

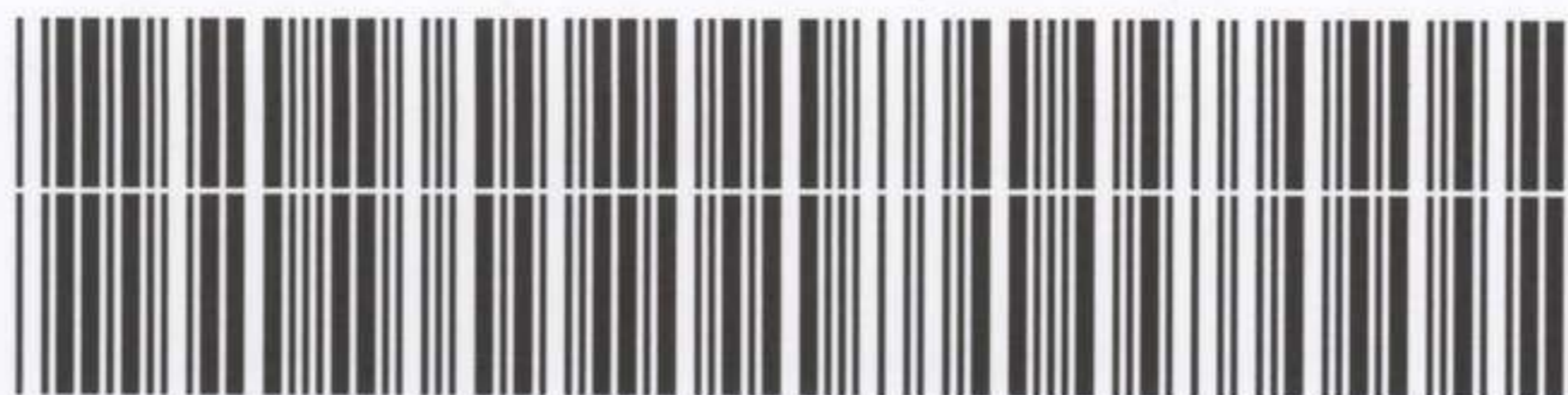

Newland & Lt Col. DICK reported to Surg. Genl. Parker D.M.S. 2 nd Army. 7 pm. Lt Col. Newland issued a Valedictory Order to the Unit upon his relinquishing charge & on his transfer to 3 rd A.G. H.
