

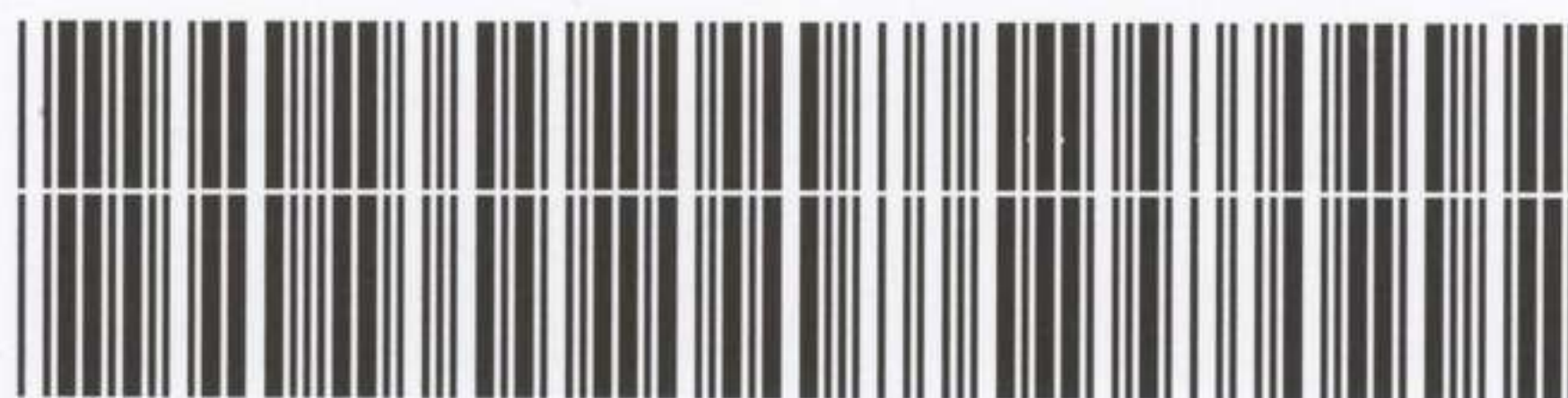



Evacuation of casualties JUL 1918

Since the Brigade took over this Section of the line, there have been only 1/2 dozen casualties, a most fortunate circumstance for evacuation from any of the front line works would, even in case of a very small Turkish advance, prove exceedingly troublesome.

The position of the Ambulance is at present in a nullah, roughly situated in H. 17. a. 1 in 40,000 Jericho. This Ambulance did not take over the same area (namely, just South of Madbeh) as that occupied by the Amb. which it relieved, namely the 1st A. L. H. Amb. owing to the extremely dusty and exposed camp site of the latter. The 1st Field Amb were so heavily shelled on the afternoon of the night on which they moved out that the position was considered most unsuitable for an Amb. This present location has certain advantages and disadvantages; of the former there is comparative freedom from dust; cleanliness and good protection, of the latter. The main one is the great distance from certain front line posts, but this is counterbalanced by the fact that, if an attack did occur wounded, once they had been "got back" to the Ambulance would be in a position where they could be efficiently treated and under good protection.

It would be a great difficulty, while an actual attack was proceeding to evacuate casualties to the Amb. from the position held by the 8th L. H. It would be practically impossible to remove cases from Musallabeh to the Bluff where 8th L. H. is situated and even from Maskerah to the Bluff would be by no means easy owing to the exposed nature of the ground to be traversed. Again evacuation from the Bluff across the Auzah would be practically impossible as the road is in full view from the East and from all accounts was kept under heavy barrage fire in the last attack as were all other roads and tracks in the area.

In view of an attack occurring arrangements have been made for the formation of two advanced Aid posts in the 8th lines, one at Musallabeh and the other at the Bluff, both in charge of an officer (Med). As regards the matter of collecting sick, this is performed nearly entirely by caçolet camel, mostly at night time, except in severe cases when an Amb. wagon is sent forward as far as possible, the patient being carried by stretcher the rest of the way; occasionally a relay of Camel and wagon is made use of.

A certain amount of difficulty was experienced on first arrival in the area, owing to bearer escorts not knowing the positions of the various batteries, units & posts, but this is remedied now and most men of the unit, have a fair knowledge of the positions. There is practically only one objection to collecting at night and that is it interferes with the men's rest, as sleep during the day is nearly impossible owing to the heat and if possible affords little refreshment.

Day collection of sick is done for all units south of the Auzah and usually from the 10th L. H. Rgt.

From the Amb. to the Div. Rec. Stn. evacuation is done mostly by Amb. Wagon to Del. to Sultan where patients are collected by Amb. Motor and taken to D. R. previous notification having been sent through A. D. M. S. office as to the number of patients to be evacuated.

In addition to the horsed vehicles, there is one motor Amb. used which evacuates direct into Div. Rec. Station.

Climatic Condition of the Jordan Valley JUL 1918

From certain figures which have been published it would be thought by outsiders with no experience of the valley that the heat experienced was by no means abnormal or extraordinary.

In order therefore to furnish a slight idea of the temperature to be endured under actual living conditions and in favorable circumstances the following list of shade temperatures is submitted.

Location. On top of hill at Madbeh in a D. C. L. tent shaded and sheltered from the wind.

As stated above these temperatures were taken in D. C. L. tent and situated in a better and fresher position than is available to the majority of men whose only protection consists of bivouac sheets, in most cases.

What the average maximum temperature is in a bivouac shelter at midday has not been obtained at this ambulance, but would surely be remarkable
