayed the advance considerably. Consequently the barrage was lost. Fortunately the supporting tanks had by this time reached the Infantry and the advance was continued with their support.

The situation along the Divisional front at 5-33 a.m. when the Barrage along a portion of the advance halted for 15 minutes was as follows:-

The two centro Battalions and the right of the extreme left Battalion had surmounted all obstacles and were well in touch with the Barrage.

The advance along the whole line had not been seriously opposed except N.W. of CHUIGNOLLES at MATTO WOODS, and at St.DENIS WOODS. All resistance at those points however was broken down before the barrage was lost, except on the right at St.DENIS WOODS.

The advanced infantry at 5-33 a.m. were approximately N and S. along the line from R.3.c.5.6 - R.4.c.5.3 - R.10.b.3.4 - R.10.b.8.5 - R.10.d.8.8 - R.11.c.5.1 - R.17.c.5.3 - R.23.a.4.0 - R.23.a.7.0 - R.29.b.1.7 - then roughly S.W. to St.DENIS WOODS.

On the barrage lifting forward from the "Infantry Halt Line" the advance was resumed.

The right Bn. of the left Brigade with two fresh Companies in line met strong opposition from the ridge at R.17.d.9.0 to D.9.8. and from St.MARTINS WOODS but the attack was resolutely pushed home and with the co-operation of tanks the high ground in R.24. A and R.17.d. was captured.

The left Battalion of the left Bdo. by this time had commenced upon the 2nd Phase of the fighting which will be outlined in Sub-para (a) below.

The Right Brigade by this time had apparently lost the first impetus of the attack and the advance was meeting more opposition and progress was slow. The left Battalion succeeded in reaching the final objective without very many casualties, but on the extreme right, all four companies of the right Battalion and one company of the right supporting Battalion had been drawn into the fight. Casualties were heavy.

The enemy in HERLEVILLE WOODS made opposition, but infantry pushed around them and by 7 a.m. leading companies were on the objective. The enemy in HERLEVILLE WOODS was still holding out using M.G.Guns&sniping. This area was not finally cleared of the enemy until the evening.

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The situation then along the Divisional front at the end of the First Phase at 7 a.m. (about 30 minutes after the cessation of our Barrage) was as follows:-

On the right touch had been lost with the 32nd Div. and a gap of some hundreds of yards existed, through which the enemy was endeavouring to penetrate. The right supporting Bn. was ordered to move up one company to fill this gap. (This was eventually successfully accomplished and the right flank secured.)

The Right Brigade though having suffered heavy losses was approximately within 300 yards of its final objective.

The right Battalion of the left Brigade had reached its final objective, but had lost touch with units on its flanks. Defensive flanks were thrown back and touch was eventually secured.

The left Battalion of the left Brigade was carrying on the 2nd Phase of the attack as outlined below.

(c) Second Phase.

This was purely exploitation, without artillery support. In the case of the left Battalion owing to the shorter distance between jumping off line and the objective of the 1st Phase, and to the fact that the Barrage was moving eastward while the direction of exploitation was Northward, exploitation was in progress long before the other Battalions had reached their objectives.

The extreme left continued to be harassed by M.G. fire. A patrol sent from the wood at R.4.c.0.2. to clear up the situation, succeeded reaching LONG WOOD but was forced to return to cover by heavy M.G. fire.

The Reserve company of the left Battalion then moved forward and attacked LONG WOOD with two platoons along the W. slope of CHUIGNOLLES valley, the remaining 2 platoons being kept in hand for the capture of LUG WOOD.

The attack was successful as far as the road at R.4.d.1.8. where the attacking parties were temporarily checked by heavy M.G. fire and direct anti-tank gun fire from R.4.b.2.6, MARLY WOODS HILL and LONG WOOD itself. The platoons however, were reorganised and deployed and they pushed home the attack capturing the wood and taking 40 prisoners.

Meanwhile the right flank of the left Battalion had advanced. A company of the 3rd Bn. passed through the right company of the left Battalion and established itself in ARGY WOOD at R.17.b.1.6.

After a conference by local commanders separate platoons were given tasks which were successfully accomplished and the right flank of the Battalion was secured along the line R.4.b.0.1 - along the railway through R.11.a - R.17.a.6.6 to ARGY WOODS.

However, the left was still insecure, LUG WOOD remaining un-captured. The 2 platoons of the reserve company mentioned above who were detailed for the task crept across the ridge at about R.3.c.5.4 - R.3.Central and launched the attack on the wood. Little resistance was met and the wood was captured.

While this local fighting was taking place CHUIGNOLLES WOOD, in the centre, which had been temporarily evacuated, was again occupied without opposition.

At the close of Phase 2 the line ran as follows:-

R.3.a.1.8 - N. of LUG WOOD - N. of LONG WOOD - R.4.d.5.7 - R.5.c.2.2 - R.11.central - R.11.d.5.0 then South as before.

(d) Third Phase.

Plan. Zero Hour for the 3rd Phase was fixed at 2 p.m. A creeping barrage for the operation was provided by about 3 field artillery brigades, which had come forward rapidly during the morning.

The 1st Bdo. was to advance their line under the barrage to the spurs of high ground from MARLY WOODS S.E. to R.5.d. to the high ground E. of CHUIGNES.

3rd A.I.Bdo. was to advance in a N.E. direction through the left of the 1st A.I.Bdo. with 12th Bn. on the right, 9th Bn. on the left, and 11th Bn. in support. Boundaries are as shown on attached map.

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APPENDIX

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Operation:-

The 1st Bde. advanced to time and the Spur in R.5.d. was reached although the enemy freely used his Machine Gun throughout the barrage.

Lewis guns were immediately established at R.5.d.3.8. to assist the advance of the 3rd A.I.Bde.

By 3-30 p.m. our hold on the spur was secure. On the left the enemy continued to offer resistance, but by the use of ground and fire the enemy were dislodged and either taken prisoner or shot down while attempting to escape.

Further on the right the centre Battalion advanced to time and in spite of heavy M.G. fire, and artillery fire, succeeded in storming the enemy positions in R.11.b. whereupon the enemy hurriedly retreated.

Meanwhile to conform to the move forward of the other Bns. the right Bn. of the 1st A.I.Bde. pushed forward posts to the approximate line M.7.d.5.0 - M.13.d.6.0 - R.24.a.8.0. Little opposition was met and platoon posts were established along this line.

3rd Aust. Inf. Bde:- While the 1st A.I.Bde. was preparing to change direction and to attack in an Easterly direction, the 3rd A.I.Bde. was advancing in artillery formation with its left flank on the Canal across the high ground in R.9.

At about 2 p.m. the troops deployed on the line the 1st A.I.Bde. had advanced to during the morning. On the left the 9th Bn. and the left of the 12th Bn. came into immediate contact with the enemy.

Small parties of the enemy were mopped up but infantry resistance was not severe.

Artillery fire however was severe and the left Battalion suffered heavy casualties and was considerably delayed and disorganized. Battalion boundaries were indefinite.

The 11th Bn. in support was quickly drawn into the fight. Two companies came into the fight in support of the 9th Bn. The ground North of the Canal near FROISSY BEACON was mopped up by the 9th and 11th Bns. and later occupied by the 3rd Division Pioneers.

The heights overlooking CHUIGNOLLES had been stormed meanwhile, by the 12th Bn. and a fight ensued on the top in which our troops although exhausted caused the enemy to retire to CARENNE WOOD. During this fighting, the 10th Bn. were extending a protective flank along the river.

By this time the 12th Battalion were up to CARENNE WOOD - a frontal attack on which seemed to be too formidable an undertaking.

Accordingly an enveloping movement was launched with the result that the wood was captured with 70 prisoners and one company of the 12th Bn. operating to the left meeting little resistance was able to follow up the retreating enemy to within 400 yards of CAPPY.

By night fall the 3rd A.I.Bde. was established on the line from N. to S. L.29.d.0.0. through SQUARE WOOD - L.36.c.2.5 - R.6.s.5.9 - R.6.c.9.6.

During the fighting on the left, the other two Brigades had not been idle. The 1st Brigade had conformed to the movement of the 3rd Brigade. The 2nd Brigade had pushed out patrols but owing to the heavy casualties they had suffered and the resistance offered by the enemy not much progress was made.

The line along the Divisional front at the close of the Day's fighting ran approx. as follows from N. to S.
L.29.d.0.0 - L.35.d.8.8 - L.36.c.40. - R.6.a.5.0 - M.7.b.7.0 - M.7.d.5.0.
M.13.d.6.0 - R.24.a.8.0 - R.24.c.7.0 - R.30.c.6.7 - R.30.c.9.8 -
R.36.a.6.0 as shown on attached Map C.

This closed the day's operations completing Phases, 1, 2 & 3.

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(o) Subsequent advances.

Night 23/24th, passed quietly patrols pushing the line forward for short distances at different places, with artillery's support the Loft Bde. advanced their line as shown on attached Map C.

Night 23/25th, was remarkable for a very heavy gas shell concentration placed along the right Brigade and centre brigade front. It was particularly severe in the gullies and woods on the extreme right. Heavy casualties were caused and next day when the heat caused the gas to rise several portions of the rear areas had to be evacuated. During this night re-organisation of front line elements throughout the Division took place.

On the 25/26th, the right Brigade pushed forward about 300 yards but was too weak in numbers to effectively exploit success.

The centre Brigade pushed out patrols and established a line of posts from M.14.b.3.9, to M.20.a.9.4. A post was also pushed out E. of CANARD WOOD.

The Loft Brigade as a result of the Division on the left having continued the advance moved forward at 4 p.m. under an artillery barrage. Severe opposition was encountered.

More or less confused fighting ensued as a result of which the Divisional front line by dawn 26th August ran as follows:-

G.24.d - G.31.b - G.32.c - M.2.central. M.2.d - M.8.a.5.0 - E. of LAPIN WOOD then S. to M.20.a.9.4 - then W. to M.19.b.5.0. then roughly South through M.19.d - M.25.b and D - M.31.b (as shown on attached Map C.)

26th August:- With the 11th Bn. on the right and 10th Bn. on the left the 3rd A.I.Bde. again advanced at 6 a.m.

With the support of advanced artillery and by careful use of ground and troops the line was gradually pushed forward until 7 p.m. the line was as shown on attached Map C.

The centre Brigade meanwhile had advanced to a line as follows:- M.9.a.8.7 - M.9.a.5.0 - M.9.c.8.4 - M.9.c.8.0 , M.15.a.7.7 - M.14.d.9.5 - M.14.d.6.0 - M.20.b.4.5 - M.19.b.5.0.

During the night 26/27th the Division was relieved by the 2nd Aust.Div. Line as handed over ran as follows:-

G.21.b.8.0 - G.21.d.8.7 - G.21.d.7.0 - G.27.b..2.2, G.33.b.2.8 - G.33.central - M.3.d.0.0 - M.9.a.5.0 - M.9.c.8.0 - M.15.a.1.2 - M.20. b.2.5 - M.20.a.0.1 - M.19.b.5.0 - M.19.d.5.2 - M.25.b.1.0 - M.25.d.6.0-- M.31.b.5.0.

APPENDIX II.LESSONS.

Notes and Lessons from the Operations for capture of CHUIGNES VALLEY, have already been forwarded under date 31st Aug. 1918.

Additional Notes.

1. The supply of S.A.A. to Vickers Guns by aeroplanes was not altogether a success owing to a high wind which carried the parachutes well wide of the mark.
2. Brigade Headquarters were chosen approximately beforehand by the map. A Section of Engineers was sent forward to select and make a position near the Brigade Forward Report Centre and the move forward was made as the general situation developed.
3. The officer in command of a section of Vickers Guns allotted to a Battalion should remain himself with the Battalion Commander and not with the guns in order to keep touch with orders and moves.
4. It was again demonstrated how very necessary it is for artillery barrage maps to reach the line battalions at least 24 hours before the attack because the artillery barrage in practice defines the infantry objectives in detail.
5. There was general agreement as to the great value of Supply Tanks.
6. An Artillery brigade working well forward with the infantry during exploitation laid stress on the following points.
 - (a) The artillery and Infantry Brigade Headquarters should be together and as the artillery commander must be near his guns it is suggested that the Infantry Brigadier should try to arrange accordingly.
 - (b) the usefulness of mounted officers patrols.
 - (c) Brigade Report centre central to all batteries, which may or may not become artillery Brigade Headquarters.

1. INFORMATION.

- (i) The 2nd American Corps (Corps H.Q. and 27th and 30th American Divisions, less Artillery) will be employed in conjunction with the Aust Corps for the next series of operations.
Advanced Headquarters of 2nd American Corps will open at N.15.D.Central (near Aust Corps H.Q.) on a date to be notified later.
- (ii) 30th American Division (less Artillery) arrives in Aust Corps area by bus on nights 22/23rd and 23/24th Septr and will be accommodated in the TINCOURT Area prior to taking over the sector now held by 1st.Aust. Division.
Advanced D.H.Q. 30th American Division will be established with 1st.Aust.Divisional Headquarters.
- (iii) 27th American Division (less Artillery) is de-training at TINCOURT on nights 23/24 and 24/25th Septr and will relieve 74th and 18th British Divisions (less Artillery) on night 25/26th under orders of III. Corps.

2. RELIEF.

- (i) 1st.Aust.Division (less Artillery) will be relieved by 30th American Division (less Artillery) in the line on 23rd and night 23/24th inst.
Relief will be completed and command will pass to G.O.C. 30th American Division at 10.a.m. on 24th Septr.
- (ii) Relief will be effected in accordance with attached Table.
- (iii) Advance parties of the Line Brigade 30th American Division will report to Headquarters 2nd and 3rd.Aust. Inf.Bdes on 22nd inst and will go into line on night 22/23rd inst.
- (iv) Representatives of all units of 2nd and 3rd.Aust. Inf.Bdes in the line will remain with corresponding units of 30th American Division until the morning of 25th Septr.
- (v) Machine Gun reliefs will be effected on night 24/25th inst.
