HANDING IN EXPLOSIVES AND S. A. A. TO RECQUIGNIES ON

8/3/19.

The 8th Field Coy. A.E. will deliver their explosive and S. A. A by their supply lorry at the Q.M. Store of 14th Field Coy. A.E. by 0930 on the 8th inst., accompanied by N.C.O. and inventory sheets.

The 1st A.T. Coy. A.E. will do likewise.

A lorry will collect the explosives and S. A. A. of the 8th and 14th Field Coy. A.E. and the 1st. Army Troop Coy. A.E. and then proceed to the 15th Aust. Inf. Brigade ammunition Dump and collect the explosive and S. A. A. belonging to the 15th Field Coy. A.E. and deliver same at Corps Ammunition Dump RECQUIGNIES.

Each Unit will send an experienced N.C.O. with 6 Inventory sheets to hand in the Stores and obtain receipts for same.

The 4 N.C.O.'s will carry 24 hours Rations in addition to their unexpired Day's Rations, and blankets. They will be billeted in SOIRE-LE-CHATEAU on the 8th/9th and return to their ~~Units~~ on the 9th inst.

DEMOBILISATION INSTRUCTION No. 6.

1. AMALGAMATION. On 8th inst. the 14th Field Coy A.E. will amalgamate with the 1st Army Troop Coy. A.E. moving from SIVRY TO RANCE. The O.C. 14th Field Coy. A.E. will mutually arrange with O.C. 55th Infantry Battalion and O.C. 1st Army Troop Coy. A.E. for Billets and stabling and complete move by midnight 8th/9th instant.

2. The Officer's and N.C.O.'s messes, Orderly Rooms and Q.M. Ration Stores will be combined but all records and returns will be made separately.

C&C. Units will mutually arrange for carrying out of any necessary work.

2. DEMOBILISATION OF EQUIPMENT. On 11st inst. the 14th Field Coy. A.E. will hand in all their equipment, with the exception of articles enumerated below, to D.A.D.O.S. at THULLIES. The following stores will be retained, Horse Rugs, head stalls, neck chains, feed bags and greasing material, explosives, S.A.A. Orderly Room stationary, waterproof sheets and enough Dixies to carry on with unless 1st Army Troop Coy. A.E. can supply same.

1st Army Troop Coy. A.E. will supply Motor Transport and harness to assist in handing in of Equipment. If the 14th Field Coy. A.E. is unable to secure sufficient Harness on loan for their Transport, it will have to use some of its own, and strip and pack same at THULLIES. In addition to the six copies of Mobilisation Stores a certificate will be rendered to D.A.D.O.S. that the harness has been disinfected.

An Officer and Q.M.S. will accompany stores to THULLIES.

3. RATIONS. On and after the 9th inst. the 14th Field Coy. A.E. and the 1st Army Troop Coy. A.E. will combine their Ration Indents, and draw from SIVRY Railway Station Dump. O.C. of the latter Unit will arrange immediately to notify S.S.O. of Corps Troops and 5th Australian Division. Statements will be forwarded to C.R.E. when amalgamation has been completed; also when stores have been handed in.

There was considerable difficulty in obtaining suitable billets for the men but the animals are well housed in the sawmill.

1. MOVEMENT ORDER. The 14th Fd/1st. Army Troops Coy. A.E. will move to PRY on 19th instant.

Two men will be left to guard the old enemy dump until further orders. Arrangement should be made to have them ~~be~~ rationed by the 55th Battalion. Clearance certificates will be obtained from all Billets occupied and any claims investigated and settled, or full particulars will be forwarded to Claims Officer 5th Aust. Division.

Two Motor Lorries will report at 1000h on 19th inst, to carry blankets kits etc.

The 8th/15th Field Coy. A. E. will make arrangements for the billeting of 3 Officers 130 Other Ranks and 39 horses.

2. AMALGAMATION. The 14th/Fd./1st Army Troops Coy. A. E. will amalgamate ~~with~~ with the 8th/15th Field Coy. A. E. on 19th inst.. The Officers and N. CO. messes, Orderly ~~boom~~ and Q. M. Ration Stores will combine as far as accommodation will allow.

3. HANDING IN OF STORES The 8th Field Coy. A. E. will hand in all its equipment, and stores according to Mobilisation Tables to D. A. D. O. S. at THUILLIES on 23rd MARCH 1919 with the exception of Horse Rugs, neckchains headstalls and grooming material. The Field Companies will immediately improvise sufficient cooking Utensils to carry on with. It is expected that with the despatch of the next draft on demobilisation, the utensils of the 1st Army Troops Coy. A. E. will be sufficient to supply all requirements.

4. RETURNS ETC. All returns and records will still be submitted by Coys. Regimental Funds will be audited, and all books, receipts, cash etc. handed in to the Divisional Paymaster by 25th inst. All canteens but one should be wound up by the end of the month, and O. C.'s Units should arrange the financial basis on which one Canteen should be conducted in conjunction with the recreational Room.

5. A. S. C. WAGONS. The 15th Field Coy. A. E. will arrange to return taxis A. S. C. Wagon, horses and Driver to the A. S. C. on 23/3/19.

6 RELEASE OF CADRES. O's C. Units will release men from 'B' Cadres as their horses and equipment are reduced.

O's C; Coys. will arrange to retain one Farrier Sergt. and one Shoeing Smith to carry out the necessary supervision and shoeing of the horses for the four Coys.

The men with the least service will be selected other things being equal.

REPORT ON BRIDGE OVER RIVER HELPE IN THE RUE DE MONS,AVESNES.

252

This bridge is a temporary wooden structure. It has two crib piers which rest on the debris of the original bridge, a single span arch of brick. This debris forms a rough dam in the stream and the water runs rapidly over and through it. The cribs are built of longitudinal timbers about 16 feet and cross pieces about 6 feet long. The lowest timbers are about 9" x 9" in section and the remainder 6" x 6". In plan the longitudinal cover a width of five feet over all and there are three sets of cross pieces: See Sketch No. 1. These timbers are presumably all nailed together, and the cribs were originally filled with stone and earth. Of the four compartments of the two piers one is now empty and both piers are partially undermined. In Sketch No. 1 the shaded portion represents solid matter under the piers; outside of these areas the piers are unsupported. Sketch No. 2 is a longitudinal section. The dimensions are roughly correct. Presuming that the deck of the bridge was originally on one gradient, the southern pier has sunk about six inches and the northern one about a foot. The bearers are timbers, five in number, in Single Spans, and are about 10" x 10" in section. The deck is 4" thick. There is a footway about four feet wide. There is a rough handrail on either side screened with Hessian. Bearers and deck are in good order.

No notices are posted as to loads which may pass over the bridge. Several light lorries passed over it, some moving rapidly, while I was inspecting it and it carried them quite well, but the filling of the piers is being gradually dislodged and the foundations gradually washed away.

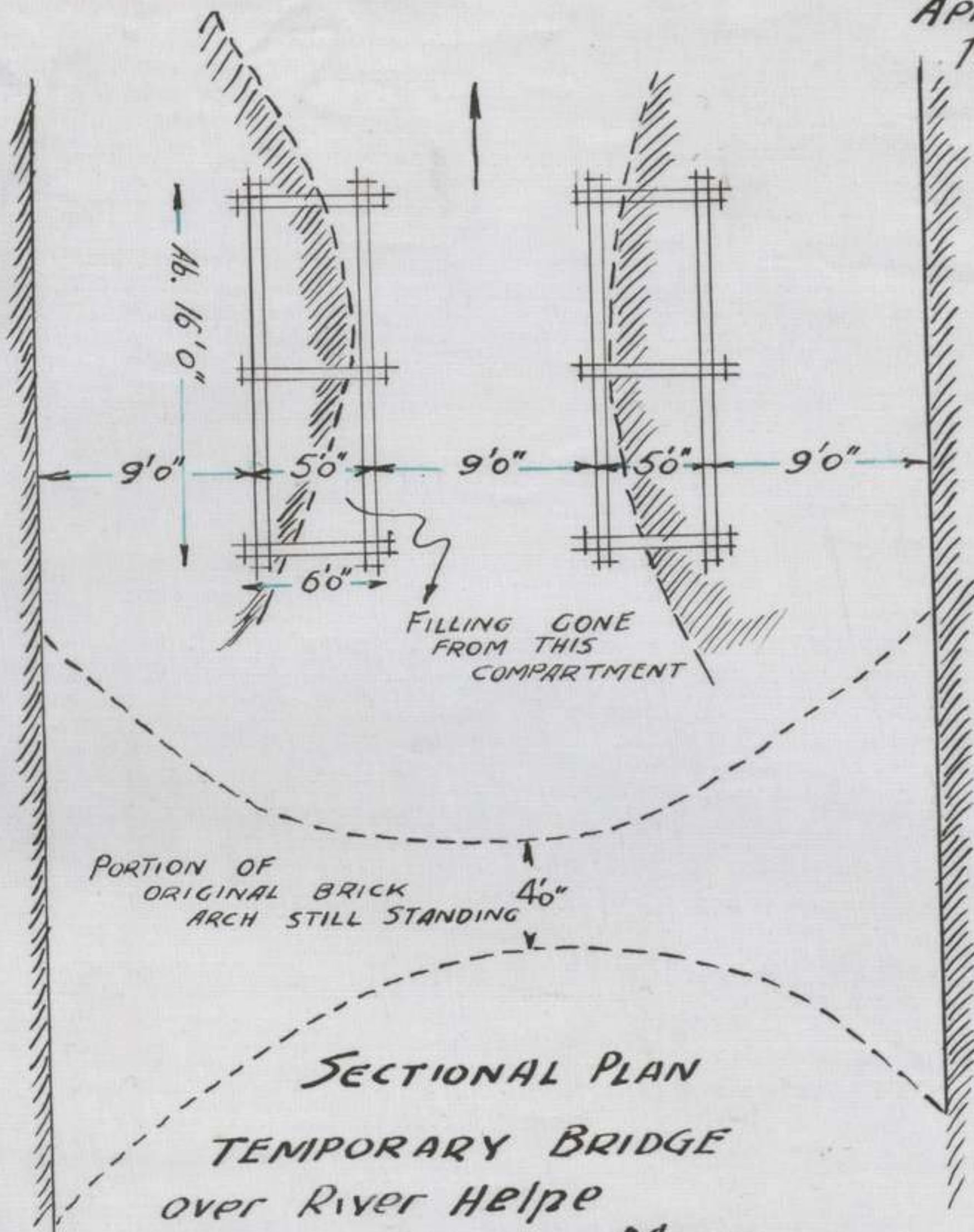

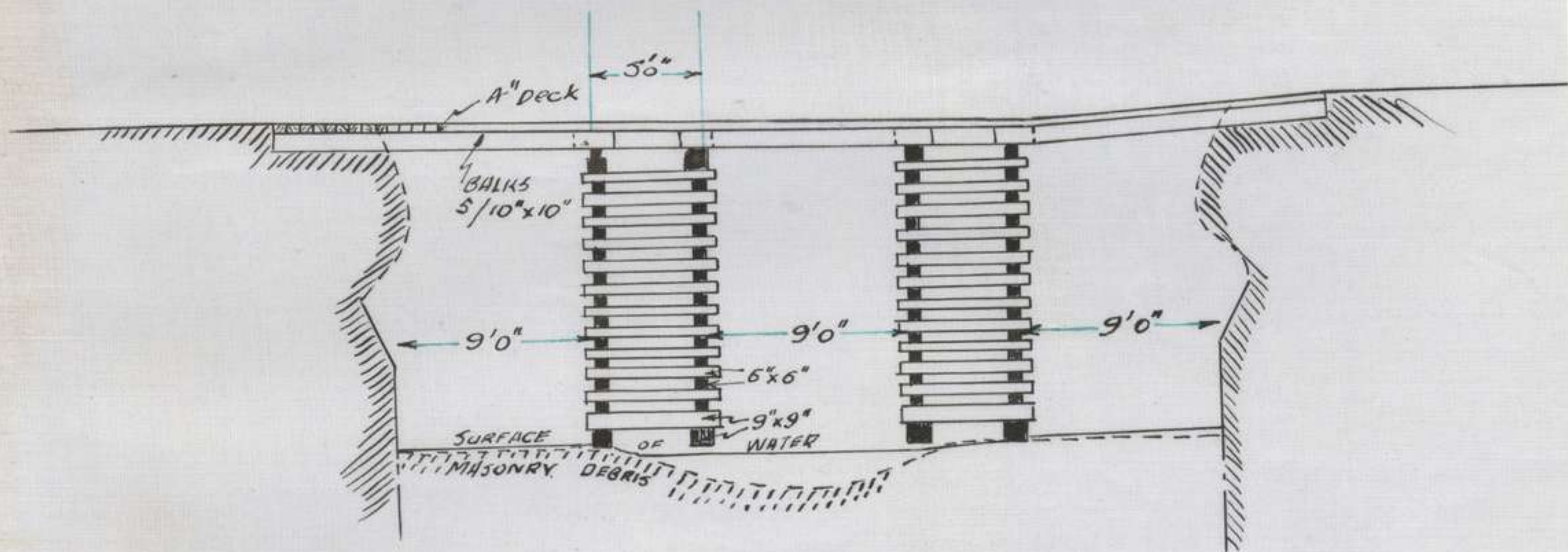
PORTION OF ORIGINAL BRICK ARCH STILL STANDING 4'0"

Appendix No. ¹⁰ 8A

1. AMALGAMATION. Now that the 8th, 14th, 15th and 1st Army Troop Coys A.E. are all quartered in PRY they will form one Company as from 21/3/19, to be known as the 5th Div. Field Coy. A.E.

The Company will consist of 4 Sections known as 8th, 14th, 15th and Army Troop Sections.

Lieut. J. D. CRAWFORD will assume command.

The following Officers will complete the establishment.

As demobilisation proceeds Lieut. C. A. HOPTON will replace Lieut. W. C. PATON, and will, on the complete demobilisation of the Sections, proceed with the other Section Officers to LONDON with the records. With the exception of the O. C. Company and the O's C. Sections, the remaining Officers will be available for demobilisation or Repatriation.

No. 21404 T/Q.M.S. DERHAM B. E. will be C. Q.M.S. and No. 1255 Warrant Officer F. S. BARNES 'MSM'; Coy. Sgt. Mjr.

2. RETURNS. Commencing on 22/3/19 all Rations and Ordnance supplies will be ordered for by the 5th Div. Field Coy. A.E. All returns will be furnished by it and all orders will be issued by it.

3. PRECEDENCE ROLLS. The Precedence Rolls will be consolidated into one roll excluding the personnel marked for the No. 26 QUOTA.

4. AUDIT BOARD. An Audit Board consisting of Lieut. L. R. HARDINGE? C. Q.M.S. SHARPE K. W. and T/C/Q.M.S. KING C. C. will audit the Accounts of the Canteens of the four ex Units, and arrange with the Section Commanders for all canteens to be wound up, and the funds and papers handed into the Divisional Paymaster by the end of the month.

5. CANTEENS. C. R. E. will arrange with the O. C. Divisional Canteen for the personnel of the 5th Div. Field Coy. A. E. to buy goods from the Div. Retail Canteen.

6. RECREATION. Lieut. E. G. LINDSAY assisted by a Committee of One N. C. O. and one Other Rank from each Section will arrange Sports, Competitions, games etc. and arrange with Section Commanders for Funds to provide QUOTAS with sporting materials and comforts.

7. EDUCATION. Classes will be recommenced in as many subjects as it is possible to find Instructors and Students for. All surplus Educational tools and gear will be delivered to O. C. JEUMONT Workshops by the end of the month and receipts obtained.

C. R. E. will arrange with the CORPS TECHNICAL EDUCATION OFFICER for tours to factories and Mines in the CHARLEROI area.

8. TERMINATION OF APPOINTMENTS. All personnel now acting as Temporary W. O's Q. M. S. with the exception of T/Q.M.S. DERHAM B. E. will revert to their permanent rank as from 21/3/19. All N. C. O's carrying E. R. RANK and who have ceased to conduct Educational Classes, will also revert to their permanent Ranks as from 21/3/19. No further appointments can be made in excess of the number specified for a Field Coy. A. E.
