





JORDAN VALLEY	1.7.18.		D.D.M.S. Conference was held at Descorps Rest Station. The malarial situation in the Jordan Valley was again reviewed. The malarial rate is progressively increasing. Experiments carried out with prophylactic quinine up to the present have not proved encouraging. No diminution in malarial incidence can be seen in those units who are taking prophylactic quinine. It was suggested that Benign cases might be treated at the Rest Station, thus saving unnecessary evacuation. This question was to be further looked into by D.D.M.S.	GEN
	2.7.18.		Routine as usual. D.D.M.S. visits these headquarters. Receiving Station report this evening that they have 72 lying cases for evacuation. D.D.M.S. Descorps communicated with re provision of heavy cars.	GEN
	3.7.18.		An evacuating centre was established on the South side of TEL ES SULTAN where light motor ambulances are to meet and take over the patients from light ambulance waggons, at 1000 daily. The number of cars required being notified to the Receiving Station from this office. A company of Sikh Pioneers commenced work on the WADI NUEIAMEH this morning. Bedouin interference with the aqueducts in this area continues to give trouble.	GEN
	4.7.18.		Weather conditions very trying. Malarial work in the area is well in hand. Regimental maintenance parties are constantly at work which is of a satisfactory nature.	
	5.7.18.		4th. L.H.F?Ambulance take over from 22nd. Mounted Brigade Field Ambulance and come under our administration. Owing to the large number of cases of malaria occurring in the 1st. L.H.Reg. the C.O. 1st. L.H.F.A. was instructed to have blood slides taken and examinations for malaria made of all the men of one Squadron with a view to ascertaining the number of apyrexial cases carrying on duty.	
	6.7.18.		75 cases of malaria B.T. 34 cases of malaria M.T. and 19 cases of diarrhoea, one presenting clinical features of dysentery occurred in this sector during the week, also one case of diphtheria. The sanitary conditions of the area are good. Flies are at a minimum. A sudden increase of malaria has occurred during the week. This has been almost entirely confined to units holding front line trenches. No repellent cream has as yet been issued in spite of frequent applications. As this is the only protective measure at our disposal for men on outpost its immediate issue is imperative. Sick admissions 5 Off 274 O/Ranks. Evacuations 4 Off 254 O/Ranks. Percentage of daily admissions .55. Evacuations .50. Detailed statement by Regiments attached. (These figures are for the Division and not for the sector) Temperature record for week attached. 	7.7.18.		Field ambulances were instructed to wire DIPVANE Cairo by 1100 daily numbers of sick and wounded in Ambulance at midnight. Wire to discriminate between sick and wounded, British and Indian, Officers and other ranks.	
	8.7.18.		Information received from D.D.M.S. that repellent cream is now available and can be collected from No. 8 A.D.M. Stores JERUSALEM. A box car was immediately detailed to collect same. Authority was obtained for the supply of 20 fanatis for the Anzac Receiving Station. Anzac Receiving Station was instructed to despatch the 50/Ranks of 22nd. Mounted Field Ambulance attached to rejoin their unit.	69 WAD GEN
	10.7.18.		Order No. 132 received from "G" Branch attached. Sikh Pioneers completed their work on the WADI NUEIAMEH today. The work has been very heavy owing to the thick undergrowth and high reeds and the work done by the Pioneers has been of a high standard. The maintenance parties from N.Z. Brigade and Divisional troops can now maintain this area. The swamp at TEA POST in the WADI MELLAHAH has now been completely drained. The Mallahah is rapidly falling and the flow of water is very sluggish.	APP. 3. 161701 69 GEN



JORDAN VALLEY	10.7.18.		The salinity of the water is high and a large number of small fish in the stream prevent mosquito breeding. A portion of the AUJAH between the Obeideh Junction and the Mallahah is requiring constant maintenance. A large number of springs arise in this area and oiling is the only method of satisfactorily preventing breeding. Capt. Morrison of No.6 Malaria Diagnosis Station was instructed to hand over his equipment and staff to 1st. L.H.F.A. and proceed to No.2 Malaria Diagnosis Station JAFFA.	62N
	11.7.18.		Administrative instruction with Anzac Mounted Division Order No. 132 issued and attached.	APP. 4. 62N
	13.7.18.		149 cases of malaria B.T. and 57 cases of malaria M.T. were diagnosed for the Sector for the week. There was also one case of relapsing fever and one of amoebic dysentery reported. Horse manure is now being used extensively in the making of roads and has already greatly reduced the dust nuisance. Drinking from unauthorised sources particularly in the Wadi Aujah is still going on freely; with the prevailing temperatures it is apparently impossible to completely control this breach of discipline. Properly chlorinated supplies are available at frequent intervals along the Wadi. Sick admitted for the Division 5 off 310 O/Ranks. Evacuated 5 off 285 O/Ranks. Daily percentage admissions .64. 	1315		Receiving Station instructed to send forward all light motor ambulances to Divisional Collecting Station. A steady flow of casualties was now arriving at the Divisional Collecting Station, including many Germans. Evacuation went on steadily all day. 3rd. L.H.Brigade arrived and came under our administration.	
	1630		Large number of cases of heat exhaustion occurred amongst German prisoners arriving at Divisional Headquarters. The prisoners were wearing small caps which gave absolutely no protection against the sun. There were no helmets amongst them.

Owing to the frequent interchanging of camp sites which is at present going on, it is suggested that a fixed standard of sanitation should be laid down, to be conformed to by all units on occupying or vacating an area. 

A case of ANTHRAX has been found in this Division.

For the future, in all cases of sudden death blood smears must be taken and forwarded direct to this office. No carcase is to be skinned or touched in any way whatsoever until the result of the microscopic examination is known by the Veterinary Officer concerned.

Where examination proves positive, Veterinary officers are responsible that the carcase is completely and efficiently destroyed by fire.

When a case of ANTHRAX is found, Veterinary officers must also report the fact to all the Medical Officers of the Unit concerned, that precautionary measures may immediately be adopted.
